Staff, Program, Set for Knothead Reunion, Sept. 1

All are memebrs of the charter square.

Sound will be under the direction of Gene Baylis of Miami, and the Dixie Swingers Square Dance Club will operate a refreshment booth. Knothead kallers and Knothead round dance leaders from all over the state will handle workshop sessions for both square and round dancing.

The program officially opens at 9 a.m. Saturday, Sept. 2 with Kaller Camp in charge of a workshop in the auditorium. At mid-morning the emphasis will shift to round with Ed and Kay Mack, while Jim Galloway carries on with Knothead kallers in the ballroom until noon. Dur-

ing the afternoon all three halls will be active, with separate sessions for easy and difficult rounds, a workshop on arky actions with Bill Muench, and sessions on styling. The Saturday evening program includes request rounds from 7:45 and the calling of Ruy Camp from 8:30 to midnight, in the auditorium and by remote hookup in both other halls. After parties and snacks will follow in the hotel.







1000 Squares in a Single Hall at Miami Beach

WITH A main hall large enough to dance one thousand squares, equipped with 200 enclosed 12 inch speakers in the ceiling to insure perfect audio, and numerous smaller rooms to be used for square and round dancing, workshops, clinics and meeting rooms, Miami Beach expects to be able to adequately care for any possible crowd attending the Eleventh National Square Dance Convention in Miami Beach next June.

Committees for the national recently toured the 195,000 air conditioned square feet and were able to see for themselves the two large storage rooms which have been air conditioned for our use, adding 18,000 square feet of space which Gordon Blaum and Les Linn agree is a "perfect hot hash hall."

"But how can we paint this picture to those who can't see for themselves? ask Frank and Marion Cornwall, publicity chairmen

Tentative planning provides for 12 or more hours of continuous dancing each day in fifteen locations. Programming will embrace all levels of square and round dancing, workshops, and clinics, and folk, contra, and old time dancing.

All committee chairmen will be expected to present their planning at Clearwater on Sept. 3. Then the first draft will be formulated. All told, more than 300 work assignments for panelists, callers, round dance teachers, folk, contra and old time dancing instructors will be made, and another 2000 assignments will be made to dancers who will help stage the big convention.

Harry Edwards of Gainesville serves as vice chairman in charge of committees for rounds, panels, exhibitions, contras, folk dancing, old time dancing, trail dances and souvenir program.

General Chairman Harry Moore reports that the local area executive committee has concluded that the use of smaller rooms rather than a few large halls will provide better dancing and
