

Florida Callers, 2 Visitors to Call Convention June 24, 25

PLANS FOR Florida's biggest and best state square dance convention are virtually complete with evening dances featuring Florida's excellent callers and with after dances featuring hot hash by Gene McMullen of Houston and Bub Ables of Omaha.

Clearwater's Municipal Auditorium, famous Roebling hall, and facilities of the headquarters hotel, the Fort Harrison, will be linked together to provide facilities to accommodate 139 squares—an even larger crowd than last year's record turnout at Miami Beach.

Trail dances at Roebling and the Ox-Bow in St. Petersburg have been announced for Thursday evening June 23, with possibly others seeking to make the June 24-26 weekend longer and more enjoyable.

Registration tables will be open from 2 to 5 p.m. on Thursday in the Fort Harrison Sun Lounge, will be open Friday and Saturday from 9 a.m. until 5 p.m.

Impromptu dancing in the hotel's

Crystal Ballroom begins at 9:30 a.m., with workshop sessions for square dancers getting under way at 1 o'clock with McMullen and Ables in the auditorium, by remote to both Roebling Hall and

the Ballroom. This will be followed by square dance round workshop, in the auditorium, advanced two-steps in Roebling, and advanced waltzes in the Ball-

Square Dance Roundup for April and May:

Sanford, Jacksonville, Ruskin And Miami Beach are Featured

SANFORD, Jacksonville, Miami Beach and Ruskin will be in the square dance limelight during April and May.

The Central Florida Square Dancers Association will hold its second annual square dance institute in Sanford's Civic Center Saturday, May 14. The Northeast Florida Square Dancers plan their annual Spring Roundup in Jacksonville's Mayflower hotel on April 30, Jim Brower will headline the second annual

Square Dance Weekend at the Sea Isle Hotel in Miami Beach on May 20-22, and Ruskin's Bahia Beach will stage a three-day institute May 28-30.

In addition, Brower is booked for May 21, and Johnny Bias for April 26, at the Ox-Bow in St. Petersburg.

On April 23, Roger Chapman calls an open dance in Winter Haven and Don Armstrong conducts the Central Florida Whing-Ding at Ocala.

On Sunday, May 1, Max Forsyth of Indianapolis and Jim Pearson will conduct workshop sessions in the afternoon, followed by supper and an evening dance, at the Ox-Bow in St. Petersburg.

Max Forsyth will call at Sanders Beach May 2 under sponsorship of the Pensacola Square Dance Council.

Solid Week of Dancing is Set for Pensacola in June

A SOLID WEEK of festival style square dancing is in store for those attending Pensacola's 9th annual square and round dance festival, June 20-25. Dances Monday through Thursday evenings will be free at Sanders Beach Pavilion with local callers plus visitors, featuring a different host club each night and including coffee and doughnuts.

Friday and Saturday workshops will be at the air conditioned City Auditorium with Pancho Baird, Don and

Marie Armstrong of New Port Richey, Chuck Goodman, the Fiesta Ramblers, followed by after parties at Sanders Beach. A charge of \$3.50 per person includes parking and all Friday and Saturday events.

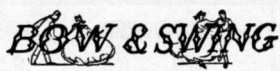

Bow & Swing's Round of the Month for May:

Happy Waltz

HAPPY WALTZ is the Round of the Month for May, as selected by Gene Baylis of Miami, coordinator for the Florida Callers Association and president of the Round Dance Council of Florida.

Happy Waltz was written by Jerry and Charlie Tuffield of Denver and is available on Lloyd Shaw 214-45 with music by the Fred Bergin orchestra.

Position is open, facing line of dance and footwork is opposite throughout:

INTRODUCTION: Eight Measures

Meas. 1-4 Wait two measures; Balance away;

Balance together;

Wait first two meas; In open position, step to side away from partner; Step together, ending in butterfly position (M facing wall);

5-6 Waltz balance left; Waltz balance right;

M steps to the side in LOD on L, step R behind L, step in place on L, repeat waltz to the R;

7-8 Twirl Step Touch;

M take three steps in place while W twirls R face under her S and M's L hands; step R touch L ending in open position;

Dance:

Measures 1-4 Waltz back-to-back; Waltz face-to-face; Step, Swing, Face, Touch, —; Waltz face-to-back; Waltz Fwd, turning slightly back-to-back; Waltz Fwd, turning face-to-face; step on L, swing right fwd LOD, hold; face partner, step to side on R in RLOD and touch L, hold;

5-8 Waltz Back-to-Back; Waltz Face-to-Face; Step, Swing, —; Step, Touch, —;

Repeat Meas 1 and 2; on meas. 7, step on L, swing R fwd, turning to back-to-back position; on meas. 8, step on R, touch L (M facing COH, W facing the wall), join both hands;

9-12 Waltz balance Left; Waltz balance Right; Step, Face, —; Face, Touch, —; Waltz balance L—M stepping to side on RLOD on L, step R behind L, step in place on L, repeat waltz balance to R; Step L in place, swing R around in a flare to face partner; step R, touch L;

13-16 Dip; Maneuver Waltz; Waltz; Waltz;

Dip fwd on M's L and hold 2 counts; do one waltz maneuvering to end with M's back to LOD; do two waltzes, making a three-quarter

turn to end facing partner, M's back to COH; 17-20 End, Behind, Side; Front, Side, Behind; Twirl, —, —; Step, Touch, —; Six-step grapevine, starting on M's L in LOD; W twirls R face under her R and M's L hands, while M walks fwd 3 steps in LOD; face partner step R, touch L;

21-24 Side, Behind, Side; Front, side, Behind; Twirl, —, —; Step, Touch, —; Repeat meas. 17-19. On meas. 24 step R, touch L, facing LOD in open position;

Waltz; Step on L, swing R; while W turns one full free turn L, M walks 3 steps, turning one-half R-face turn to end with back to LOD; two turning waltzes, starting with M stepping back 25-28 Step, Swing, —; W Twirls, —, —; Waltz; Waltz; Step on L, swing R; while W turns one full free turn L, M walks 3 steps, turning one-half R-face to end with back to LOD; two turning waltzes, starting with M stepping back into LOD, ending in open position.

Waltz; Step on L, swing R; while W turns one full free turn L, M walks 3 steps, turning one-half R-face to end with back to LOD; two turning waltzes, starting with M stepping back 25-28 Step, Swing, —; W Twirls; Waltz; Waltz; Repeat meas. 25-28.

ENDING: On third time through, in meas. 32, W twirls R face under her R and M's L hands, bow to partners.

Rounds introduced at the Sunday Round Dance Club in Tampa on April 3 include Three Penny Waltz (Black Mountain RL 1017A), taught by Paul and Delight Trent, Sigma Chi Waltz (Grenn 14006), taught by Bill and Margaret Tuszynski, Summer Breeze, taught by Clare Malhot, and When My Baby Smiles at Me (MacGregor 8555A) taught by Martin and Vera Lansen. Earle Heinrichs announced that the Tampa group would suspend until after the Knothead convention due to lack of air conditioned space available.

The Malhoits will continue their second and fourth Sunday round dance group at the Ox-Bow in St. Petersburg "at least through May."

Bow & Swing's Square of the Month for May:

Look on the Good Side

Johnny Schultz of Phoenix has written a call entitled Look on the Good Side (Old Timer S-8148) which has been selected by Gordon Blaum, coordinator for Florida Callers Association. This is a flip record with Schultz' call on the back, and is recorded on the instrumental side in the Key of F at a tempo of 134. Here it is:

Intro, Break & Ending.

Your corners do-as-doe

Now swing with your partner

You promenade now with that man

The four little ladies backtrack

Now don't you ask me why

Same little girl you box the gnat

Then pull her right on by

Let's do a left allemande

An a grand right and left

Now meet your little honey, swing a few

And if you promenade, and look on the good side

He'll stop at home and swing you

Dance Pattern

Head couples forward and back

Now do a right and left thru

Now you pass thru, around just one you do

Come in the middle and box the gnat

Into a right hand star

Now look out now you reverse back

Your corners not too far

You turn your corners right

Your partner left hand swing

Now take your corner lady, promenade

You're going to take her home and

Swing on the good side

And out out watchin' for the bad

Repeat Dance for Heads—Break—Repeat Dance for Sides—Repeat Dance for Sides—Ending.

Teacup Promenade is the name of a figure Howard Parrish introduced to the Sandspurs Square Dance club in Auburndale recently. He picked it up from a friend who attended the 5th Atlantic Square Dance Convention in Toronto last October. Here it is:

Tom Heron, Falls Church, Virginia

Walk all around your left hand lady

See Saw round your pretty little saw

Run back to the corner, Allemande left

And Allemande thar, Back em up men

In a right hand star—

Shoot that star to the next pretty girl

And Do Sa Do on heel and toe

Now catch her by the left, Do Paso

Her by the left, new party line

Her by the left, all the way round

And the men star right,

Three quarters round and there's your corner

Allemande left with the 'ol left hand

Here we go right and left grand—

Meet your maid and promenade—

Keep on going and don't slow down, while

One and three wheel around, and

Square thru Three Quarters and out again

On to the next and square the route,

Once and a quarter with the little finger out

On to the next, we'll square a bit more

Once and a quarter in the middle of the floor,

On to the next and square thru three quarters

Three quarters round and out again,

O's to the next a right and left thru—

There's your corner—Allemande left etc.

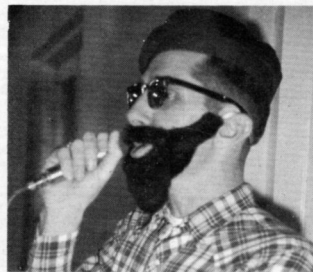

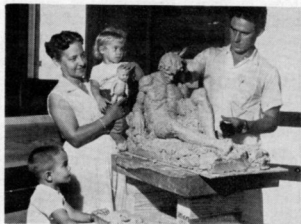

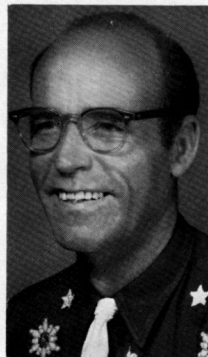
