National a Big Success as 10,500 Attendance Puts It Into the Black

REGISTRATIONS AT the 11th National Square Dance Convention ran well beyond the five-figure mark and the cash position will enable the treasury to pay back all original funds borrowed from square dance groups, it was announced on June 20 by General Chairman Harry Moore. 'Il believe that almost without exception those who attended enjoyed themselves, and I feel that the square dance movement in Florida will continue to profit from the interest developed by the national convention," Moore told Bow & SWING. "These are the important things, and from that standpoint I consider it a most successful undertaking."

Simultaneous dancing in as many as nine halls, a hash hall that played consistently to capacity, a novel "family and teen" program that never lacked an audience, a highly successful "international day" program, panel discussions with real meaty fare, and an arena show that hung the SRO sign up for three successive nights, were other measures of the success of the three-day event.

When the curtain went up with opening of registration at noon on Wednesday June 13, countless man- (and lady-) hours of volunteer work came to fruition, and Chairman Moore's quiet and confident way with people proved its value.

Although members of the registration were still seeking an accurate count. Moore stated that the final figure should be about 10.500.

George Nichols of Denver, chairman of the National Executive Committee, told Bow & SWING the 11th National broke all records for bad weather. "But it was a good convention and the Miami committees did a grand job." Jerry Curler of Des Moines was elected to succeed Nichols as chairman, and Harold Erickson of Detroit will serve as secretarytreasurer.

A highlight of the Saturday evening program was the demonstration by the St. Paul delegation inviting dancers to attend the 12th annual convention there June 20-22, 1963, and the announcement that 1964 convention would be held in Long Beach, California. Dallas was practically certain for 1965.

Jay Fenimore of Hollywood, in charge of programming and music, thought the 11th National introduced some original square dance material that we'll be dancing in months to come, including Peel Off basic, and such singing calls as 4 Leaf Clover, Tipperary, Million Dollar Smith, Angry, Florida, Ragtime Banjo Ball, Big Daddy, Walking and Talking, Fond Affection, and Little Girl. Florida callers provided the staff of masters of cere-

monies and assistants required to keep the show moving, and furnished their share of the calling.

Some forty new rounds were presented and reproduced in the program, including On to Miami Beach by Penny and Ross Crispino of Nampa, Idaho, and Moon Over Miami by Lloyd and Maizie Poole of Wiesbaden, Germany. Florida instructors who presented dances include Gene and Ima Baylis of Miami, Jim and Noriene Pearson of St. Petersburg, Ruth Bartley and Bob Waites of Gainesville, Ed and Kay Mack of Clearwater. Members of the Round Dance Council of Florida furnished the masters of ceremonies throughout the convention.

Shh! July Quiet—Everybody Resting


