SOMETHING FOR everyone will be included in programming for the sixth annual Konvention of Florida Knotheads to be held in Clearwater on Labor Day Weekend, according to Helen Galloway, Knothead treasurer.

"We have added teen and family periods and there will be sessions of real hash," Mrs. Galloway told BOW & SWING. "There will be intermediate squares, square dancer rounds and round dancer rounds—in fact we have scheduled dancing for everyone."

Jack Jackson will be the featured caller. "At the National, people we talked with from Columbus had nothing but the highest praise for Jackson," Mrs. Galloway says. "We see that he is listed on the staffs at Kirkwood, Boyne Mountain, West Point, and Cedar Point."

Mrs. Galloway pointed out that Florida Knotheads may use their Knothead badge for admission to the trail dance on the eve of the konvention.

Facilities of the Clearwater Municipal Auditorium, as well as those of the headquarters hotel, the Jack Tar Harrison, will be used for the konvention which is scheduled to start on Saturday morning and run through noon on Monday (Labor Day), Sept. 3.

The Clearwater facilities will also be used for the Holiday for Rounds weekend and for the annual meeting of the Florida Federation of Square Dancers.

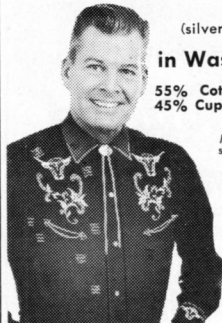

HERE IS a new basic offered by George Hales of Hialeah:

## WHEEL THRU

Explanation: Heads or sides (or any two couples facing each other) Take Opposite with a right forearm grip, walk around one full turn; take partner by the left and courtesies turn into place.

It does change sequence and it can be used in place of right and left thru. Here's an example:

Heads, go up to the middle and back with you  
Go forward again and wheel thru, turn your girl  
Then star thru, pass thru, wheel thru with the outside two  
Dive thru, wheel thru, pass thru, allemande left.

## CHAIN DILLY by Bill Muench, Tampa

1 & 3 go R & L thru / Then star thru w/opposite 2 / Pass thru / 8 Chain thru  
Chain em over and chain em back, two by two / Then R & L thru  
8 chain six, count six hand / Go two by two / Then R & L thru  
8 Chain 4, count 4 hands is all you do / Then R & L thru / Don't just stand, left alle.

Sides Right, Circle to a line / Pass thru, fold the boys, star thru  
Men hook left elbows, swing half around / Bend the line, right & left thru,  
Pass thru, bend the line, pass thru / Fold the boys, star thru, men hook left  
Swing half, bend the line, cross trail allemande

## MARCH WINDS NO. 6 by Ed Newton, Sarasota

Heads right, circle to line / Pass thru, bend the line, pass thru, fold the ends  
Star thru, Calif. twirl, right & left thru  
Pass thru, bend the line, pass thru, fold the ends  
Star thru, wheel & deal, double pass thru / First couple left, next right, right & left thru  
Pass thru, bend the line, cross trail, allemande

## LINES FACE ME by Roger Chapman, Winter Haven

Four ladies chain, 2 & 3, right & left thru / New head gents, face corner, box knit,  
New couple No. 1, (girls) out to the right, circle 1/2  
New couple No. 3, (girls) out to right, circle full  
Everybody, star thru, fold the line, box the knit  
Right & left thru, square thru 3/4s, allemande.

1-2 Waltz Away, 2, 3; Together, 2, 3; Roll, 2, 3; Fwd, 2, 3; In open pos waltz fwd in LOD, L, R turning slightly back to back; Waltz fwd in LOD R, L, R turning slightly face to face; swinging joined hands forward roll down LOD in 3 steps L, R, L with M facing L face and W turning R; take semi closed pos and dance fwd 3 steps R, L, R;

**5-8 Step, Swing.** — M Maneuv, 2, 3; Waltz Turn R, 2, 3; Twirl, 2, 3; In semi closed pos step fwd on R, L, swing R fwd, hold; M maneuvers R, L, R to closed pos with back to LOD; do R face turning waltz as M steps back in LOD on L, steps in LOD R, closes L to R to end facing LOD; W twirls under her R, and M's L arms down LOD as M dances fwd in LOD, R, R; 9-16 Waltz Away, 2, 3; Together, 2, 3; Roll, 2, 3; Fwd, 2, 3; Step, Swing, — M Maneuv, 2, 3; Waltz Turn R, 3; Twirl, 2, 3; Repeat meas 1-2 to end in semi closed pos facing LOD.

PART "B"

**1-20 Step, Swing.** — M Cross Over, 2, 3; W Cross Over, 2, 3; Step, Touch, — In semi closed pos step fwd in LOD on L, swing R fwd, hold; M takes long reaching step on R as he crosses in front of W to outside, turns R face as he steps in place L, R to end facing LOD with W momentarily on his L side; W takes long reaching step on her R as she steps across in front of M to outside of circle, W turns R face as she steps in place L, R; M takes 3 steps in place L, R, L as W crosses in front of him to end in semi-closed pos facing LOD; Step fwd on L, th R.

**21-24 Step, Swing.** — M Crosses Over, 2, 3; W Crosses Over, 2, 3; Step, Touch, — Repeat meas 1-20

**25-28 Step, Swing.** — Back, Face, Teh; Away, 2, 3; Reverse Spin, 2, 3; In semi-closed pos step fwd in LOD on L, swing R fwd, hold; M crosses in RLOD on R, face partner in closed pos as teh L, hold; retain hand hold M's L and W's R and step back on L, twd COH away from partner, step R, L in place; M maneuvers in 3 steps R, L, R to end with back to LOD and take pos as W does; L face partner spin in RLOD to end facing LOD and partner;

**29-32 Waltz, 2, 3; Waltz, 2, 3; Waltz, 2, 3; Twirl 2, 3; Starting in LOD on L, do W meas; R face turning waltz L, R, L; R, L, R, L, R, L; W twirls under joined hands to end in open pos facing LOD to repeat dance.**

Dance in done a total of three times ending with two twirls and bow on last time.

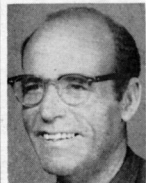

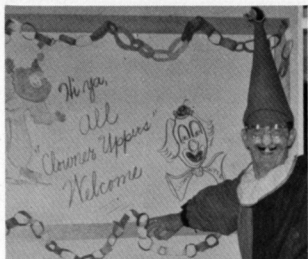
