

Two Complete Programs Are Set Up for Miami Beach

WITH TWO complete programs running simultaneously using the public auditoriums and facilities of the diLido hotel, the ninth annual Florida Square Dance Convention appears to have the boldest planning of any in Florida square dance history. Dates are Friday and Saturday, May 12 and 13.

A special feature of the 1961 convention will be a fashion show luncheon at noon Saturday in the Florentine dining room, where casual and beach wear as well as square dance fashions will be displayed.

The convention festivities begin on Thursday, May 11 with a Trail's End Dance in the grand ballroom of the diLido. During Friday and Saturday a virtually continuous program of workshops and dance sessions will be held in the Miami Beach Auditorium, the Tenth Street Auditorium, and the diLido ballroom.

After dances will be held in the diLido, as will Sunday business sessions of the Florida Callers Association and the Florida Federation of Square Dancers.

The headquarters hotel is located at Lincoln Road and the ocean, and is directly adjacent to Miami Beach's main shopping district. The Lincoln Road Mall is within three blocks of the hotel. The hotel itself offers two full size swimming pools, recreation areas with shuffleboard, pingpong, cabanas, and a big screen TV theatre room. Special low rates are designed to encourage dancers to bring their children for a memorable holiday.

Jim Parrish of the diLido says "the entire staff looks forward with good anticipation to this convention and we are geared to go all-out in providing a warm and hospitable atmosphere for everyone."

As BOW & SWING closed its forms, one fourth of the hotel's allotment of rooms has already been reserved and a capacity crowd was expected.

Throughout the convention organization, care has been taken to balance responsibility between dancer and caller groups, with the program committee under Jay Fenimore composed of four dancers (John Morgan, Frank Cornwall, Dick Rae, and Harry Moore) and four callers (Les Linn, Gordon Blaum, George Campbell and Gene Baylis).

Exhibitions were planned by Bert and Elizabeth Bennett and after-parties, skits and stunts were headed up by Bill

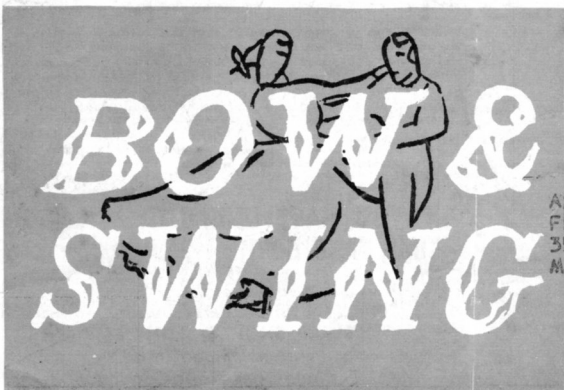
and Louise Roundtree, members of the Florida Callers Association.

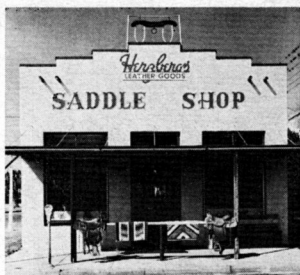

60 Squares for Lane At S.E. Fla. Dance

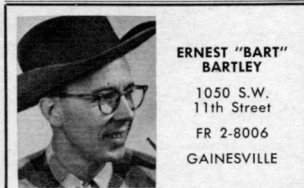

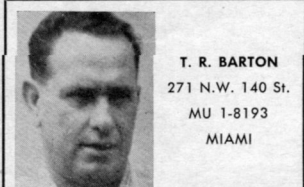

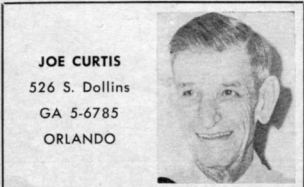

"Jim showed us the quickest and most graceful method of how to maneuver the end of the line turn in an Eight Chain Through," Tyler says. "One of the prettiest tricks he taught us concerned the call Heads Turn Back or Sides Turn Back: he gave the inactive couples a hint as to what to do with their time while the actives are turning back."

Tyler thinks the workshop will help new dancers avoid sloppy habits, and will also help the old hands by nudging them out of bad habits they have allowed to develop.

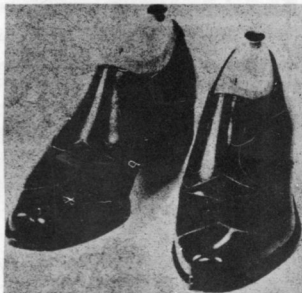

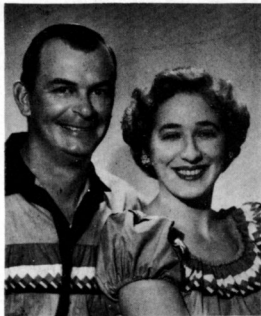
