DOULLEBSKA POLKA

A Czecho-Slovak Polka Mixer Record: Folk Danger MH-3016

Formation: Any number of couples, in a big circle.

Part 1-Plain polka around the circle, for 16 counts.

Part 2-Promenade, with man's right arm around lady's waist; lady's left hand on man's shoulder. Man extends his left hand ahead. to place it on the shoulder of the man ahead. (Move in towards center to close up mircle?.

As all march around, ing the tune with a La-la-lag etc. Singing is half the fun of this simple mixer.

Port 3 -- Men face center and clap own hands twice quickly, and then extend both hands to sides and elap neighbors hands, At the same time, all the women polka single file Clockwise around the ring. At the end of 16 measures, the men turn around and take the nearest woman to repeat the dance.

(With a large crowd, Michael and Mary Ann Herman suggest a number of smaller circles instead of one large one. Women may cheat and get into another circle, or extra women get in during the ladies' promenade, Extra men can get in during the march, doing it without a partner,)

POLLY WOLLY DOODLE

A Contra with a Singing call, as used by Don Armstrong Suggested record: F.1070

(Actives do not cross over; 1,3,5, etc. active.)

Actives swing in the center of the lines, swing them 'round and (: un'

Cross and swing the one below, swing them up and down, Active swing in the center of the lines, swing them high and wide, Actives down the center of the line. Ladies on the right hand side. Cross over - march back - cast off and below just one, Everybody go forward and back, the fun has just begun ... ***

PORTLAND FANCY

Circle Mixer -- Two couples in line facing two couples all around the room, like spokes of a wheel.

Circle eight around the track

(direle I 16 steps, then drop back into facing lines)

Right and left through across and back

Ladies chain across and back

Everyone go forward and back (Fwd 4 cts. back 4 cts.)

Forward again and pass on through

(Drop hands and pass right shoulders with opposite, to face a new line with which dance is repeated)

(Whole dance, when properly done, takes 64 counts each time through.) 举法法法法法法
