

# Ruff to Lead Callers Clinic In Orlando October 19, 20

## Dancer Federation Annual Meeting in Orlando, Oct. 20

FLORIDA'S FEDERATION of Square Dancers will hold its annual meeting in Orlando's Angelt Hotel on Saturday, October 20, it is announced by Chairman Harry Edwards of Gainesville.

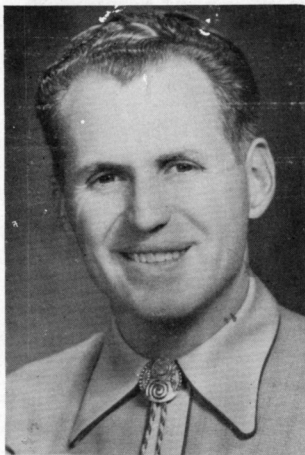
Presidents and secretaries as well as designated delegates from affiliated associations throughout the state have been notified that the old board will meet at 10 a.m., and the new board will meet at 2 p.m. Both meetings are set for the Citrus Room.

Other officers of the federation include Wesley Lawson of Winter Haven, vice president, Al Cody of Kissimmee, secretary and J. Warriner (Hink) Smith of St. Petersburg, treasurer.

## Callers Annual Meeting is Set For Sunday

BOB RUFF of Whittier, California, will direct the annual callers' clinic in conjunction with the annual meeting of the Florida Callers Association in the Angelt Hotel, Orlando, October 19-21, it is announced by Jay Fenimore, president of the callers' association.

Of interest to the dancing public is a jamboree in the newly-air-conditioned municipal auditorium on Saturday night featuring Ruff and under sponsorship of the Orlando Western Square Dance Council.

Ruff will conduct clinic sessions from 2-5 p.m. Friday and Saturday, October 19 and 20 in the Angelt Sky Room. Friday evening will be party night for those attending the callers meeting.

Election of officers will be on the agenda for the annual meeting on Sunday, Oct. 21.

Registration for the clinic is restricted to members of the association or to callers whose application for membership has been received.

Ruff told Bow & Swing theme of the clinic will be "square dance leadership." Some of the related subjects will include the callers' responsibility to the movement, relationship of the basic movements to the new material, the caller and the club organization and the future of square dancing.

"I will demonstrate teaching techniques and present a plan for the better instruction of square dance classes," he said, "and also attempt to define a successful caller."

Ruff and his wife, Babs, have been active in square and round dancing since 1948 when they started with Lloyd Shaw's cowboy dances and Cliffie Stone's album of hoedowns. He conducted classes under adult education in Los Angeles. During fourteen years he has graduated several thousand people into the world of square dance fun and fellowship, has served on staffs of camps and institutes such as Asilomar, Banff, Totemland, Hi-Sierra and Interlochen, Michigan.

Bob has been featured at festivals throughout the western states and Canada.

Bob has recorded a series of long-play albums for the student dancer on Sets-in-Order label, of which the most recent is a series on the basic movements. He calls for six clubs regularly and is a member of the Southern California Callers Association. He was a member of the training committee that published the association's training manual for newer callers.

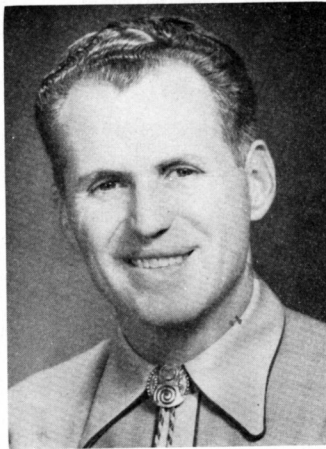

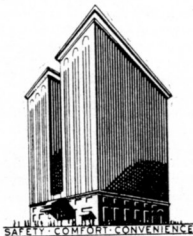

# CALLERS' SYLLABUS

Edited by ROGER CHAPMAN

THE HOOK AROUND ONE is a new figure presented by Jim Rice of Melbourne which is explained this way: When two people are active and meet, they walk right shoulder around each other and face back the way they came, when one person is inactive, the active person walks right shoulder around the inactive and faces back. Here are five examples:

## EXAMPLE NO. 1

Head couples pass through, around one to a line  
Shuffle the deck, Girls "Hook around one." / To the corner, a left allemande.

## EXAMPLE NO. 2

Four ladies grand chain  
Heads square through, "Hook around the sides" to a line of four  
Go Forward up and back / Girls left square through, men pass through, turn back  
Square through three quarters around to a left allemande

## EXAMPLE NO. 3

Girls right and left through / Pass through, do a single wheel  
Girls "Hook around one", hey down the middle / Men pass left, follow the girl  
Girls pass left, follow the man / Men pass left, follow the girl  
Girls pass left and swing partner

## EXAMPLE NO. 4

Take corners and promenade / One and three wheel around, pass through  
Do a single wheel, double pass through, girls stop  
Men, "Hook around one" to an ocean wave, balance  
Box the gnat, change hands, left allemande

## EXAMPLE NO. 5

Promenade single file, men turn back, meet partner  
"Hook around one" go other way (men on inside)  
Meet again, "Hook around one" go other way (men on outside)  
Meet partner, star through, left allemande

Odd Ball and The Missile Twister are two more submitted by Caller Rice:

## ODD BALL by Jim Rice

Heads half promenade, side ladies chain / Heads to right and circle four  
Heads break to a line of four / Pass through, wheel and deal  
Center four do-si-do to an ocean wave, balance / Quarter right "Hey down the middle"  
Men pass left, follow the girls / Girls pass left, follow the men  
Men pass left, follow the girls / Girls pass left and swing (your partner)

## THE MISSILE TWISTER by Jim Rice

Head ladies chain to the right / Side ladies chain, Heads half square through  
Split sides to a line of four / Center four cross trail, ends turn back,  
Walk to the corner, Left allemande

And George Hales of Hialeah comes through with this interesting item:

## WHAT'S MY NUMBER?

Two and three, do a right and left thru / One and two, you circle up four  
Head gent break, make a line of four / Number three, here's what you do  
Split that line and pass on thru / Circle up four, you're doin fine  
Head gent break, and make a line / Go up to the middle and back with you  
Go forward again, do a right and left thru / Cross trail back and look out man  
Here comes the corner . . . left allemande . . .

Sugar Blues Mixer

ROUND OF THE Month selection for October is Sugar Blues Mixer. The dance was composed by Dot 'n' Date Foster of Decatur, Illinois, and is done to SIO Record No. 3132. Start is made in open position and the footwork is opposite throughout.

Meas.  
 1-4 Wait 2 meas: APART, —, TCH, —; TOG (to banjo), —, TCH, —; Starting open position facing LOD, inside hands joined, step apart, (M's L W's R), —, tch, — together, —, tch, W turning 1/2 L face to assume BANJO pos (R hips).

DANCE  
 1-4 FWD, 2, 3, HOLD; FWD, 2, 3, TURN; BACK UP, 2, 3, HOLD; BACK, 2, 3, TURN; In BANJO pos dance fwd in LOD L, R, L, hold; fwd again R, L, R, turn on R 1/2 R face to face RL OD (W 1/2 L to face LOD) to SIDECAR pos (L hips); continuing in LOD, M backs up (W fwd) L, R, L, hold; back again, R, L, R, turn on R 1/2 L face (W 1/2 L face face RLOD) to BANJO pos facing LOD.

5-8 FWD, 2, 3, HOLD; FWD, 2, 3, FACE; Repeat action of meas 1-4 EXCEPT floating away on last step to cut, facing partner approx. 3 ft. apart, drop hands.

9-12 VINE, 2, 3, TAP; VINE, 2, 3, TAP; HEEL OUT, IN, OUT, IN; STEP, SNAP, STEP, SNAP; Vine along LOD stepping to side on L, behind on R, side on L, tap R ft in place; Repeat in RLOD; stepping to side on R, behind on L, side on R, tap ball of L ft slightly to the side; Twist L heel (W's R) out, then, in, out, then in, (side is still on supporting foot) (M's R W's R) on ct, on ct 2 bend knee (M's R W's L) raising toe about 6 inches from floor and pointed down and at the same time lean slightly fwd dropping hands and snapping fingers. Repeat stepping fwd on M's R (W's L) on ct 3, and knee up on ct 4.

13-16 VINE, 2, 3, TAP; VINE, 2, 3, TAP; HEEL OUT, IN, OUT, IN; STEP, SNAP, STEP, SNAP; Repeat action of Meas 9-12, EXCEPT partners should float away slightly on first vine to approx 3 ft apart.

17-18 AWAY, 2, 3, TAP; TO NEW PARTNER, 2, 3, TAP; Back away from partner (M fwd COH W fwd wall) in 3 steps L, R, L, tap R (W, R, L, R, tap L); then with 3 steps and a tap move diag fwd in LOD (W fwd RLOD) to new partner W turning 1/4 L face to assume BANJO pos to start dance again).

DANCE GOES THRU 4 TIMES

ENDING: As M vines LOD and RLOD, W makes a slow twirl R under her R and L in 3 steps and a tch, then a reverse twirl (L face) in 3 steps, tch, BOW and CURTESY.

Opener: Middle Break; Closer: (Come on and) Docey corners one and all, join hands,  
 Join hands and circle round that hall . . .  
 Your partner left, do pass around my friend . . .  
 Your corner right, Partner left don't take all night,  
 And then those four-ladies chain-grain chain, Turn 'em boys, chain 'em back a roll  
 "romenade" . . .  
 A roll promenade . . . take a walk with your maid, if you don't want swing 'er, then I'll know you're afraid,  
 C'mon and docey corners one and all, Swing your own.  
 Swing with tootsie 'till she falls . . .  
 Figure: (Well now those) Heads square through four heads you do . . .  
 And with the sides Half square through, pull 'em through  
 You bend the line, Star through, and Eight 'em through  
 E'gin' chain through from where you stand, all the way  
 Come on again go all the way back you do . . .  
 And when you're through swing corner Sue, 'She's facing you,  
 Left All-around you know, come on back Do-Sa-Do Back to back and romenade that pretty lady home, A singing  
 Toot Toot Tootsie Don't cry . . .  
 Toot Toot Tootsie Goodbye . . .  
 Sequence:  
 Heads, Heads, Middle break, Sides, Sides, Closer,  
 Tag Ending—Toot Toot Tootsie You're Mine.
