

Knoheads Book Jackson to Call Labor Day Dance

AS A FAREWELL to summer—or perhaps a prelude to fall—square dancing in Florida brims with variety during August. Bow & Swing's roundup spots six traveling callers this month, and several "spectacular" dances are programmed through the state.

The Labor Day weekend will be a "labor of love" for square dancers as big events are booked at Clearwater, St. Petersburg and Sanford.

At Clearwater, the Florida Knoheads will stage their annual convention August 31-September 1-2. Both rounds and squares are programmed, and Jack Jackson of Columbus, Ohio, is the featured caller. Convention headquarters is the Jack Tar Harrison Hotel.

"Because so many new dance routines are using the Latin rhythm, a special workshop featuring basic steps of the rumba and samba is planned for one afternoon, and will be conducted by Bill Cascio and Hazel Bennett of Miami," reports Kay Mack of Clearwater. General chairman of the convention is Jim Gallo-way of Lutz. A trail dance is set for August 30 at Clearwater under auspices of the West Coast Association.

Ed Newton, Roger Chapman, Jim Pearson and Clare & Fran Malhiot have a "spectacular" dance planned for Ox Bow Hall in St. Petersburg during the three day Labor Day weekend. Squares and rounds are programmed, with the first session starting at 2:30 p.m. on Saturday, August 31. "It will be a duzy!" states Ox Bow proprietor Jim Pearson.

At Sanford on August 31, the Starlight Promenaders have booked Bob Rust of Daytona Beach for an open dance at the Civic Center Annex. The dance is planned to start at 8:00 p.m.

Dusty Randall of Amarillo, Texas, is

booked for Saturday, August 3, at Leesburg with the Happy Hoedowners club in the sponsoring role. The dance will be held at the armory. The Texan is also due to call at 10th Street Auditorium,

St. Paul Convention Draws 67 Floridians

SIXTY-SEVEN Florida square dancers registered at St. Paul, Minnesota, for the 12th National Square Dance Convention.

Art and Dorothy Brammeier of Melbourne report that the Florida contingent represented all areas of the state, including the cities of Titusville, Naples, Melbourne, Tallahassee, Sarasota, Jensen Beach, Eau Gallie, Melbourne Beach, Jacksonville and Tice. 28 dancers gathered at the special Florida dinner held in the St. Paul Hotel.

The Brammeiers, who were among the convention round dance leaders, began the R/D workshop session by teaching Hi Lili Hi Lo. An estimated 150 couples learned the dance in the four complete circles inside the dance hall. The dance has already been named a Dance of the Month for California.

"Cool, dry weather greeted the dancers as they arrived in St. Paul," writes Dorothy Brammeier. "All rooms were naturally air conditioned—to the extent that the windows had to be closed to keep the 51 degree temperatures outside!"

A square dance demonstration and party will be provided for the Florida Family Campers association gathering in November at Moss Park, if present plans materialize, Mrs. Debes said.



State Tax May Hit Square Dance Clubs

HOW THE recent legislature's extension of the sales tax will affect square dance activities did not seem to be completely clear as **BOW & SWING** went to press.

The Florida Revenue Commission notice on the subject pointed out the section of the tax (212.02(16) defining "admissions" was amended to expand tax coverage to the privilege of viewing or participating in all types of amusement, *sport or recreation*, show, game or exhibition, including green fees, *all dues paid to private clubs providing recreational facilities*, x x x but specifically excluding civic, fraternal, and religious clubs and organizations.

While this is obviously intended to provide tax revenue from membership fees to golf and country clubs, etc., how this will affect square dancing will depend on how the law is administered. If it is going to cover dues and contributions made to hobby-type square dance clubs, each club must register with the state and report monthly its taxable and non-taxable sales.

Oh You Beautiful Doll

BOW & SWING tips its hat to another girl this month. She doesn't have a given name, but everyone calls her Oh You Beautiful Doll.

This month's selection is on the flip side of Star Bright, which was written by Harry Howe and Lee Rimes of Miami Beach.

- 1-2 Wait; Wait;
- 3-4 Vine Apart, 2, 3, Teh; Vine Together, 2, 3, Teh; In Open pos facing LOD grapevine apart side L, XHIB, side L, tch R; Grapevine together side R, XLIB, side R, tch L.
- 1-2 (fwd) Step, Close, Step, —; Step, Close, Step, —; In Open pos do two fwd two-steps traveling LOD.
- 3-4 Fwd Dip, —, Recover, —; Step Back, Turn (to L Open), Fwd, —; Dip fwd on L, hold 1 ct, recover wgt on R, hold 1 ct; Step fwd on L, step back and turn fwd RLOD on R (M turns RF, W turns LF) to L OPEN pos, step fwd on L, hold 1 ct.

Third of Jax Dancers Represented NE Area

SOME 1283 dancers and callers representing 85 cities attended the Florida state square dance convention June 14-16 at Jacksonville. Statistics compiled by Registration Chairman Carl Law show that Jacksonville was represented by 422 dancers and eight callers. 90 dancers crossed the state line from Georgia.

Square of the Month for August:

You're The Reason

A FINE CLUB level dance by Johnny Le-Clair of Riverton, Wyoming, is the subject of BOW & SWING'S Square of the Month for August.

You're The Reason (SIO #128) is a "dance every caller will want to carry with him," states Square Dance Coordinator Jay Fenimore of Hollywood. "We invite you to take note of Johnny's yodel on the called side. It's a superb rendition all the way through. The instrumental is excellent, and will cause your dancers to move about in real swinging fashion," continues Fenimore.

The four ladies chain, Turn 'em around Chain 'em right back, Turn the sweetest in town And then the heads star thru, Square thru 3/4 round

Split the sides, round one to the middle A right and left thru, Turn back and cross trail Allemande left the corner, do sa do round

One time around, Same girl you swing and whirl

Sides face, Everybody grand square I'm bettin' . . . You're not losin' . . .

Sleep . . . over me . . .

And if I'm wrong, Don't fail to call

Go all the way home, Do a left allemande

Do sa do round your partner, That corner you swing

Swing the corner lady, Promenade that ring

Baby, You're the reason, I don't sleep at night . . .

Well, Here we go . . .

SEQUENCE: All figure twice thru then change

third and fourth lines to make sides active and call twice more.

NOTE: Last line thru substitute the following

for the final line:

Swing the girl, You're the reason I don't

sleep at night

HERE ARE a few challenge figures by Jay Fenimore with known basics which will cause dancers to be especially aware of "position" in the pattern as it develops:

SWING THRU TO A SUZY Q

Four ladies chain across the town

Turn 'em gents with an arm around

Heads to the middle and back with you

Go forward again and star thru

Opposite right, partner left, with a full turn around

Go on to the Sides and Swing thru, 4 by 2

Ends turn, centers too

Make an Ocean Wave and balance

Swing thru, again you do

Ends turn, centers too

Swing thru, back, do a right and left thru

Turn your girl, dive thru, pass thru

Left allemande . . .

ENDS FOLD, CENTERS TURN BACK

Four ladies chain, three quarters 'round

Turn 'em gents with an arm around

Heads to the right and circle four

Head to the right, do a line of four

Pass thru across the track

Ends fold, Centers turn back

Double thru, all "U" turn back

Centers in, Ends fold

Star thru, All "U" turn back

"Square thru, 3/4 man

Lady on the left, left allemande

With a full turn around go right and

left hand

* or: across from you, box the grnat

Pull her by, left allemande . . .

* or: Square thru, just four hands

Walk right into a right and left grand

Heads to the middle and back with you

Forward again, star thru

Pass thru, split the (Sides)

Around one and line up four

Forward eight and come on back

Pass thru

Ends fold, Centers turn back

Go forward and back, pass thru

Ends fold, Centers turn back
