

# National a Big Success as 10,500 Attendance Puts It Into the Black

REGISTRATIONS AT the 11th National Square Dance Convention ran well beyond the five-figure mark and the cash position will enable the treasury to pay back all original funds borrowed from square dance groups, it was announced on June 20 by General Chairman Harry Moore. "I believe that almost without exception those who attended enjoyed themselves, and I feel that the square dance movement in Florida will continue to profit from the interest developed by the national convention," Moore told BOW & SWING. "These are the important things, and from that standpoint I consider it a most successful undertaking."

Simultaneous dancing in as many as nine halls, a hash hall that played consistently to capacity, a novel "family and teen" program that never lacked an audience, a highly successful "international day" program, panel discussions with real meaty fare, and an arena show that hung the SRO sign up for three successive nights, were other measures of the success of the three-day event.

When the curtain went up with opening of registration at noon on Wednesday June 13, countless man- (and lady-) hours of volunteer work came to fruition, and Chairman Moore's quiet and confident way with people proved its value.

Although members of the registration were still seeking an accurate count, Moore stated that the final figure should be about 10,500.

George Nichols of Denver, chairman of the National Executive Committee,

told BOW & SWING the 11th National broke all records for bad weather. "But it was a good convention and the Miami committees did a grand job." Jerry Curler of Des Moines was elected to succeed Nichols as chairman, and Harold Erickson of Detroit will serve as secretary-treasurer.

A highlight of the Saturday evening program was the demonstration by the St. Paul delegation inviting dancers to attend the 12th annual convention there June 20-22, 1963, and the announcement that 1964 convention would be held in Long Beach, California. Dallas was practically certain for 1965.

Jay Fenimore of Hollywood, in charge of programming and music, thought the 11th National introduced some original square dance material that we'll be dancing in months to come, including Peel Off basic, and such singing calls as 4 Leaf Clover, Tipperary, Million Dollar Smith, Angry, Florida, Ragtime Banjo Ball, Big Daddy, Walking and Talking, Fond Affection, and Little Girl. Florida callers provided the staff of masters of cere-

monies and assistants required to keep the show moving, and furnished their share of the calling.

Some forty new rounds were presented and reproduced in the program, including On to Miami Beach by Penny and Ross Crispino of Nampa, Idaho, and Moon Over Miami by Lloyd and Maizie Poole of Wiesbaden, Germany. Florida instructors who presented dances include Gene and Ima Baylis of Miami, Jim and Noriene Pearson of St. Petersburg, Ruth Bartley and Bob Waites of Gainesville, Ed and Kay Mack of Clearwater. Members of the Round Dance Council of Florida furnished the masters of ceremonies throughout the convention.

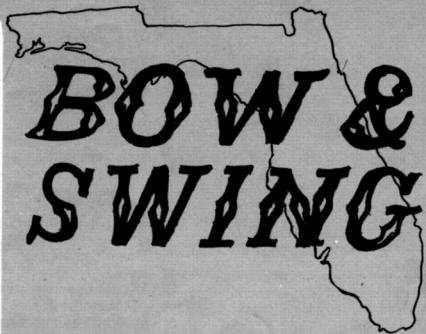

At Savannah the Memorial Park facility was set up for the 3d annual Aquaduck Convention on July 13 and 14, and at Greenville, S.C., George Campbell of Miami headed a list of area callers for the 4th Annual Square Dance Formal in the Municipal Auditorium on July 21.

Upcoming for August is weekend at the Naples Beach Club Hotel with Fenimore and Bedell, starting August 17, a fifth Friday deal at Lehigh Acres by the West Coast Association (yet to be ratified by member clubs) which will incorporate a Knothead qualification feature.

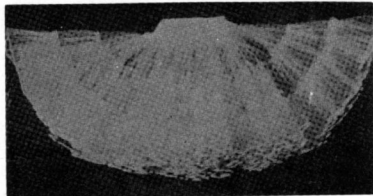

Round of the Month for July:

## Peggy

ROUND OF THE MONTH for July is Peggy (Windsor 4674), composed by Charlie and Bettye Proctor of Dallas. According to Bob Waites, round dance coordinator, the dance is ideal for square dancers with a simple routine and short sequence. The dance was presented at the 11th National by Al and Millie Boehringer of Dayton. Starting position is open, facing, with man's back toward center of hall, man's right and lady's left hands joined. Footwork is opposite and steps are described for the man:

Meas. INTRODUCTION (4 meas)  
1-4 Wait; Wait; Apart, -1 Point, -2 Together (to Semi-Closed); -3 Touch, -4 Wait 2 meas; step fwd away from partner twd COH on L ft, hold 1 ct, point R toe fwd to floor twd partner, hold 1 ct; step R to R ft twd partner and wall into Semi-Closed pos facing LOD, hold 1 ct, touch L toe beside R ft, hold 1 ct;

### DANCE

1-4 Fwd, 2, 3, Brush; On 2, 3, Brush (face); (Closed) Dip In, -, Recover, -1 (Quick) Pivot, 2, 3 (to Semi-Closed), Brush; In Semi-Closed pos, start L ft and take 3 light running steps fwd in LOD, brush R ft fwd while dipping slightly on L knee; start R ft and take 3 light running steps fwd in LOD, brush L ft fwd and CW around in a small flare while turning  $\frac{1}{4}$  R to face partner and wall; taking Closed pos, dip twd twd COH on L ft, hold 1 ct, recover by stepping fwd twd wall on R ft, hold 1 ct; start L ft and do a full R face couple pivot in 3 steps ending in Semi-Closed pos facing LOD, brush R ft fwd in LOD;

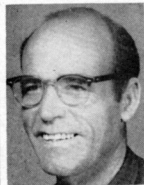
5-8 Fwd, 2, 3, Brush; (Slow) Twirl, -, 2, - (to Butterfly); L Back-Pas De Basque; Pas De Basque; Roll, 2, 3, Thru (to Butterfly); Start R ft and take 3 light running steps fwd in LOD, brush L ft fwd while dipping slightly on R knee; while M moves alongside down LOD with two slow steps, L-R turning  $\frac{1}{4}$  R to face R and M's L arm in 2 slow steps, L-R, ending in Butterfly pos with M's back twd COH; starts L ft and do a back pas de basque by stepping swd in LOD on L ft, step quickly in R ft XIB of L, step quickly on L ft in place; repeat back pas de basque starting on R ft in RLOD; release leading hands, swing trailing hands fwd and release as partners roll away from each other down LOD with 3 steps starting M's L ft, M turning L face and W turning R face, step thru in LOD on R ft turning  $\frac{1}{4}$  R to face partner and wall, take momentary Butterfly pos, M's back twd COH.

9-12 Circle Away; 2, 3, Flare; Together, 2, 3, Touch (to Butterfly); Vine, 2, 3, Touch; Wrap, 2, 3, Touch (face Out); Releasing M's L and W's R hands, push gently against M's R and W's L as partners turn away from each other in a small circle with 3 steps, starting M's L ft, to other, flare R ft around in a CW arc while making a half-circle and face away from each other, flare R ft around in a CW arc while pivoting slightly on L ft; complete the full circle by stepping swd in LOD on L ft, step R ft on R ft XIB of L, step again swd in LOD on L ft, touch R toe beside L ft; as M moves in RLOD by stepping swd twd RLOD on R ft, closing L ft to R, stepping again swd R on R ft in RLOD and holding 1 ct (continuing to face wall); W makes a  $\frac{1}{2}$  L turn, keeping both hands joined and turning under her R and M's L arms with 3 steps L-R-L, and touches R toe beside L ft, ending in a standard "wrapped" pos with both facing the wall;

13-16 Unwrap, 2, 3, Touch (face); Change Sides, 2, 3, Touch (to Butterfly); Side, Touch, Side, Touch; Change Sides, -, 2, -1 - (to Semi-Closed); M remains facing wall as he steps L-R-L in place and touches R toe beside L ft, while W "unwraps" by turning  $\frac{1}{4}$  R out in front of M with 3 steps, L-R-L and touches L toe beside R ft, ending with partners facing at arm's length, M's back twd COH, M's R and W's L hands joined; start R ft and take 3 steps to change sides with partner, W turning L face under joined arms, touch L toe beside R ft while taking Butterfly pos with M's back twd wall; step to L side in RLOD on L ft, touch R toe beside L ft, step to R side in LOD on R ft, touch L toe beside R ft; start L ft and take 2 slow steps to again change sides with partner, W turning L face under joined hands, ending in Semi-Closed pos facing LOD, ready to repeat the dance;

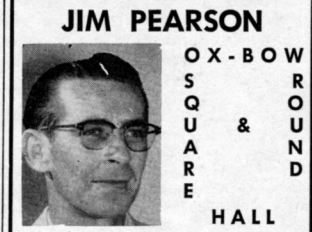

## Square of the Month for July:

## March Wind

LATEST in a line of March Wind numbers —March Wind No. 3—by Ed Newton of Sarasota, was selected as Bow & SWING's Square of the Month for July. Note that in any of the March Wind figures you can fold the girls, star thru, girls hook right, go four in line, once round. This will not basically change the positions.

One and three go forward and back Square thru in the middle of the track Go all way around, when you get thru Circle up four with the outside two One full turn, don't cut it short The inside couple "rip and snort" Pull 'em all thru and line up four Forward eight and back once more Now pass thru and fold the men Star thru, men hook left, go four in line One full turn and keep in time Bend the line and hook the goat across from you Change girls, Allemande left.

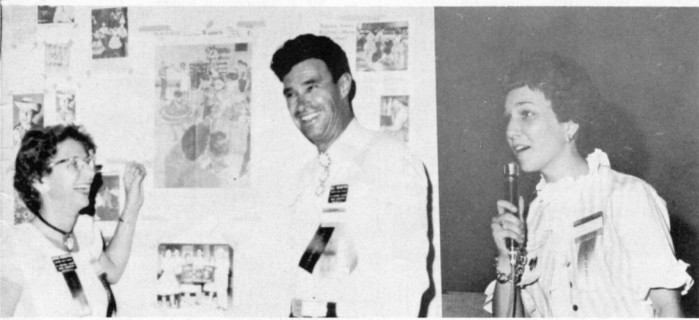

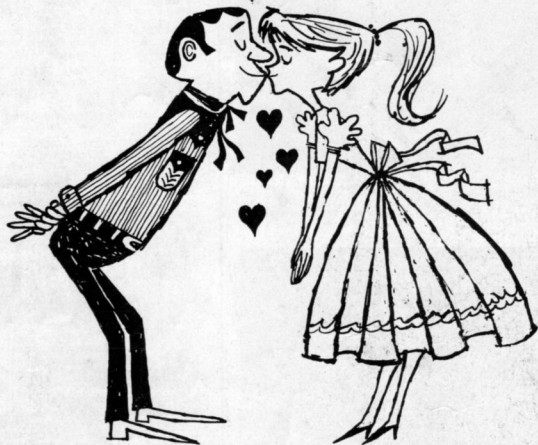
