Plans Firming Up for May Convention in Miami Beach

COMMITTEES FOR the seventh annual Florida Square Dance Convention, to be held in Miami Beach May 11-13, are preparing plans for the event which will be held in the Miami Beach Auditorium with the DiLido hotel as headquarters for the two cooperating groups, the Florida Callers Association and the Florida Federation of Square Dancers.

Prime responsibility for the convention rests with the Southeast Florida Square and Round Dancers Association of which Harry Moore of Surfside is president

"The callers have agreed to my suggestion of placing two or three dancers on the program committee for the state convention," Moore has told Harry Edwards, president of the federation. A state-wide meeting at Melbourne on March 19 will be held for the purpose of coordinating planning for the state convention as well as the 1962 national square dance convention.

Florida's part in the 1961 national at Detroit, at which publicity for the 1962 convention will be kicked off, will also come in for discussion.

Bert Bennett, president of the Southeast Florida Callers Association has agreed to develop the possibility of publication of a state square dance directory in connection with the state convention program, similar to the procedure followed during the 1949 state convention.

On Feb. 9 Moore, as 1962 national convention chairman, met with the combined boards of the Hurricane Squares, the Seminoles and the Dixie Rebels. The Hurricanes will form the national registration committee, the Seminoles will serve as a housing committee, and the Dixie Rebels are to be in charge of bad-

ges. "Registration and housing will become active at Detroit and pick up momentum as the convention approaches," Moore says

"We are thinking it will be advisable to activate a special committee to coordnate all activities that will take place at Detroit." he continues. "And we are asking the registration committee to check out all sources of give-away souvenirs for distribution at the Florida booth in Detroit." Anyone knowing of possible giveaway material is urged to contact Bob Marcotte, 7500 S.W. 37th Street, Miami. On Feb. 12 President Moore met with Jay Fenimore of Hollywood, Florida Callers' representative and other callers and club officials to start planning for the 1961 state convention. Moore and Fenimore will serve as co-chairmen for the convention. Fenimore urged dancers to make early registration and reservations at the DiLido. "We are taking over the entire hotel for the weekend and since they have fine ballrooms and other conveniences it is most desirable to be right there where things are happening," Fenimore says.

Also in April are the fourth annual Savannah Square-Up (with Florida's Gene and Ima Baylis on the staff) at the DeSoto Hotel on the 15th, and the eighth annual Alabama Jubilee at the municipal auditorium in Birmingham on the 21st and 22nd.

Other visiting callers scheduled include Sam Prescott at the Hayloft in Miami March 4, Fred Christopher with the Melbourne Allemanders at the Civic Center on March 17, and Chuck Durant at Winter Park on March 31.



Tex Cole sends us Stack the Deck which he describes as a new basic (With dancers standing four in line, on the call Stack The Deck, the one on the right end of the line steps forward and to his left, the next in line stops behind him but a step backward, the third in line steps to his right and in between the first and second person, and the four in line steps back and to his right on the rear of the line. You then have them in a line, one behind the other, all facing the same way.) . . . Tex also sent along some routines using Cross the Dice, but we couldn't find a description of the figure . Gordon Blaum's Single Wheel gets
