

Plenty of Activity for September

KICKED OFF with a flurry of Labor Day events for Florida square dancers, the September calendar reveals a warming up for the fall season with two special weeks at Fontana, N.C., and a three-day holiday at Jekyll Island, Georgia on tap.

At month's end the Daytona Beachcombers and Central Florida Square Dancers Association will host two days of dancing and workshops.

Ed and Kay Mack of Clearwater will handle rounds with Al and Millie Boehringer of Dayton, O., at the Fontana Fun Fest, September 5-9. More than a dozen Florida couples are lined up for the Fontana Swap Shop starting Oct. 29, but Fontana reports some Florida applicants are among the 90 still on the Swap Shop waiting list.

The Jekyll Holiday weekends are planned semi-annually, in September and March, with a package deal including accommodations at the Holiday Inn and squares and rounds by a staff of callers and instructors from Georgia and the Carolinas.

Square dance demonstrations will be featured at Parkwood Plaza in Orlando, Sept. 13-15, under the direction of the Orlando Recreational Department. Joe Curtis will call, members of the Orlando clubs will assist, and it is hoped to interest enrollment in the department's new series of classes scheduled to begin Sept. 18

The program includes square and round dancing, workshops, after-parties, "gags, fellowship and fun."

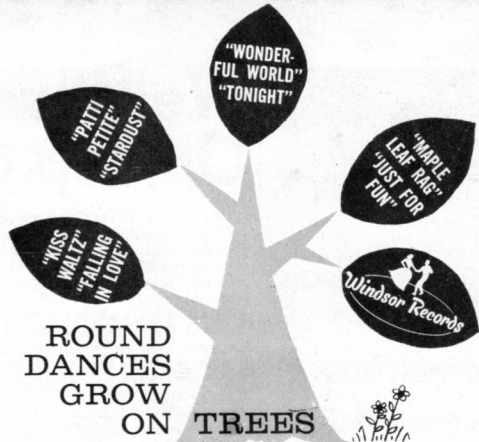

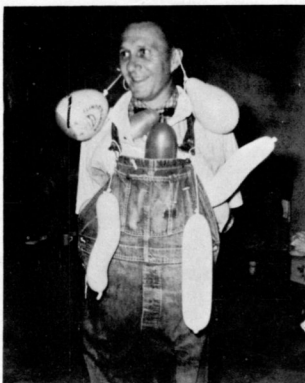

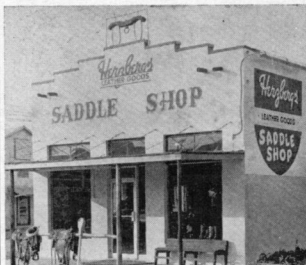

CALLERS' SYLLABUS

Edited by ROGER CHAPMAN

(Florida callers are invited to send tested figures and breaks direct to Roger Chapman at 3137 Walnut Street, Winter Haven, for publication in this edition of Bow & Swing; subscriptions to this special edition are available with subscriber membership to Florida Callers Association at \$3.00 per year. Write for application form to Bow & Swing, Box 531, Kissimmee, Florida)

Here's a little dance, sent in by George Hales of Hialeah, that could prove to be just the thing for teaching Forearm Swings as well as positioning in your classes:

Number One Gent, Turn the Right Hand Lady with the Left Hand Round, Partner Left, with the Left Hand Round / Opposite Lady with the Right Hand Round, Partner Left, with the Left Hand Round / Corner Lady with the Right Hand Round, Partner Left, Roll Promenade / Repeat for Number Two Gent, etc. Repeat for Number One and Three Gents / Repeat for Number Two and Four Gents.

And here's the second part:

All Four Gents, Turn the Right Hand Lady with the Right Hand Round, Star by the Left, go Half Around / Turn the Corner Lady with the Right Hand Round, Star by the Left, Three Quarters Round, Turn the Opposite Lady with the Right Hand Round, Star by the Left, One Half Around . . .

1. Partner Right, Go Right and Left Grand . . .
2. Partner Right, Corner Left, Left Allemande . . .
3. Partner Right, Box the Gnat, Pull By, Allemande . . .
4. Partner Right, Catch All Eight, Her by the Right, Go Half About, Her by the Left, Like an Allemande Thar . . .

For callers that are interested in sight calling, here are a few items sent in by Bill Muench of Tampa:

A. One and Three, Box the Gnat / Pass Thru, go Around One, Into the Middle, Box the Gnat / Pass Thru, Square Thru, the Sides Count Four Hands, Two Lines Face Out, California Twirl.

(Note, check the situation and hash yourself out of it, this one is easy.)

B. Head Ladies Chain Right / New Head Ladies Chain Across, One and Three, Half Square Thru / Circle Four, Head Man Break—Pass Thru, Bend the Line / Pass Thru, Bend the Line / Pass Thru, Bend the Line.

(Note, this one is a little harder; check the situation and hash out.)

C. Heads, Square Thru / Eight Chain Thru (patter) / Star Thru—Bend the Line, Star Thru, Eight Chain Four (patter) / Right and Left Thru, Star Thru, Bend the Line, Star Thru, Eight Chain Six (patter) Star Thru . . .

(Note, Hash out.) Bill calls these Hash Gimmicks. This type of thing can be very helpful to callers if they notice the positioning of the dancers.

Mississippi Shuffle

Bob & SWING'S Round of the Month for September is Mississippi Shuffle, for which the dance routine was done by Roberta and Bob Van Antwerp of Long Beach, California. Music is on MacGregor 927-A and dance starts with introduction in open-facing position. Footwork is opposite throughout:

Intro:
Wait Two Meas Apart, Point, —; Together (To Butterfly) —, Tch, —; In Open-Facing Pos, M's bk to COH, step bk on L, —, point R toe fwd ptr & floor, —; Step fwd on R, —, Tch L toe beside R foot & assume Butterfly Pos, M's bk to COH, —;

Meas:

1-4 Side, Close, Side, —; Point (Open Pos), —; Tch (Butterfly), —; Side Close, Side, —; Point (Rev Open), —, Tch (R-hand Star), —; (1) Prog LOD, start M's L & dance one sideward 2-step; (2) Keep wt on L & turn to face LOD in Open Pos as you point L toe fwd to floor, —, wt still on L face partner to assume Butterfly Pos, M's bk to COH & tch R toe beside L, —; (3) Prog RLOD, start M's R & dance one sideward 2-step; (4) Keep wt on R & turn to face LOD in Reverse Open Pos as you point L toe fwd to floor, —, wt still on R turn to R-Hand Star with M facing wall & tch L toe —; (NOTE: Blend from 2-steps into points.)

5-8 Two-Step Around; Two-Step Turn (To L-Hand Star); Two-Step Around (To L-Hand Star); (5 & 6) Making circle-pattern both moving fwd, dance two 2-steps half around so M is facing COH & spot-turn on last step of Meas 6 to assume L-Hand Star, M facing wall, W facing COH; (7 & 8) Repeat circle-pattern to end in Open Pos both facing LOD;

9-12 Fwd Two-Step; Point/Fwd, —, Point/Bk, —; Fwd Two-Step; Point/Fwd, —, Tch, —; (To Closed) (9) Prog LOD dance one fwd two-step; (10) Keep wt on L & point R toe fwd to floor (lean bk slightly as you point), —, point R toe bk (lean slightly fwd as you point), —; (11 & 12) Repeat Meas 9 & 10 starting M's R except on last 2 cts of Meas 12, face ptr & tch L toe beside R foot assuming Closed Pos M's bk to COH;

13-16 Two-Step Turn; Two-Step Turn (To Half Open); Walk, —, 2, —, 3, —, 4, —; (To Closed) (13-14) Prog LOD dance two R-Face turning two steps to end in Half-Open Pos both facing LOD; (15 & 16) Walk fwd 4 steps LRLR in a slight "Charleston" style by keeping knees together & kicking heel bk & out before stepping directly in front of other foot, alternating leg for the 4 steps (Use caution not to be too exuberant when using inside feet so as to avoid kicking ptr), to end in Closed Pos M's bk to COH;

17-20 Two-Step Turn; Two-Step Turn (To Half-Open); Walk, —, 2, —, 3, —, 4, —; (To Semi-Closed) Repeat action of Meas 13-16 except end in Semi-Closed Pos facing LOD;

21-24 Rock/Fwd, —, Rock/Bk, —; Shuffle-Rock-Away; Rock/Fwd, —, Rock/Bk, —; Shuffle-Rock-Together (To Closed Pos); (21) Rock fwd LOD stepping L across in front of R, —, keep L leg crossed in front as you rock bk in RLOD on R, —; (22) Release ptr as M moves fwd COH (by twd wall). Keep knees straight as with rocking motion & small steps — rock L to side, rock R behind L, rock L to side, make face diag (by twd wall) & end; (23) Rock fwd LOD stepping R across in front of L (this turns ptrs slightly bk to bk & maintain facing this direction to last step of Meas 24), —, rock bk in RLOD on L, —; (24) Move twd ptr with "Shuffle-Rock" starting M's R turn to face ptr on last step & assume Closed Pos;

25-26 Two-Step Turn; Two-Step Turn; (To Semi-Closed) Prog LOD dance two R-Face turning two steps to end Semi-Closed Pos, both facing LOD;

27-32 Repeat Action of Meas 21-26, except end in Butterfly Pos, M's bk to COH, to repeat entire dance.

Dance goes through three times plus ending.
Ending:
Turn Away, —, 2, —, 3, —, 4, — B & C (2 measures) Making small circle pattern, release ptr & turn away (M — L-face, W — R-face) with 4 walking steps LRLR, join M's R & W's L hands for Bow & Curtsy.
