FCA, FFSD Meetings Top List of October Activities

The Silver Springs weekend workshop Oct. 13-15 will feature Bill Muench and Harold Mainor on squares, and Ruth Jewell and Wray Ferrell on rounds, and on Oct. 21 Bob Dawson will call the Fall Frolics at Deerfield Beach. At Lake City Irv Elias calls in the Veterans Memorial Hall on Oct. 28.

Keeping Up With the 11th National:

October is Advance Registration Month in Florida!

IF YOU SIGNED an underwriting certificate (see box) several weeks ago, you may now formally enter your registration for the 11th National Square Dance convention and receive your golden ribbon certifying you as an early-bird registrant, according to Bob Marcotte of Miami, registration chairman for the June 14-16 event. Correct postoffice address for correspondence regarding the convention is Box 2427, Miami Beach 40, Fla.

And if you haven't signed an underwriting certificate, send in your full registration (see page 5) and get your earlybird ribbon. "Pay now, go later," was the way it was put by Dr. Ernest Bartley of Gainesville.

"Reason for the underwriting certificates was to obtain funds to extend the invitation at Detroit since regulations did not permit actual registration for Miami Beach to start until after the Detroit convention was underway," explained Harry Moore, general convention chairman.

Marcotte points out that those who forwarded an underwriting certificate received a receipt in return. This receipt may be forwarded to him in lieu of cash with the full registration sheet.

These and other matters were discussed at a meeting of the budget and planning committees for the 11th National at Clearwater on Sept. 3. Reports were given by Harry Edwards, general vice chairman in charge of upstate committees, John Morgan, facilities vice chairman, Manny Jacobson, personnel vice chairman, Al Cody, program chairman, Clare Malhiot, round dance chairman, Lester Linn, and George Willis, general vice chairman in charge of operations.

"These enterprising gentlemen readily communicated their enthusiasm to the audience," Frank Cornwall states, "and we're happy to report that the 11th is

off to a good start.' Cornwall, publicity chairman for the event, reported that a July 30 meeting of the executive committee named Jack Woody, superintendent of recreation for Miami Beach as chairman of the youth activities program. Program will include organized daily programs including cookouts, swimming, sightseeing and camera tours, teenage dances-all under direction of trained recreational personnel. Whether the lower age limit for participation included baby-sitting was not made clear at Clearwater, but clearly, "if you want the service, buy a registration for the person involved."

"Jack has done more for square dancing in this area than any other one person," Cornwall states. "Until Woody (Continued on page 4)



Effort for National Dates Back to '35, Says Bartley

was made superintendent there was no sign of square dancing on the Beach." Air conditioned halls, live bands, good callers are part of the Woody recipe which now provides square and round dancing almost nightly somewhere on Miami Beach.

A fact sheet was presented to those present at the Sept. 3 meeting promising "many innovations" which will take advantage of Miami Beach's sub-tropical geography, and a general daily program providing continuous dancing from 10:00 a.m. until 11:30 p.m. in 12 halls (165,000 square feet) and 10 meeting rooms and exhibit booth area up to 18,000 square feet. Free parking for 3500 automobiles is promised and conventioners will be housed at bargain rates in nearby hotels (see map, page 13).

Committee Reports Heard At Clearwater Meeting

AT CLEARWATER Bartley pointed out that the start toward bringing the National to Florida dates back to 1935. Willis urged a campaign for block registration by clubs, Cody outlined rates for the program and offered clubs a commission of

20% on advertising sold, commission to be paid in advertising space in the program.

Some discussion followed on the desirability of promotional dances designed to raise funds for the 11th National. Confusion existed between these dances and the so-called "trail" dances immediately preceding the convention. How such promotional dances would affect the regular program of the regional dancers' associations was a fuzzy area. Typical reaction was that of President Hink Smith of the West Coast Association, "Tell us what you expect of us and we'll do it!"

Moore was unable to release a complete list of committees, because chairmen for some up-state committees had not been found. As Bow & SWING went to press, vacancies existed in such committees as contras, folk dancing, trail dances.

Cornwall sent a release to all dancers and instructors stressing that "each of

you are part of the publicity committee," and urging that convention posters be displayed for the benefit of local dancers as well as touring visitors. "Make frequent announcements, reminding dancers that this is the world's greatest square dance event." Clubs are asked to avoid conflict with convention dates and to plan early and block registration of their members.

"See that stories get in your local newspapers, furnish material to radio and TV stations." Cornwall added, "establish a good liaison with media people by giving them news of your club activities."

ference as to whether or not they come to Miami Beach, so please don't delay."

Fenimore asked for copies of such letters so that excessive duplication of invitations might be avoided.




