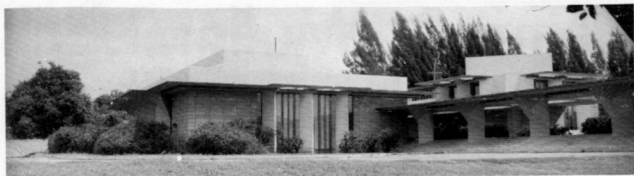

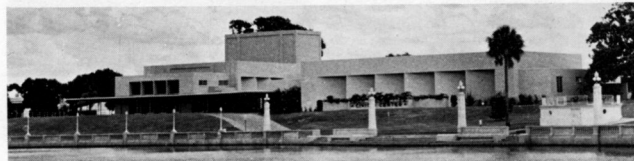

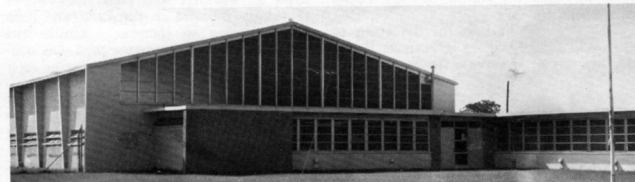

# Camp, McMullen, Jackson To Call for Florida Danc

THE MONTH of March fills out for square dancers with Ruy Camp of Atlanta, Gene McMullen of Houston, Jack Jackson of Columbus and Bob Page of San Leandro, California, providing foreign talent at various special occasions during the month.

Jim Pearson of St. Petersburg is to be featured caller at the Third Annual Fun 'n Sun Festival in Clearwater March 18, and George Campbell of Miami will serve as master of ceremonies for a CAP benefit dance near Fort Myers on March 29.

McMullen's schedule includes Bahia Beach on March 5 for a restricted audience, and a date in Winter Haven on the 12th.

Bob Page calls in North Miami for the Southeast Florida Association on March 25, for the Kriss Kross Squares in Fort Myers on March 31, and at the Ox Bow Hall in St. Petersburg March 31.

Jackson is to call in the Hialeah Auditorium March 17 for the Southeast Florida Association in his only Florida stop.

## Atlanta Caller Signed for Free Dance in Lakeland on March 19

MARCH 19 has been set aside as a red letter day in connection with the observance of the Diamond Jubilee of the City of Lakeland, with the dancing public invited to enjoy the calling of Ruy Camp of Atlanta.

The city will be host for the affair in the civic center, where a Harper Smith dance drew 44 squares a few weeks ago—

said to be the largest congregation of square dancers in Lakeland history.

Mel Clark, Lakeland caller, points out that a previous Harper Smith dance drew 21 squares, and that the number of square dancers in the Lakeland area is continuing to increase. Smith was gratified with the response and was considering a return engagement.

## Jacksonville Dancers and Callers Plan Demonstration During Fair

PLANS to put a demonstration of western style square dancing before tens of thousands of people in the Jacksonville area got the nod of callers' and dancers' groups in mid-February as Nathan Mallison, head of the department of recreation, for Jacksonville conferred with both groups.

Under consideration were proposals to tie a two- or three-day festival into the Gator Bowl or North Florida weekends, but dancers agreed participation in the Armed Forces Day Parade and a November 12 evening grandstand spectacle during the Fair would do a better job of introducing square dancing to the general public. In addition, a booth in the fair will provide an opportunity to distribute literature and information to interested

fairgoers.

A meeting of representatives of all Jacksonville clubs, including representatives of the local and state callers' associations, brought things to a head on Sunday, February 21. Randy King, vice president of the Skyline Club, chaired the meeting called for the purpose of considering a square dance festival.

Mallison said it was too much to hope the new coliseum would be ready for next fall, but expressed the feeling that the 20,000 square feet in the new structure would be adequate to handle any square dance needs, including the state convention.

Holding a festival on Gator Bowl or Georgia game weekends drew objection

that housing facilities would not take care of overnight visitors. The fair week, however, does not tax transient accommodations so greatly that a festival could not be combined with it.

However the group felt that a start toward recruiting at a local level could better be made with the grandstand show and parade. In future years, when the coliseum is completed, an institute may be added to the program.

## Fun 'n Sun is Set For Clearwater March 18

CLEARWATER'S Third Annual Fun 'n Sun Square Festival will include a square dance in the municipal auditorium Friday, March 18, with Jim Pearson as featured caller. The dance is sponsored by the Chamber of Commerce and will include a fashion show by Suzanne's of Clearwater Beach. Round dance demonstrations by Fran and Clare Malhiot's Carousels, and the group taught by Ed and Kay Mack are being programmed.

## March 26 Dance in Leesburg Set by Central Fla. Ass'n

SIX CENTRAL Florida callers will participate in the second annual Square Dance Institute of the Central Florida Square Dancers Association to be held in Sanford's civic center on Saturday, May 14.

George Everett of Maitland, program chairman, said Chuck Durant of Daytona Beach would serve as master of ceremonies for the entire program, and would assist Joe Johnson of Windermere with instruction of round dances.

Eric Sohn of Winter Haven has been invited to assist Bob Stone of Melbourne Bob Rust of Daytona Beach, and Joe Curtis of Orlando in the instructional sessions as well as for the calling of the evening dance.

Plans for the institute were approved by directors at a meeting in Orlando February 21. It is also planned to have a fall workshop if a time and place can be arranged. The Sanford event climaxes the association's year of activity and officers for the new year will be selected to succeed Dur Cunningham of Melbourne and his staff.

The association agreed to hold a dance in Leesburg's armory on March 26 with Joe Curtis of Orlando calling. The dance is free to members of the association. Memberships for 1960-61 will be offered at the Leesburg dance with full privileges to June of 1961. This includes admission to the Leesburg dance and eligibility for the Sanford Institute.

# It's All Over Now

IT'S ALL Over Now by Lee Helsel of Sacramento is BOW & SWING's Square of the Month for March, according to the Florida Callers' Association's square dance coordinator, Gordon Blaum of Miami.

The dance is available on SIO X1112A with Lee doing the calling, and also as an instrumental number on X2117B.

Here is the pattern:

Intro-Break:

Partner bow swing your corner 'round and 'round Circle left, go 'round that ring  
Allemande left alamo style balance you know  
Do-sa-do your partner back to back you go  
Gents star by the left go once around the ring  
Pass this girl and swing the next and then  
Corner allemande go right and left grand  
Go walkin' round the ring then promenade the land

\*I used to love you but I don't anymore

Figure:

It's all over now.

Heads go up come on back half square thru  
Heads across the track  
Right and left thru the outside two and then  
Dive thru pass thru square thru once again  
Four hands 'round your facin' out go out and back again  
Frontier whirl face back in go right and left thru  
Turn on back and do a Dixie chain  
Girls turn back and swing, swing that girl and then

Allemande new corner promenade again

\*I used to love you 'but I don't anymore

It's all over now.

Sequence: Intro, Figure heads twice; Break, Figure sides twice

\* Additional patter—

You wanted me to stay but now I'm goin' away  
She's cute as a little filly, but now she's gettin' chilly  
She's plenty good at dancin' but weak on romancin'

More calls from the prolific typewriter of Blaum himself, include the following:

## ISLAMORADA

All four ladies chain across the way  
Then the side couples half sashay  
Heads go forward and box the gnat, face the

middle

Half square thru, separate go around one  
Pass thru split the outside go around one more  
Go down the middle and cross trail thru around one line up four  
Forward eight and back by heck  
Pass thru then shuffle the deck, "U" turn back  
Double pass thru, girls turn back  
Allemande left, etc. . . .

## DIXIE HIGHWAY

First and third bow and swing  
Side ladies chain across the ring  
Head ladies chain three-quarters around  
Turn that girl then half sashay line up three  
Head gents pass thru both turn right around one four in line  
Forward eight and back with you, ends bend in  
Square thru three-quarters around  
Separate around one four in line  
Forward eight then back with you  
Pass thru, Face the middle, Dixie chain  
On to the next and Dixie chain  
Now two ladies chain to this man  
All four ladies chain across to a  
Left Allemande

## LOOKOUT CORNER

First and third bow and swing  
Side ladies chain across the ring  
Heads lead to the right and circle four  
Head gents break make lines of four  
Forward eight and back with you  
Pass thru and shuffle the deck  
Face your partner and box the gnat  
Pull 'em' thru, then shuffle the deck "U" turn back

Ladies square thru three-quarters of the land  
Men divide, and pass one man  
Allemande left with your left hand

## SHOES TOO SMALL

First and third go forward up an back with you  
Pass thru, gents turn back and follow that girl  
Both turn right around one into the middle  
Dixie chain, both turn right thru the sides  
Around one stand four in line  
Forward eight and back with you  
Pass thru, then lines divide, Dixie chain  
Line up four with those you meet  
Forward eight and back with you  
Pass thru, lines divide, then Dixie chain  
"U" turn back, two ladies chain to a  
Left Allemande . . .

## SHOES FIT

Heads pass thru both turn right around one  
Dixie chain, lady go left, gent right around one  
Down the middle and pass thru  
Gents turn back and follow that girl  
Both turn left around one, Dixie chain in the middle  
Lady left, gent right around one four in line  
Center arch ends duck out around one  
Down the middle and pass thru, gents turn back and follow that girl  
Both turn right go around two hook on the end  
Forward eight and back with you  
Pass thru then shuffle the deck, face the middle  
Two ladies chain, turn them around  
Dixie chain, lady go left, gent right  
Allemande left, etc. . . .

And Sets-In-Order for February runs a break by Ed Pagelson of Panama City which goes like this:

## BREAK

Promenade that pretty little girl  
Get back home and swing a whirl  
All four couples California twirl  
Heads divide and don't you blunder  
Sides arch and the heads dive under  
Box the gnat across the way  
Then star by the left, go all the way  
Side couples you half sashay  
All turn back, left allemande, etc.

Here's another contribution from Tex Cole, veteran caller from Lake Worth:

## WHEELIN' CRAZY

Promenade and don't slow down, Number one wheel around  
You pass on thru, Three couples you do  
Head couples you wheel around, Number three pass thru three couples you found  
And two and three wheel around, And number two pass thru three couples you found  
Side two couples wheel around, Number four pass thru three couples you found  
Number four California whirl, And all promenade go round the world  
Head two couples wheel around, Pass thru two couples you found  
All four couples wheel around, Right and left thru the couples you found  
Turn your girl and cross-trail back, Allemande left your corner Jack . . .

THE WALTZ, Nancy, is Round of the Month for March, and behind this selection, says Coordinator Gene Baylis of Miami, is the fact Nancy constitutes a simple introduction of canter rhythm in waltzing, still keeping a simple enough routine for consideration of waltzers who have square dancing on their mind.

Nancy (S10 3109A) was presented at the 1959 Hacienda Holiday and was written by Louise and Norman Pewsey of Alta dena, California. Footwork is opposite and starting position is facing, man's back to the center of the hall, man's right and lady's left hands joined: Measures.

1-4 Step, Swing, —; Step, —, Close (W Rev Twirl); Step, Swing, —; Step, —, Close (W Twirl); Step L, swing R across L (ct 1,2, hold); step R (ct 1, hold); close L to R (ct 3); step R, swing L across R (ct 1,2, hold); step L (ct 1, hold); close R to L (ct 3); (canter rhythm) W steps R, swing L across R (ct 1,2, hold); makes L face twirl by stepping L in RLOD (ct 1), ct 2 is a hold with W on L foot pivoting LF one full turn and closing R on ct 3, step L in RLOD, swing R across L; making RF twirl by turning and stepping R in LOD (ct 1) ct 2 hold, W on R foot pivoting RF one full turn on ct 3 and closing L to R ending in open pos facing LOD;

5-8 Waltz fwd, 2, Close; Waltz fwd, 2, Close; Step, Swing, —; Face, Touch, —; Step fwd L, step fwd R, close L to R; step fwd R, step fwd L, close L to R; step to side on L, swing R in front of L, hold; turning to face partner step to side on R, touch L beside R, hold;

9-16 Repeat Meas 1-8, end facing partner in Butterfly pos, M's back to COH.

17-20 Waltz Bal L, 2, 3; Waltz Bal R, 2, 3; Solo Step, 2, Close; On, 2, Close; Step side L, behind on R, step L in place; step side R, behind on L, step R in place; starting on M's L (M turns L, W turns R) turning and progressing in LOD, do step, step, close; ending facing RLOD; starting on M's R keep turning in LOD and progressing, do step, step, close; ending facing partner in Butterfly pos, M's back to COH;

21-24 Repeat meas 17-20, ending in Closed pos, M's back to COH;

25-28 Bal bwd; Maneuv, 2, 3; Waltz; Waltz; Bal back on L, touch R beside L, hold 1 ct; starting fwd on R maneuv in three steps (waltz meas) to end with M's back to LOD; starting bwd on L do two R face turning waltzes making 3/4 CW turn to end with M's back to COH in closed pos;

29-32 Repeat Meas 25-28 end facing your partner with M's R and W's L hands joined to repeat dance.

Dance goes thru 3 times ending with twirl and bow.

Reports during the past month show that our selections have followed quite closely those of other areas, with the following going strong at roundancer level: Foolish Fancy, Mountain Grenevy, Twilight, Summer Breeze, Siesta in Seville, Neapolitan. At square dancer level there are Champagne, Tammy, Steppin' Out, Del Rio, Bye Bye Blues, Star Waltz, Left Footer's One Step, Dancing in the Streets, Lucky Polka.

We predict I'll See You Again, recent Windsor release, and Nancy, will add themselves to the above list.

Jo Keller's demonstration at Holiday for Rounds, Cake Walk in Portugal, has been released by Windsor with music by the George Poole orchestra.

And Grenn, Inc., has released Who, by Myrtle and Harold Eicher of Sarasota.

Ed and Kay Mack report that Cake Walk is being taught in their groups in the Suncoast and in Central Florida.

Proposed as a subject for a workshop at the next square dance convention is "What is the most effective technique for teaching rounds to square dancers?" If you're interested drop a card to Carl Heath, convention chairman, at Box 19, Winter Haven.

For those who are interested in contras, look at Don Armstrong's contribution in Sets In Order for February: "Port Richey Reel." This dance uses a double progression so when the dancers reach either end of the set they cross over at the end of that dance sequence, makes a faster dance.

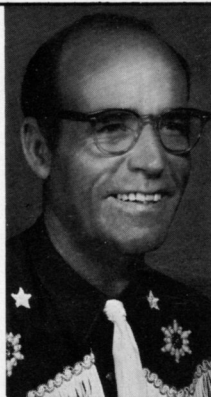
