

National Puts Spotlight on Rounds

ROUND DANCING at the 11th National Square Dance Convention will be an integral part of the overall planning and will offer continuous round dancing—or workshops or clinics relating to the subject from 1 until 11:30 p.m. Thursday, 10 a.m. to 11:30 p.m. on Friday and Saturday.

Highlight in the daily round dance schedule is the evening round dance in the combined ballrooms starting at 8:00 p.m., according to Clare and Fran Malhot, round dance chairmen for the June 14-16 event. To be programmed in the evening are those rounds which are workshopped during the day.

An innovation in round dance programming at the National will be the preview session prior to each session of the workshops, so that dancers may choose which workshop they wish to attend, Malhot says.

A Trail's End Round Dance Party in the diLido ballroom is set for Wednesday, June 13, beginning at 8 o'clock. Members of the Round Dance Council of Florida will conduct the party.

Round dancing will be done in the East and West Ballrooms of the giant Miami Beach Convention Hall, providing some 24,000 square feet of dancing area. Two ballrooms are combined into one for the evening dance.

Rounds to be used between tips during square dances at the 11th National square dance sessions include these listed by Paul and Delight Trent: Sleepy Time Gal, Pazzo Pazzo, Bye Bye Blues, Happy Pair, Clarinet Capers, Kon Tiki, Rainier Waltz, Silk and Satin, Yogi, King of the Mountain, Lady Be Good, Blue Hours, When Lights are Low,

Brower Slates Three Florida Dances

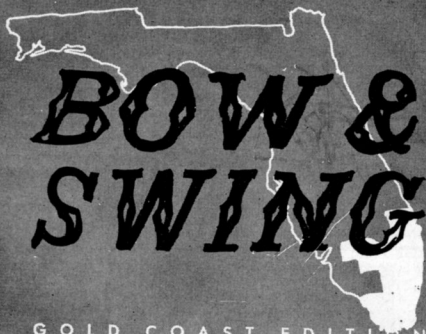
ONE MORE month! Hot topic among square and round dancers this month is who's going, and when, to the 11th National. Activities on the May calendar should serve to spark additional enthusiasm in the big show.

Traveling caller Jim Brower swings into Florida for three engagements in May. The first is Melbourne's Trailer Haven on May 25 sponsored by the Brevard Dancers—Allemanders, Satellites, Canaveral Squares and Harbor City Squares. Brower is then due at the Lakeland Civic Center on May 30 under Buttons and Bows' sponsorship. The following evening, May 31, the Dixie Squares of Daytona Beach have Jim booked for the City Island Recreation Center.

On May 26, the Central Florida Association slates their annual Election Ball at the Sanford Civic Center with Joe Curtis as emcee. The same evening, in Lake City, finds the Tri-City club sponsoring an open dance with Bill Camp and Dick Gonzales handling the calls.

For the roving dancer, Fontana's Swap Shop, started April 28, continues thru May 6. The Spring Fun Fest at the North Carolina resort begins a four-day run on May 24. In Shreveport, Louisiana, the Holiday in Dixie Square Dance Festival is slated for the Municipal Auditorium on May 5, and up Toronto, Canada, way the three-day Square Dance Convention has a May 17 start at the Royal York Hotel.

Convention committeemen have little time to dance this month. Miami Beach meetings are slated for statewide committees on May 1, final meeting of all committee chairmen on May 6.

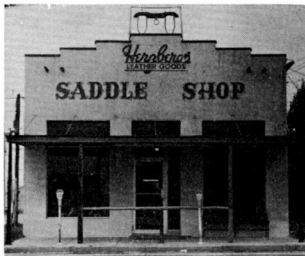

WHEN the Saints Go Marching In, originated by Andy Andrus of Port Arthur, Texas, was selected as Bow & SWING's Square of the Month. The Blue Star record (1590) has music by The Texans and the call goes like this:

Intro: Break: Ending:
Allemande left and Allemande thar,
 go right and left and make a star.
Gents back up and make a right hand star
Shoot that star go full around, partner

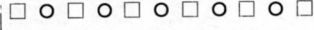

Round of the Month for May:

Travelers Two Step

If YOU HAVE Yogi you have the record for May's Round of the Month, Travelers Two Step, says Bob Waites, Round Dance Council coordinator, in announcing the selection of May's square dance round. "It can be taught in about twenty minutes."

Dance is done to music of Bill Black's Combo on Hi 45-2036 "Old Buttermilk Sky," was written by Marie and Harold Loess and Joan and Johnnie Johnson of North Riverside, Ill. Dance starts in facing position, man's back to center of hall, in butterfly position; footwork is postitive:

Intro: Wait 7 pickup notes

DANCE

1-4 Side, Behind, Side, Pivot; Side, Behind, Side, Step, Behind, Step, (Away); Step, Behind, Step, (Together); Step side L in LOD; cross R behind L, step side L, pivot on L to bk-to-bk pos bringing trailing hands fwd; Step side R in LOD, cross L behind R, step side R, hold 1 ct; Turning away from ptr in a small circle step fwd L, close R to L placing R slightly behind L heel, step fwd L, hold 1 Step fwd R, close R to L placing L slightly behind R heel, step fwd R, hold; (These steps are done in a Rocking Motion on the order of the "Stroke Step" in Rock N Roll or the "Limp Step"); End in Butterfly pos M's bk to COH.

5-8 Step, Swing, Step, Swing; Away, Swing, Together, Touch, Fwd, 2, 3, Touch; Reverse Fwd, 2, 3, Touch; Step side L in Lod, swing R XIF of L twd LOD, keeping knee bent & toe not more than 2 inches from the floor, step side R in RLOD, swing L XIF of R twd RLOD in the same manner; Assume Open-pos facing LOD & step side L twd COH, swing R XIF of L twd COH, step R twd ptr turning to face the ptr & touch L beside R; As M grapevines to his L, W does a RT twirl RLR touch; As M grapevines to his R, W does a LF twirl LRL touch;

9-16 Repeat Meas 1-8—ending in Semi-Closed pos facing LOD.

17-20 Fdw Two-Step; Fwd Two-Step; Cut Bk, 2, 3, 4; Away, Tch, Together, Tch; Starting M's L do 2 fwd twos in L in LOD, step L in front of R, & step thru twd RLOD, step straight bk on R, with feet still crossed step bk on L, bk on R; Step side L twd COH, tch R beside L, step R twd ptr & tch L ending in semi-closed pos facing LOD.

21-24 Repeat Meas 17-20—ending in Butterfly-pos M's bk to COH.
Sequence: Dance thru twice then dance Meas 1-8 and Tag.
Tag: Dance Meas 1-2 Face Partner, Step apart and Bow.

A correction is sent for measures 17-20 of Yogi, last month's round of the month:

17-20 Rock, Turn, Step/Close, Step; Turn, Step, Step/Close, Step; Rock, Step, Step/Close, Step; Facing RLOD, in-side hands M twd R, step fwd on L, step in place on R, pivoting 1/2 LF to LOD (join inside hands) M step/close, step (LRL); (drop hands) M step fwd on R, pivoting 1/2 LF to RLOD, step in place on L, (join inside hands) step/close, step (RLR) (W opposite) M rock fwd on L, step in place on R, step bk on L, close R almost to L, step bk on L; M Rock bk on R (M raises his L & W's R hand so W can go under) step in place on L, step fwd on R, close L almost to R, step fwd on R; (Meas 19-20 are different for W) W rock fwd on R, step in place on L, pivoting 1/2 RF to LOD, then step/close step (RLR), W, step in place on R, then step/close, step (LRL) in RLOD;
