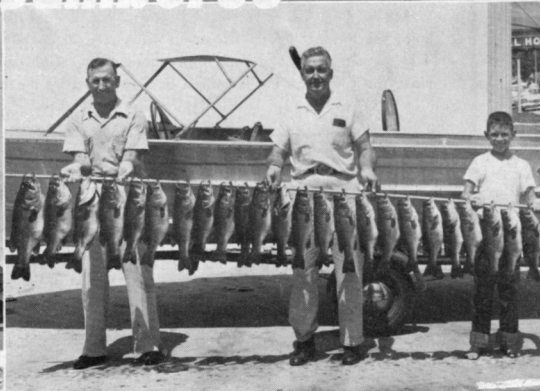

## Comprehensive Fall Program Starts in Tampa

THE FALL and winter program of square dancing sponsored by the Tampa Recreation Department will feature many varied activities for dances in the Tampa area throughout the coming months.

The Inter Club Council of Square Club was recently reactivated for the purpose of coordinating the square dance program in Tampa and will be composed of representatives from each of the organized square dance clubs. The council will meet the second Thursday of each month at the North Boulevard Center at 8:00 p.m.

First activity of the council was the sponsorship of an Inter Club Party, October 5, at the North Boulevard Recreation Center, featuring Sam Prescott, caller, from Winter Haven.

Classes for beginners are underway and plans for additional advanced classes have been made. A beginners class is in session at the Hunt Community Center in Tampa on Wednesday nights with Cliff Reazak as instructor, and a new beginners class began October 12 at the North Boulevard Center, 214 North Boulevard, with Harold Whitaker. An advanced class started October 3, at the Interbay Center with Cliff Reazak.

Social dances with national callers will be held throughout the year with Ed Gilmore, Marvin Shilling and Bib Graham. The Recreation department will sponsor Gilmore, November 3, at the Hunt Center. The Country Cuzzins square dance club will sponsor Shilling on January 12 at Hunt Center and the Tampa Square Dance Club will sponsor Graham on March 17 at the North Boulevard Center.

Don Armstrong will appear at Hunt Center for Saturday night dances on November 12 and December 10.

Regular Saturday night dances will continue at Hunt Center with Cliff Reazak calling for area dancers. Dances begin at 8:00 and continue until 11:00 p.m.

# Gilmore Clinic to be Held at Daytona Beach

MEMBERS OF the Florida Callers Association look forward to the Ed Gilmore Callers Clinic to be held in conjunction with their annual meeting Nov. 4-6 at Daytona Beach. Headquarters will be the Daytona Plaza Hotel.

Opening session begins at 2 o'clock Friday afternoon, with sessions Friday evening, Saturday morning and afternoon, followed by a dance to be called by Gilmore. The fall business meeting will be held Sunday morning and a final clinic session Sunday afternoon.

"This is a dream-type opportunity," says FCA President Bart Bartley of Gainesville. "We are surprised and very pleased at the response, with many members indicating they will be present for all sessions."

Attendance at the Callers Clinic is limited to members of the association and their dancing partners, and as Bow & Swing went to press it appeared that registrations would tax the capacity of the hotel.

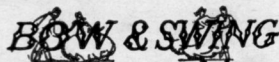

## Progressive Squares

PROGRESSIVE squares can be done where the sets are lined up across the hall and down the hall, with dancers progressing through to an adjoining square and so forth. Dancers must remember that when they find themselves facing out and do not meet another couple they must do a California Twirl and wait until a couple comes to meet them.

Gordon Blaum of Coral Gables, Bow & SWING'S Square Dance Coordinator, had his first experience with progressive squares while dancing to the calling of Ralph Page in Boston about ten years ago. Ed Gilmore has done a fine job with progressive squares in recent months and has written the following patter and singing call, which Blaum calls to "Old Fashioned Girl":

### THE FOURSOME

One and three lead to the right, circle four and form a line

Forward eight and back with you, forward again and pass through

Move straight ahead go right and left through, turn your girl, face those two

Forward up and back with you, forward again and pass through

Move straight ahead and cross trail through, find your corner, left allemande.

Another progressive is the singing call, Kansas City, in which some ladies visit three different sets. Music is the Balance record of Kansas City, and the original introduction is used. Here is the figure:

### PROGRESSIVE KANSAS CITY

Head to the right, you circle to a line

Go forward eight and back with you

Pass through move on, go right and left on through

Chain those girls and face the same two

Pass through move on, you cross trail through

Allemande your corner and come home

You promenade to Kansas City cause it's your home town.

(Repeat for sides, repeat intro. repeat for heads then sides, repeat intro.)

Blaum suggests that "every good square dance program should have a mixer," and adds that a progressive square can be very well substituted for a circle mixer.

Dream Doll, a record recently announced by Best (103A) provides excellent rhythm and has a nice figure for the practice of basics. She'll Swing No One But You (102A) has excellent rhythm and is in a key which seems to be good for most callers. The dance seems to flow smoothly along. Both are flip instrumentals with calls by John Garrett.

A hoedown record (104) backs up New Mexico Hoedown with Aggie Ramble. Hoedown is fast moving with a good strong beat. Helen Everett of Maitland thinks Aggie's rhythm is a little different but the piece has good timing. The Aggie Ramblers provide the instrumental for these releases from Mesilia Park, N.M.

## Dream Walk

ROUND OF THE MONTH for November is Dream Walk, written by Mary and Bill Lynn of Brentwood, Mo., who will be in Miami Beach Nov. 13-19 on the staff of Les Gotcher's Crown Hotel Institute. The dance is done to Grenn 14011. Did You Ever See a Dream Walking, starting out in loose closed position, man's back to center of hall. Footwork is opposite, directions are for the man:

### INTRODUCTION

**Meas.**  
1-4 Walk; Wait; Bal Two-Step L, Bal Two-Step R; Walk Fwd, 2, 3, 4 (W Solo Roll, 2, Walk Fwd, 2); Wait 2 meas (8 counts); on L do a two-step bal to the side twd LOD, starting R do a two-step bal to the side twd RLOD; as the M walks fwd LOD 4 steps L, R, L, R the W completes a solo R-face roll stepping R, L progressing down LOD, continues moving fwd LOD stepping R, L to assume Semi-Closed pos, both facing LOD.

### PATTERN

1-4 Walk Fwd, 2, 3, Face/Closer; Step Out, Close, Bwd/Sidecar, Closer; Turn/Banjo, Close, Bwd, Close; Walk Fwd, 2, 3, 4, (W Solo Roll, 2, Walk Fwd, 2); Take four walking steps fwd LOD L, R, L, R to end facing ptr Loose Closed pos; Step fwd twd wall on L (W step fwd R), step on R beside L, step fwd on L turning 1/4 R-face (W step fwd R) to end in Sidecar pos M facing RLOD, step on R beside L; Moving twd RLOD make a 1/2 L-face turn stepping on L (a reaching step), step on R beside L to complete turn to Banjo pos M facing LOD, step fwd on L twd RLOD (a reaching step), step on R beside L; Repeat Measure 4 of Introduction to assume Semi-Closed pos both facing LOD.

On meas. 4 M assists ptr to start her roll by pushing slightly with his L against her R hand).  
5-8 Walk Fwd, 2, 3, Face/Closer; Step Out, Close, Bwd/Sidecar, Closer; Turn/Banjo, Close, Bwd, Close; Walk Fwd, 2, 3, 4 (W Solo Roll, 2, Walk Fwd, 2); Repeat Meas. 1-4 to end in Semi-Closed pos both facing LOD.  
9-10 Walk Fwd, 2, Turn in, Point; Turn Away, 2, 3, Face/Touch; Walk fwd LOD stepping L, R, L, turning in to face RLOD and point R twd RLOD; Release hand hold turning away R-face (W L-face) from ptr stepping R, L, R to assume a Facing pos with both hands joined and held slightly apart, touch L to R ending M's back to COH.

11-14 Together, Close, Apart, Close; Sidecar Around 1/2, 2, 3, Face/Together, Close, Apart, Close; Banjo Around 1/2, 2, 3, Face; Stepping together on L assuming Butterfly pos, step on R beside L, step apart on L, step on R beside L, turning slightly to Butterfly Sidecar pos; Move fwd and around ptr CCW stepping L, R, L, R to end facing M's back with wait; Repeat Meas. 11 moving together and maneuvering to Butterfly Banjo pos; Repeat Meas. 12 moving CW around ptr to end M's back to COH in Butterfly pos.  
15-16 Balance Two-Step L, Balance Two-Step R;

Walk Fwd, 2, 3, 4 (W Solo Roll, 2, Walk Fwd, 2); Repeat Meas. 3 & 4 of Introduction in Butterfly pos and end in Semi-Closed pos both facing LOD.

### Ending:

1-2 Bal. Two-Step L, Bal Two-Step R; Twirl, 2, Apart, Acknowledge; Repeat Meas. 3 of Intro in Loose Closed pos; Twirl W under joined lead hands (his L & her R) in two steps L, R, step slightly apart on L, change hands & point R ft, acknowledging ptr.  
Routine is done a total of four times.

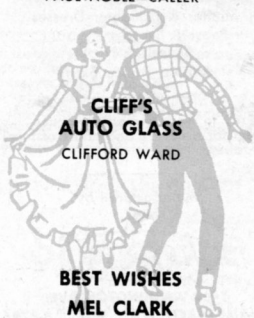
