Squares and rounds are programmed, with the first session starting at 2:30 p.m. on Saturday, August 31. "It will be a duzy!" states Ox Bow proprietor Jim Pearson.


St. Paul Convention **Draws 67 Floridians**



State Tax May Hit Square Dance Clubs

How the recent legislature's extension of the sales tax will affect square dance activities did not seem to be completely clear as Bow & SWING went to press.

The Florida Revenue Commission notice on the subject pointed out the section of the tax (212.02(16) defining "admissions" was amended to expand tax coverage to the privilege of viewing or participating in all types of amusement, sport or recreation, show, game or exhibition, including green fees, all dues paid to private clubs providing recreational facilities, x x x but specifically excluding civic, fraternal, and religious clubs and organizations.

While this is obviously intended to provide tax revenue from membership fees to golf and country clubs, etc., how this will affect square dancing will depend on how the law is administered. If it is going to cover dues and contributions made to hobby-type square dance clubs, each club must register with the state and report monthly its taxable and non-taxable sales.
