

FFSD Ranks '63 State Convention As One of Best

NET PROCEEDS of \$1205.38 were divided equally between the Northeast Florida Square Dancers Association, the Florida Callers' Association, and the Florida Federation of Square Dancers, closing the record on the Jacksonville convention, making it one of the most successful ever held, members of the federation were told at their annual meeting in Fort Lauderdale Oct. 20.

A report from Convention Chairman Harry Edwards revealed gross income of \$2523 and expenditures of \$1370. A \$500 advance from the federation was repaid before the final "proceeds" figure was developed.

The report of Federation Treasurer Bill Whittle revealed an effective bank balance of \$1852.44, and total disbursements during the year of \$1617.25.

Harold Jenkins, chairman of the magazine advisory committee reported a net cost of \$500.92 to the federation for six months operation of BOW & SWING, and said the average monthly deficit was \$83.50. Both he and President Hink Smith predicted the magazine would be on a profitable basis within a few months. "Our deficit is only the cost of a single page ad," Jenkins pointed out.

The committee on area realignment presented a report which called for no action at this time, but the board of delegates urged that the committee be continued for further study of the problem.

Matt Bryan, president of the West Coast Square and Round Dancers Association, declared their system of an appointed vice president from each county is "working beautifully."

No report was received from the com-

mittee on public relations but it was felt by the board that this project, too, should be continued during the coming year.

A special report from an informal meeting between callers, dancers, and round dance organizations in Clearwater recently, recommended future state convention proceeds be divided equally between the dancers federation and the callers association, with any further division to local

area dancers associations to be up to the federation, and any further division to the Round Dance Council to be left up to the callers association. After adoption of this proposal, it was sent to the callers meeting and there ratified. (Callers agreed to appoint a committee to meet with a committee from the Council to work out details.)

Max Forsyth is scheduled to call a Tuesday, Dec. 17, dance at Panama City. Harry Lackey is headlined by the Winter Haven Suzy Qs to call on Saturday, Dec. 21, at the Armory.

Other dancers of more than local interest include a benefit dance with Frank (Continued on page 6)

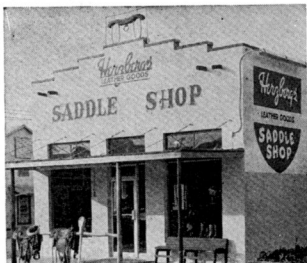

During the discussion on this motion, the importance of a sharing of responsibility for the support of BOW & SWING by the three groups was mentioned, but no concrete action was taken.

Lack of a progress report on the 1964 convention at Miami Beach drew expressions of concern but President Jenkins announced after a subsequent meeting with officers of the Round Dance Council and the Florida Callers Association that conferences with Convention Chairman George Watters indicated arrangements were proceeding smoothly. "Watters is doing a very fine job," Jenkins told BOW & SWING.

He said in accord with expressions at the joint meeting between the three groups he would give Watters an advisory committee composed of the presidents of the three groups (or deputies designated by them) which would provide data to sponsoring organizations.

West Coast delegates reported appointment of Matt Bryan as convention chairman for the 1965 Tampa meeting.

Manny Jacobson reported that talks with tax officials covered these points—

- (1) Admission to dances are subject to the state sales tax.
- (2) Charges made for beginner classes and workshops are not taxable because these sessions are instructional.
- (3) Membership fees are not subject to the sales tax, but they must not be admissions disguised as memberships.
- (4) Dances under city recreation sponsorship are subject to admissions tax if admission fee is charged.

He added that the tax authorities are concerned that only two applications for dealers certificates had been received in all of Dade County since July 1.

Round Dance Council Meeting To Be Announced

Round of the Month for December:

Hey Chick

BOW & SWING's Round of the Month for December is a sprightly Hey Chick recorded on Belco 205 by Frankie McWhorter and Muriel Mann of Lubbock, Texas.

Selection was announced by Round Dance Coordinator John Jones of Indianapolis. The dance starts in open facing position with no introduction and uses opposite footwork.

1-4 Vine, 2, 3, 4; Walk, —, 2, —; Vine, 2, 3, 4; Walk, —, 2, — In open facing position, step to side on L, behind on R, to side on L, in front on R; walk fwd two slow steps; Repeat action of meas 1 & 2;

5-8 Lady Cross Over, 2, 3, —; Back to Wrap, 2, 3, —; Unwrap, 2, 3, —; Reverse Twirl, 2, 3, — Lady crosses in front of M under joined hands (this L & her R) in a ½ R face turn, M turning to face W & join both hands; without M turning hands raise his L to make an arch, pull his R under to bring W under the arch under his L, and her to R hands to the outside again, in a wrapped pose; release M's L hand and unwrap. W making a full R face turn; move joined hands (this R & her L) bkwd to start W on a L face solo turn moving slightly RLOD. M does three steps in place;

9-12 Cut, 2, 3, 4; Turn, —, 2, —; Step, Lock, Step, Lock; Turn, —, 2, — In semi-closed pos, L cuts L foot over R, back on R, again cut L over R, back on R, take two steps in place, over R, back on L, for W, in a wrapped pose; turning ½ R face on L, lock R in front of L, step RLOD on L, lock R in front of L, take two steps in place, turning ½ L face ½ R face for W;

13-16 Rock Fwd, Back, Fwd, —; Rock Fwd, Back, Fwd, —; Rock Fwd, Back, Fwd, —; Turn away from partner, (M-L, W-R) in a circle with four rocking two steps, end in open pose;

17-20 Fwd, In Place, Back, In Place; Fwd, In Place, Back, In Place; Fwd Two-Step, —; Fwd Two-Step, —; Fwd Two-Step, — Step fwd on L (W-R) in front of R, back on R (in place), step bk on L, fwd on R (in place); repeat action of Meas 17; two fwd steps in LOD;

21-24 Repeat Action of Meas 17-20 facing partner on last step of meas 20;

25-28 Face to Face, —; Back to Back, —; Two-Step LOD on L, close R to L, pivot on L to back to back pos; step to side on R, close L to R step to side on R; two-step in a circle twd RLOD; two-step back to face partner;

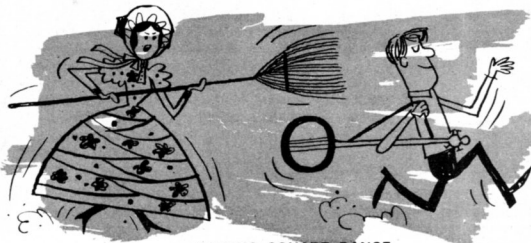

Square of the Month for December:

Don't Call Me Sweetie

A RE-RELEASE of an all time favorite by Joe Lewis, Don't Call Me Sweetie, has been selected as BOW & SWING'S Square of the Month for December by Square Dance Coordinator Jay Fenimore of Hollywood.

Now available on a 45 rpm disc, the popularity of this dance is almost certain to enjoy a revival to the liking of dancers and callers throughout the state.

Dance Figure: (Twice thru with Heads active, twice thru with Sides active)
Head two couples pass thru and around one . . .
Into the center and do sa do around . . .
Pass thru, split two, round one . . .
Cross trail and swing your corner,
swing her right off the floor.
Allemande left and weave by your partner
Turn the next by the left and the corner
promenade . . .

*Well, I caught you flirin' with another guy
and I'm so bitter that I could die
So don't you call me sweetie any more . . .

*Alternate line:
Well, I caught flirin' but not with me,
And I'm as bitter as I can be
So don't you call me sweetie any more . . .
Couples one and three pass thru across the set
and separate to move around one person. Come
thru the sides and do sa do with your partner.
Again pass thru and go between the side couples
and separate around one. Come into the center
. . . cross trail . . . swing the corner lady. Alle-
mande left . . . by your new partner (weave by)
and turn the next (original partner) with the
left arm . . . promenade the corner (your new
partner) to your former position.

*Middle Break and Closer:
Allemande left and box the gnat with sweetie . . .
Give her a swing and then let's promenade . . .
One and three, wheel around, right and left thru . . .
Right and left back, a full turn, as you

Wanta do . . .
Four ladies wanna chain, well let 'em . . .
Chain 'em back and then let's promenade . . .
*Well that guy that brought you to this square,
he's dancin' my gal over there.
So don't you call him sweetie any more . . .

*Alternate line:
"All this flirin' round with other guys,
makes me so bitter I could die
So don't you call me sweetie any more . . .
Allemande left your corner. Box the gnat with
your partner then swing and promenade her.
Couples one and three wheel around and do a
right and left thru with the couples you meet.
Do another right and left thru and turn the girls
around to put them into the center where they
chain across the ring. Chain them back across
and promenade home.

Here's another new basic by George
Hales of Hialeah.

"Z-ROW"

Figure is done with two couples facing . . .
figure ends with both couples still facing and in
same position as when movement began . . . Zero
movement . . .

Explanation:
Heads Do Sa Do, go all the way round to a
line . . . (Don't rock)
Join right elbows, wheel One quarter to the
right
(Man is now facing in and girl is facing out)
Man now steps forward to the left side of lady
directly in front of his partner
(in this instance, original partner) and
Wheels three quarters to the right again . . .
Net result: . . . Nothing . . . (Z-Row) Every-
body is back in original starting position . . .
Example:
Heads square thru—four hands around you go
When you meet your corner . . . Z-Row . . .
(patter: Do Sa Do, make a line, Turn one quarter,
Gents move up, turn three quarters, face
those two.)
Allemande Left . . .
