

# FCA, FFSD Meetings Top List of October Activities

SEPTEMBER WENT out in a blaze of glory with fifth-Friday and fifth-Saturday activities all over the place. Annual meeting for the West Coast Dancers on Friday, Sept. 29 at Zephyrhills, and Election Dance and workshop for the Northeast Florida dancers on Saturday, Sept. 30 were prime events. At Delray Beach Bill Muench called at the Wagon Wheel and in Lake City a tri-city dance brought the month to a close. End of the month also marked the Atlantic convention in Atlantic City and start of the Swap Shop at Fontana. On Sunday, Oct. 1, a dry run for the Sunday Round Dance club at the Ox-Bow is planned.

Big events for October include annual meetings of the Florida Federation of Square Dancers in Lakeland on the 7th and of the Florida Callers Association in Sarasota on the 29th.

Centered around the Lakeland event was a trail's end dance at Auburndale with Paul Noble and Eric Sohn (Oct. 6).

a presidents' luncheon at Lakeland next day, and a joint dance featuring Jim Rice and Roger Chapman in the evening following the federation session.

And at Sarasota the weekend begins on Thursday Oct. 26 with a dance in the municipal auditorium sponsored by four local clubs with Max Forsyth of Indianapolis, followed by two days of Max Forsyth clinic for the callers at the Holiday Inn.

The Silver Springs weekend workshop Oct. 13-15 will feature Bill Muench and Harold Mainer on squares, and Ruth Jewell and Wray Ferrell on rounds, and on Oct. 21 Bob Dawson will call the Fall Frolics at Deerfield Beach. At Lake City Irv Elias calls in the Veterans Memorial Hall on Oct. 28.

Ray Castle calls in West Palm Beach Oct. 21. Muench is booked for arky calling at the 10th Street Auditorium in Miami Beach Oct. 1.

# October is Advance Registration Month in Florida!

istration (see page 5) and get your early-bird ribbon. "Pay now, go later," was the way it was put by Dr. Ernest Bartley of Gainesville.

"Reason for the underwriting certificates was to obtain funds to extend the invitation at Detroit since regulations did not permit actual registration for Miami Beach to start until after the Detroit convention was underway," explained Harry Moore, general convention chairman.

ceived a receipt in return. This receipt may be forwarded to him in lieu of cash with the full registration sheet.

These and other matters were discussed at a meeting of the budget and planning committees for the 11th National at Clearwater on Sept. 3. Reports were given by Harry Edwards, general vice chairman in charge of upstate committees, John Morgan, facilities vice chairman, Manny Jacobson, personnel vice chairman, Al Cody, program chairman, Clare Malhiot, round dance chairman, Lester Linn, and George Willis, general vice chairman in charge of operations.

"These enterprising gentlemen readily communicated their enthusiasm to the audience," Frank Cornwall states, "and we're happy to report that the 11th is off to a good start."

Cornwall, publicity chairman for the event, reported that a July 30 meeting of the executive committee named Jack Woody, superintendent of recreation for Miami Beach as chairman of the youth activities program. Program will include organized daily programs including cookouts, swimming, sightseeing and camera tours, teenage dances—all under direction of trained recreational personnel. Whether the lower age limit for participation included baby-sitting was not made clear at Clearwater, but clearly, "if you want the service, buy a registration for the person involved."

"Jack has done more for square dancing in this area than any other one person," Cornwall states. "Until Woody

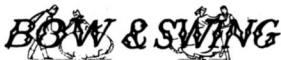

# Effort for National Dates Back to '35, Says Bartley

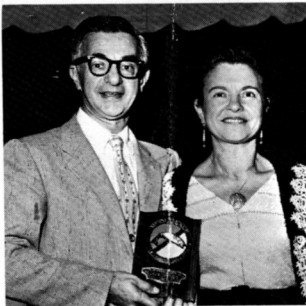

was made superintendent there was no sign of square dancing on the Beach." Air conditioned halls, live bands, good callers are part of the Woody recipe which now provides square and round dancing almost nightly somewhere on Miami Beach.

A fact sheet was presented to those present at the Sept. 3 meeting promising "many innovations" which will take advantage of Miami Beach's sub-tropical geography, and a general daily program providing continuous dancing from 10:00 a.m. until 11:30 p.m. in 12 halls (165,000 square feet) and 10 meeting rooms and exhibit booth area up to 18,000 square feet. Free parking for 3500 automobiles is promised and conventioners will be housed at bargain rates in nearby hotels (see map, page 13).

## Committee Reports Heard At Clearwater Meeting

AT CLEARWATER Bartley pointed out that the start toward bringing the National to Florida dates back to 1935. Willis urged a campaign for block registration by clubs. Cody outlined rates for the program and offered clubs a commission of

20% on advertising sold, commission to be paid in advertising space in the program.

Some discussion followed on the desirability of promotional dances designed to raise funds for the 11th National. Confusion existed between these dances and the so-called "trail" dances immediately preceding the convention. How such promotional dances would affect the regular program of the regional dancers' associations was a fuzzy area. Typical reaction was that of President Hink Smith of the West Coast Association, "Tell us what you expect of us and we'll do it!"

Moore was unable to release a complete list of committees, because chairmen for some up-state committees had not been found. As BOW & SWING went to press, vacancies existed in such committees as contras, folk dancing, trail dances.

Cornwall sent a release to all dancers and instructors stressing that "each of

you are part of the publicity committee," and urging that convention posters be displayed for the benefit of local dancers as well as touring visitors. "Make frequent announcements, reminding dancers that this is the world's greatest square dance event." Clubs are asked to avoid conflict with convention dates and to plan early and block registration of their members.

"See that stories get in your local newspapers, furnish material to radio and TV stations," Cornwall added, "establish a good liaison with media people by giving them news of your club activities."

## West Coast Ass'n Plans Faulkenberry Dance June 12

THE WEST COAST Square and Round Dance Association will sponsor a Jim Faulkenberry trail dance at the Clearwater auditorium on June 12, according to President Hink Smith of St. Petersburg. Faulkenberry will emcee the evening and Fran and Clare Malhiot will handle rounds.

In a letter to members it was announced that association memberships would henceforth be \$3.50 per couple, including subscription to Bow & Swing. The annual meeting was set for Sept. 29 at Zephyrhills (7:00 p.m. prior to the association dance in the municipal auditorium).

Development of a mailing list of all dancers in the area, whether members or not is planned, Smith said, and each club was requested to provide such a list at the Sept. 29 meeting. Hal Ham of Sarasota and Howard Parrish of Lakeland will call the dance and Paul and Delight Trent of Clearwater will handle the round.

The West Coast Association is also working on plans for a trail dance in conjunction with the 11th National on Tuesday, June 12 in the Clearwater auditorium.

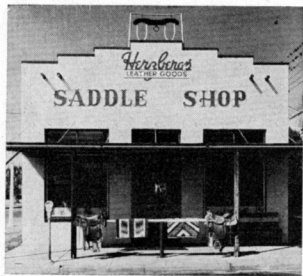
## Sarasota Clubs Sponsor Max For Dance on October 26

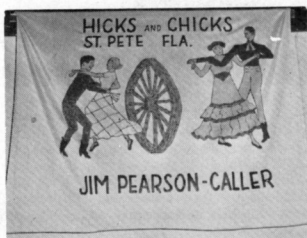

**CLARINET CAPERS**—flipside of last month's —is **BOW & SWING'S** Round of the Month for October. The peppy square dancers' round composed by Al and Mary Brundake of Westport, Conn., is started in varsovianna position, both facing line of dance and footwork is same for man and woman throughout the dance:

**1-5 Wait; Step, Touch; Stamp/Stamp, Stamp** —

In varsovianna pos, wait 2 meas; step fwd in LOD on L ft, touch R toe beside L ft; stamp lightly 3 times in place R, L; R, hold 1 ct; **DANCE**

**1-4 Heel, Toe; Fwd Two-Step; Heel, Toe; Fwd Two-Step (to RH star);**

Bending R knee slightly, place L heel to floor diag fwd and to L side, bring L ft across in front of R ft and touch L toe to floor in front of R ft, start L ft and do 1 two-step fwd in LOD; repeat, starting with R ft but during the two-step partners release L hands and W turns out R face fwd wall to end in a **RIGHT HAND STAR** pos.

**5-8 Two-Step Around; Two-Step Around; Two-Step Around; W Twirls (R face to Vars.);** In right hand star pos, start L and do 4 two-steps around in a CW circle, W twirling R face during fourth two-step under joined R hands to end with partners resuming **VARSOVIANNA** pos facing LOD.

**9-12 Heel, Toe; Fwd Two-Step; Heel, Toe; Fwd Two-Step (to LH star);** Repeat action of Meas 1-4 except to end in a **LEFT HAND STAR**, M facing diag to R of LOD and W facing diag to R of LOD.

**13-16 Two-Step Around; Two-Step Around; Two-Step Around; W Twirls (L face to Vars.);** In left hand star pos, start L and do 4 two-steps around in a CCW circle, W twirling L face during fourth two-step under joined L hands

to end with partners resuming **VARSOVIANNA** pos facing LOD.

**17-20 Fwd, 2; 3, Kick; Back, 2; Two-Step (turn 1/4 L);**

Start L ft and walk fwd in LOD 3 steps, kick R ft; start R ft and walk bwd twd LOD 2 steps; start R ft and do 1 two-step bwd twd LOD turning 1/4 L face to face COH.

**21-24 Repeat action of Meas 17-20, end facing LOD.**

**24-28 Repeat action of Meas 17-20, end facing WALL.**

**29-32 Repeat action of Meas 17-20, end facing LOD.**

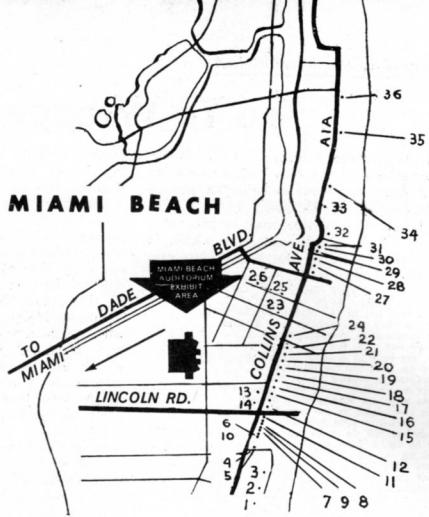
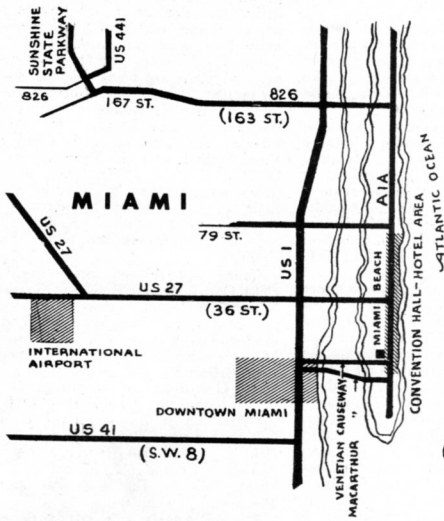

# Yo Yo Wrapper

PHIL WHITE found himself at San Diego in a meeting at the Navy Electronics lab when time came for selecting a square of the month for October. He left it in the hands of ye editor, and we present a figure which is not new, but which is liked (especially by the men). It's just a little different, try it:

Allemande left your corner Joe  
Come back home do you do  
Gents star left in the middle of the town  
Pick up your own with an arm around  
Star promenade around you go  
Spread out wide for the old yo yo  
Slip 'em in with a wrap around  
Keep on goin don't slow down  
Spin 'em out with a yo yo spin  
Keep on walking we're gone again  
Gents walk out with a wrap around  
Girls star right in the middle of the town  
Girls back out spin 'em Joe  
Catch her left do a pass o  
Her by the left corner by the right  
Back to her like an allemande the  
Gents back into a right hand star  
Shoot that star, have a little fun  
Go right and left, turn back one  
Catch by the right make a wrong way thru  
Back up boys in a left hand star  
Shoot that star, skip one girl—Allemande . . .  
Wrap Around—partners facing same directions with inside hands joined at arms length  
Man stands pat, girl makes complete left face roll toward partner without releasing hands. Girl must raise right elbow slightly to prevent having it wrapped under joined hands.  
Yo Yo Spin—From wrap around position, girl "unwraps" by making complete right face roll away from partner ending at arms length facing same direction as partner.  
Gents Walk Out With Wrap Around—Gents drop star and walk forward half way round girl to face other direction girl wraps by making a half left face roll. Couples are then in position for girls to make right hand star for "wrap" star promenade.
