

Holiday Spirit Shapes Year End Dance Calendar

VISITING CALLERS, scattered throughout Florida like transient snowbirds, lend new faces and new calls to the square dancer's calendar for December. And with a flurry of Christmas and New Year's parties slated for the end of the month, dancers will find the pace an equal match for the happy holiday season.

Saturday, December 1, is a big day for four area organizations. In Orlando, Johnny Calhoun of Birmingham, Alabama, will conduct an afternoon workshop and an evening dance at the city auditorium under auspices of the Orlando Western Square Dance Council and the city recreation department.

In Miami, Les Gotcher, mid-way through his successful Square Dance Institute at the Crown Hotel, conducts an evening dance at the North Miami Armory. Ocala Lions Club also sponsors their Sunshine Festival Dance on December 1, and at the Ox-Bow in St. Petersburg, the Sing-A-Longs club will celebrate with a first anniversary party and dance. The following day, Sunday, December 2, the First Sunday Round Dancers will meet at the Ox-Bow.

Tampa Inter-Club Council and the city recreation department sponsors Marie Armstrong on Wednesday, December 5, at North Boulevard Center. On Friday evening, December 7, the Squares and Pairs of St. Petersburg's YWCA will dance to Jim Pearson's calls.

Eleventh National Financial Report Made by Moore

DO FLORIDA dancers desire to sponsor activities at future national conventions?

This was a question posed in the report of General Chairman Harry Moore of Miami Beach, covering the 11th National Square Dance Convention last June.

"If so," Moore suggested, "it will be possible to sponsor after parties, after dance banquets like Oklahoma and other convention states."

In his report he traced the development of the Florida national convention back to 1953 when the Florida Square and Folk Dance Callers and Teachers Association held the first Florida festival.

"Interest was expressed by the callers at this early date in sponsoring the national convention," Moore's report states. "Gordon Blaum, Gene Baylis and Bart Bartley are among the callers who were approached by the Miami Beach convention

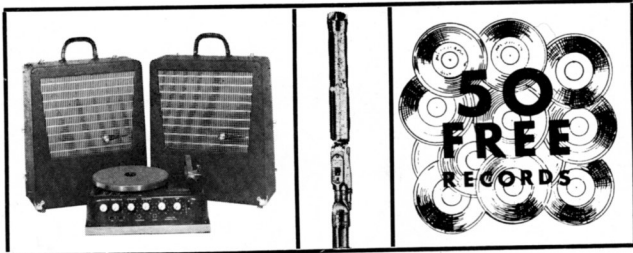

bureau to spearhead a movement to bid for the National." Since the national must be sponsored by an organized square dance association, this is doubtless why the FCA and Florida callers were active in organization of the regional dancers associations and the state federation.

"Interest in the national presented itself at the organizational meeting of the Florida Federation of Square Dancers at Melbourne, x x x and it was agreed that a bid be presented at the 7th National convention in Louisville." 116 Floridians attended the Louisville and most were at the bid meeting.

Each of the three bids for the national has had the full support of the regionals plus the FCA, Moore continued. "The actual bid was made by the Florida Federation of Square Dancers," with Bartley supporting Moore as president of the federation in making the successful presentation at Des Moines.

"The reason for this background is to acquaint you with the interest and support of organized square dancing through many years, to bring the National to Florida. The success of the 11th National is due in large measure to the groundwork these leaders prepared for those who followed," Moore's report states.

"A bid for the National Square Dance Convention is made with the full realization of the countless hours of time that will be required by hundreds of volunteer workers, plus money they will spend on their tour of duty that cannot be recovered. As stated in the bulletin released by the National Convention Executive Committee, 'it would cost \$100,000 to stage the National if everyone received pay for their work, this would make the convention impossible.'

"With this in mind, why would any organization make a bid to host the convention? It has been proven in every state where the convention has been held, that square dancers, square dances, square dancing and square dance clubs have increased many times as a direct result of the convention. This alone makes the convention worthwhile.

"Any organization that can stage a major national convention that attracts thousands of delegates, is worthy of recognition. This one fact alone is worth thousands of dollars publicity-wise to square dancing. The public, including the officials from Governor Bryant down to your city officials, were aware that Florida was host to the Nation's square dancers.

"Morris McLemore, columnist for the Miami Daily News, stated in his column that we had more publicity than anything that had happened on Miami Beach since the '26 hurricane. It was good publicity that did not make square dancers look like odd balls, but friendly people having a good time.

"Never before and probably never again will square dancing have such a favorable

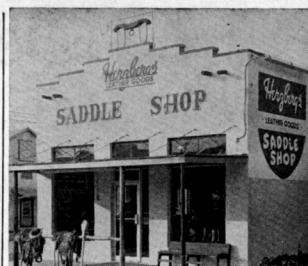

Hixon Succeeds Fenimore as President Of Florida Callers Association

AL HIXON of Daytona Beach was elected president of the Florida Callers Association at their annual meeting in Orlando Oct. 21, succeeding Jay Fenimore of Hollywood.

Other new officers include Sam Prescott of Winter Haven, vice president, Ed Newton of Sarasota, secretary; and Joe Johnston of Windermere, treasurer.

In addition to Fenimore as a director-at-large, the board of directors include Bob Waites of Gainesville, Joe Curtis of Orlando, Ted Barton of Miami, Phil White of Panama City, and Howard Parrish of Lakeland, all selected on a geographical basis.

Dr. Hixon immediately announced that Jay Fenimore would assume responsibility as square dance coordinator for Bow & SWING, including the Callers Syllabus and Square of the Month, and named Mel Clark of Lakeland as his liaison officer with the Florida Federation of Square Dancers. Other committee appointments include Sam Prescott, education committee chairman, Ernest Bartley, chairman of committee to revise and print new membership application blanks, and Phil White to head the Bow & SWING committee, with Roger Chapman and Ed Mack as members.

A change in membership classifications was suggested providing that newly-joining non-callers would be restricted to associate membership only, and that all newly-applying members be required to serve at least one year as an associate member before becoming eligible for full membership. Associate members have all privileges of the association except they may not vote nor hold office.

Site for the 1963 annual meeting and clinic was designated as Fort Lauderdale with the Governor's Club Hotel as headquarters. An effort will be made to obtain the services of a nationally-recognized instructor to handle the clinic.

The meeting will be held in mid-October.

Other business of the meeting included a discussion of Bow & SWING's situation and it was the sense of the meeting that it should be dancer-owned and controlled, but that the callers could properly find ways and means of subsidizing it. It was pointed out that during the past year the callers association had agreed to an increase in the wholesale cost of subscriptions for their members, and had actually subsidized special issues of the publication.

On motion by Colin Walton it was agreed to express appreciation to Harry and Helen Moore for their service in heading up the 11th National Convention.

Bob Ruff of Whittier, California, presented his tricks of the trade—developed from a school-teacher approach to square dancing that dated back to “the post-war period when Los Angeles decided to put square dancing into its adult education

program”—and called a jamboree dance in Orlando's municipal auditorium that gave most dancers the time of their life but in the words of one observer, “left them wondering if they should have enjoyed it or not.”

Ruff's super-smooth calling, his absolute sense of rhythm, and his superb timing left room for the criticism that his was not calling up to the level of the dancers. But he stopped the floor again with some novel treatment of age-old figures like the Grand Square and even the Grand Right and Left.

Hired to conduct the clinic for the Florida Callers Association annual meeting, Ruff followed much the same path as his two predecessors, Ed Gilmore and Max Forsyth, but he not only brought many original ideas but demonstrated how they might be presented to dancers.

“I'm going to try to show you how Babs and I work with our classes at Whittier,” he said.

That he was a master at his craft was displayed at the jamboree when he had the whole floor doing Ede Butlin's Slauchwise Donegal—a contra to the popular Donegal music—and scarcely lost a single pair.

In teaching Golden Gate Waltz' double twinkle, for instance, he used the expression “swivel your hips” to make the figure popularly understandable.

Admitting that he was a “middle of the road conservative” Ruff said he felt there is a “big need for sharing a lot of ideas on these points of square dance leadership,” adding that “the more we can improve the longer we will perpetuate square dancing.”

Less Linn of Miami jokingly told Ruff that “we don't allow the California Twirl here” and fun was made of his presentation of the Golden Gate Waltz. Ruff said he had long wanted an opportunity to come to Florida for a visit. He is in public school physical education in a Los Angeles suburb.

Cast Off, Centers In

BOW & SWING'S Square of the Month steps aside for the Callers Syllabus material which is now being edited by Jay Fenimore, recently appointed as square dance coordinator with responsibility for making the monthly selections.

Try some of the following figures on your dancers:

Cast Off Three Quarters—From a line of four, with the ends acting as a pivot, couples turn away from the center of the line $\frac{3}{4}$ turn to end facing the other couple in your line. (Accomplish the same end result as bend only turning in the opposite way [away from the center] and with a $\frac{3}{4}$ turn.)

Centers In—Upon completion of double pass thru, the lead couple separates just enough to allow the couple following to move forward and occupy the center space. Produces a line of four facing out in this particular application.

The following breaks give only the pattern of the dance: Timing and patter to be used is left to the discretion of the caller, to use in his own way according to his style and the requirements of his dancers . . .

Heads lead to the right, circle to a line
Pass thru, Cast Off $\frac{3}{4}$ around
New lines of four, forward and back
Pass thru, Cast Off, $\frac{3}{4}$ around
Pass thru, Cast Off, $\frac{3}{4}$ around
Cross trail, start lookin' man!!!
For the corner, left allemande . . .

Heads square thru, four hands around
Split the sides around one to a line of four
Forward and back, pass thru, Cast Off,
 $\frac{3}{4}$ around
Inside two, square thru, $\frac{3}{4}$ 'round
Separate around one, line up four
Bend the line, pass thru, Cast Off, $\frac{3}{4}$ around
Inside two, square thru, $\frac{3}{4}$ 'round
Start lookin' man, corners all, left allemande . . .

Heads to the right, circle to a line
Pass thru, wheel and deal
Double pass thru
Centers In, Cast Off, $\frac{3}{4}$ around
Pass thru, wheel and deal
Double pass thru
Centers In, Cast Off, $\frac{3}{4}$ around
Pass thru, wheel and deal
Double pass thru
Centers In, Cast Off, $\frac{3}{4}$ around
Right and left thru, across from you
Cross trail, left allemande . . .

Heads a half square thru
Split the sides around one & line up four
Pass thru, Cast Off, $\frac{3}{4}$ around
Star thru, across from you
Inside two, pass thru, Centers In, Cast Off,
 $\frac{3}{4}$ 'round
Star thru, across from you
Double pass thru, all frontier whirl
Inside two, square thru, $\frac{3}{4}$ 'round
Look for the corner, left allemande . . .

Heads forward and back with you
Forward again, star thru, pass thru
Square thru, 3 hands around
Center two, frontier whirl
Centers In, Cast Off, $\frac{3}{4}$ 'round
Pass thru, wheel and deal
Double pass thru
Nudge the girl in front of you
She'll turn around for a left allemande
Here we go, right and left grand . . .

Head ladies chain to the right
New Side Ladies chain across
Heads forward and back with you
Sides do a right and left thru
Heads to the right and circle four
Head gents break to a line of four
Pass thru, Cast Off, $\frac{3}{4}$ around
Half square thru across from you
Inside two, pass thru, Centers In, Cast Off,
 $\frac{3}{4}$ 'round

Half square thru across from you
Inside two, pass thru, Centers In, Cast Off,
 $\frac{3}{4}$ 'round
Inside two, pass thru, Centers In, Cast Off,
 $\frac{3}{4}$ 'round
All pass thru, "U" turn around, star thru
across the town
Do a Dixie Grand and watch it man
Right, left, right, left allemande . . .

Heads forward and back with you
Side ladies chain you do
Heads Cross trail, around two, line up four
Pass thru, Cast Off, $\frac{3}{4}$ 'round
Inside two, right and left thru
Finish it off with a half sashay
Forward 8 and back that way
All pass thru, Cast Off, $\frac{3}{4}$ 'round
Star thru across from you
2 ladies chain and turn 'em too
Square thru, $\frac{3}{4}$ man,
To your corners all, left allemande . . .

For Square of the Month, Coordinator Fenimore selects this number by Chuck Raley of Lakewood, Cal., now appearing on a MacGregor record (954):

The Preacher and the Bear

Opener and Break:
Do-Sa-Do the corner and left hand turn your maid,
Ladies center back to back, Gents, you promenade,
Go once around and the girls fall in,
follow behind your man,
Gents roll back, left allemande, partner
right and left grand,
Oh—Lawdy, won't you do-sa-do that girl,
Oh—Lawdy, won't you swing and whirl and then,
You promenade with the pretty girl and get
on around the square,
For goodness sake, if you don't help me,
don't you help that bear.

Figure:
Well, head two couples up and back, do-sa-do
the opposite around,
Face the sides right and left thru and
turn that gal around,
Eight chain four across the square,
count four hands, you do
Go right and left thru with the outside two
and then you star thru,
Square thru three quarters, three quarters
'round the square,
Swing the corner lady and you promenade
from there,
You promenade with the pretty little girl
and you get on around the square,
Oh, Lawdy, if you don't help me,
For goodness sake, don't you help that bear.
Sequence of dance: Opener, Heads twice; Break,
Sides twice.

Public Relations is Concern of FFSD

THE NEED for a constructive approach to public relations for square dancing was an underlying theme at the annual meeting of the Florida Federation of Square Dancers, and newly-elected Chairman J. Warriner "Hink" Smith, Jr., of St. Petersburg was asked to name a committee to study the problem and present a recommended "uniform procedure" to local associations and other groups in the state.

Other public relations facets of the meeting:

- It was proposed by the publishers of **BOW & SWING** that the publication be owned by the federation with mechanics of editing and publishing handled on a contract basis, and with an editorial advisory committee to establish policy. Under this plan any deficits would be the responsibility of the federation.

- The board of delegates unanimously approved the idea of having club directory listings in **BOW & SWING** run on a paid basis, at the rate of \$12.00 per year per club for a three-line listing.

- The idea of "yellow pages" listings under the heading "Square Dancing—Western Style" with a suitable phone number for visiting dancers was generally approved and will be incorporated in the recommendations.

Smith, last month elected president of the West Coast Association, advanced from state treasurer to federation chairman. Other new officers include Harold Jenkins, DeBary, vice chairman, Virgil Green, Jacksonville, secretary, and Bill Whittle, Pompano Beach, treasurer.

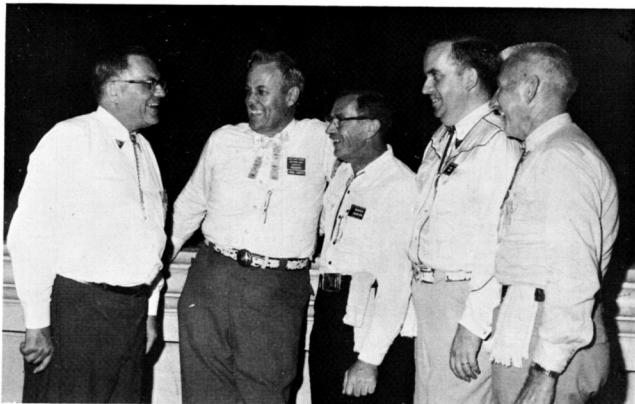
All past presidents automatically are eligible to serve on the board of delegates if they wish, under the terms of a motion passed by the board.

New delegates include E. H. Kellogg of Ocala, president of the Central Florida association, and C. J. Thompson, Ocala; Paul Lane of Jacksonville, president of the North East Florida Association, and Carl Law, of Jacksonville; Tom Crooke of Pensacola, president of the Pensacola Square Dance Council, and Elvin Thompson and Faye Taylor, of Pensacola. Other delegates succeeding themselves include Wesley Lawson of Winter Haven and Bert Willard of the West Coast Association, and Al Fenton and Bud Bowman of Miami, of the Southeast Florida association.

Added to the board as past presidents were Harry Moore of Miami Beach, Carl Heath of Winter Haven, Al Cody of Kissimmee and Harry Edwards of Gainesville.

At the annual meeting of the Florida Callers Association Oct. 21, Melville Clark of Lakeland was named as the callers' liaison to the federation.

A meeting of the "old board" began at 10 a.m. Oct. 20, at which President Edwards reviewed unfinished business of his administration. The expected report from Harry Moore, Chairman of the 11th National Convention, did not arrive until the

afternoon session which began at 2 p.m. Moore reported a total attendance of 10,336, total income of \$34,117.24, and disbursements of \$34,000.97, leaving undistributed proceeds of \$116.27. Complete details of the Moore report are published elsewhere in this issue.

The federation treasurer's report showed a balance on hand of \$1216.10 with all obligations paid, and no outstanding receivables.

Both \$1000 loans to the 11th National were repaid in full, Treasurer Smith reported.

The matter of allocation of territory for local associations came before the board as Southeast Florida suggested a new regional association be carved out of the middle east coast area, and the West Coast association asked to have Highlands County placed within its boundary. The latter request was granted by the board, and a committee will be named to study the possibilities of developing new area locals (from the standpoint of dancer population and available leadership).

The 1963 state convention will be held in Jacksonville's new convention hall, on dates to be established so as not to conflict with school months nor with the national square dance convention, and the state federation treasury will lend up to \$500 to handle initial expenses of the convention. Proceeds of the convention will be divided between the sponsoring local, the state callers association, and the state dancers federation.

Smith introduced the problem of **BOW & SWING** by presenting information received from the publisher which indicated a deficit of over \$3205 in the 12 months period ending June, 1962 (due in part to extra costs involved in publicizing the 11th National), and offering a proposal to

continue the publication on a contract basis which would have produced the same 12 issues at a deficit of some \$2600.

It was felt that under federation ownership, greater advertiser support and keener appreciation of the need for subscriber support would be developed. It was noted that Southeast Florida offers subscriptions to members as an optional service, and that the North East Florida association as an association of clubs has no machinery to provide **BOW & SWING** for its members except by subscription dances throughout its territory.

A special committee will be named to explore possibilities for federation ownership of the magazine as well as possible caller subsidization and possible expansion of the magazine into the regional field.

It was agreed that a certificate should be presented to Harry and Helen Moore in appreciation of their service as chairmen of the 11th National Square Dance Convention. Rising vote was taken also for the retiring officers.
