Jack Jackson to Call; Workshops Run All Day

JACK JACKSON, who made such a hit at the Knothead Konvention, is the headline attraction at the N.E. Florida Square Dancer's Association Annual Fall Roundup scheduled for November 10, 1962 in Jacksonville.

Morning and afternoon programs of square dancing are to be handled by area and guest callers. Ruth Bartley and Bob Waites of Gainesville will conduct a Round Dance Workshop from 7:00 to 8:00 p.m. and this will be followed by the evening dance to be called by Jack Jackson.

All dancing will be held in Jacksonville's new City Exhibition Hall located on the St. Johns River in the downtown area. The hall is air conditioned and is conveniently near hotels, restaurants and there is plenty of parking available in the city parking lot next door. The Exhibition Hall has 20,000 square feet of clear dancing area so there will plenty of room for all comers.

You can dance all day for only \$1.25 per person or if desired advance sale tickets can be obtained now for only \$1.00 per person.

Football fans are reminded that November 10th is also the date of the Georgia-Florida football game in the Gator Bowl so all of them can see the game and

Five Couples Named to Staff of Holiday for Rounds, November 24

FIVE COUPLES are on the staff for Holiday for Rounds, the all-day institute on Nov. 24, and Al and Flo Tomlinson of Tampa will present a novelty medley at the intermission of the evening dance, according to program information announced by Gene Baylis of Miami.

The evening dance, in the city auditorium, will include alternating tips of three rounds and two squares, with members of the Round Dance Council of Florida doing the calling.

Sunday morning will be devoted to the annual meeting of the Council with election of officers.

The workshop sessions during the morning and afternoon will be held in the Fort Harrison ballroom. Beginning at 9 a.m., Paul and Delight Trent of Tampa will handle a workshop session, followed by an interlude of demonstrations. Then comes a workshop session conducted by Art and Dorothy Brammeier of Melbourne, and an interlude of Square dancing.

Final session will be handled by Randall and Mabel Davis of Leesburg with demonstrations concluding the morning program.

In the afternoon, the same pattern will be followed, with Gene and Ima Baylis presenting the first workshop, and Harold and Myrtle Eicher of Sarasota presenting the last workshop. The mid-afternoon interlude will be devoted to mixers.

Registration for the 1962 Holiday for Rounds will be \$1.00 per session (morning, afternoon, or evening) per person, or \$2.00 per person for the entire day, according to Council Secretary Bob Waites.

The evening program includes round dance requests prior to the main dance.

It is anticipated that some provision for dancing on Friday evening will be made for early registrants.

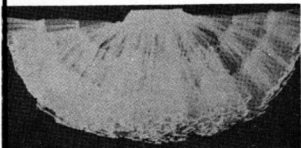

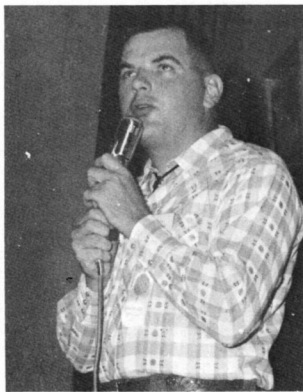

Lane New President of North East Fla. Dancers

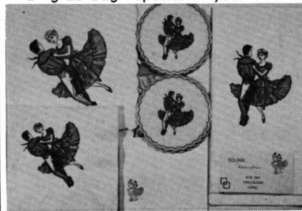

Roundup of Square Dance Events for November:

Post-Thanksgiving Activity at Ft. Myers, Clearwater, Sarasota

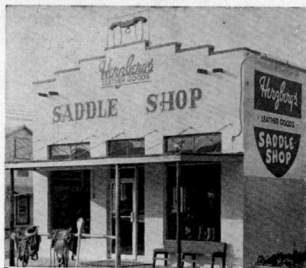

Round of the Month for November:

Maple Leaf Rag

THE ROUND of the Month selected for November is Maple Leaf Rag on Windsor No. 4677. Composers of the dance are Al and Mary Brudage of Westport, Connecticut.

The introduction starts in open position, facing LOD. The dance is in semi-closed position and the footwork is opposite throughout. Round Dance Coordinator Bob Waites of Gainesville states that this dance should be a good one for square dancers because there are no turning two steps and the routine is rather short.

Introduction (4 meas)

Meas:

1-4 Wait; Wait; Walk Fwd; 2; 3, 4 (to Semi-Closed); Wait 2 meas; Start L ft & walk 4 steps fwd in LOD with light strutting steps in Semi-Closed pos facing LOD;

DANCE

1-4 Point Fwd, Point Bwd; Fwd Two-Step; Point Fwd, Point Bwd; Fwd Two-Step; In Semi-Closed pos, point L ft fwd in LOD, point L ft fwd in RLOD looking over L shoulder (W over R) start L ft to two-step in LOD; repeat, starting M's R ft & looking over R shoulder (W over L);

5-8 Apart, Draw; Together. (to Butterfly) Touch: Roll 2; 3, 4 (to Semi-Closed); Releasing lead hands M steps swd on L twd COH (W twd wall to Open pos) Draw R ft to L; step twd ptr on R ft turning to face in Butterfly-pos M's bk twd COH, tch L ft to R; swing trailing hands fwd ptrs roll away from each other progressing LOD making 1 complete turn in 4 steps (M turning LF & W RF) ending in Semi-Closed pos facing LOD;

9-12 Fwd Two-Step; Fwd Two-Step; Turn Away; 2, Together, 2 (to Semi-Closed); Do 2 two-steps fwd in LOD; using strutting bounce steps ptrs circle away from each other M twd COH & W twd wall returning to ptr in 4 steps L,R; L, R ending in Semi-Closed pos;

13-16 Repeat Action of Meas 9-12 ending in Open-pos slightly apart facing LOD;

17-20 Step Fwd, Point Fwd; Step Bwd, Point Bwd; Fwd Two-Step; Fwd Two-Step; Step fwd in LOD on L ft, point R ft fwd; step fwd in RLOD on R ft, point L ft fwd (these 2 meas may be done as a Charleston L ft & W twd wall to ptr in 4 steps L,R; L, R ending in Semi-Closed pos);

21-24 Repeat Action of Meas 17-20 end in Open-pos facing LOD;

25-28 Step, Kick; (turn in) Step, Kick; (face) Swd Two-Step; Swd Two-Step; Step fwd in LOD on L ft, kick R ft fwd; swing R ft fwd at same time turning in twd ptr 1/2 R & changing hands to face RLOD in Left-Open pos step fwd in RLOD on R ft, kick L ft fwd; swing L ft fwd turning in 1/2 L, L to face ptr & joining both hands (M's bk twd COH) do 1 two-step swd in LOD; repeat swd R in RLOD releasing hands & placing them on own knees;

29-32 Bend, Chug; Bend, Chug; Walk; 2; 3, 4 (to Semi-Closed); Keeping knees together bend & turn them slightly to the L, straighten knees & chug bwd away from ptr on both feet (M twd COH and W twd wall); repeat turning knees to R, chug fwd again; walk diag fwd twd ptr in 4 steps L, R; L, R; to end in Semi-Closed pos;

Perform entire dance a total of three times

ENDING

1-4 Point Fwd, Point Bwd; Fwd Two-Step; Point Fwd, Point Bwd; Face, Chug; Repeat action of meas 1-3 of dance; turn to face ptr placing wgt on both feet, chug bwd away from ptr (M twd COH).

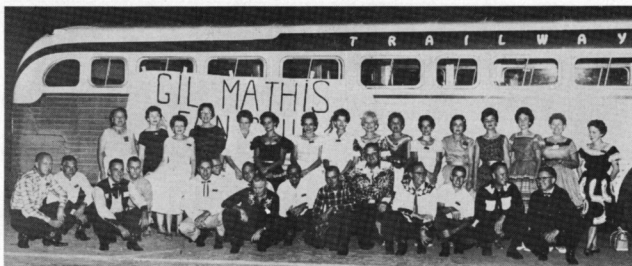
