

# Fairs, Pageants Flavor Month's Square Dance Event Schedule

ROUND-UPS, pageants and St. Valentine's Day specials vie for the square dancers' attention in February.

The South Lake Round-Up at Winter Garden Auditorium on Saturday, February 2, a first annual event with Sam Prescott, Joe Johnson and Ed Newton sharing the caller's mike, is an all day session with workshops from 2 to 5:30 p.m. and a "gaiety hall" in the evening.

Ft. Myers honors Thomas Edison with the Pageant of Light celebration Wednesday, February 13 at the new city exhibition hall. Booked to call are Lew Green and Frank Bedell.

The Valentine theme also brightens February's second week. Joining the many clubs that will hold a special dance, the Paxon Prancers of Jacksonville will sponsor John Calhoun of Birmingham, Alabama on Thursday, February 14. The Beachcombers have a February 11 dance billed for Hollywood.

Frankie Lane of Lawrence, Kansas, begins his week tour of the Sunshine State on Tuesday, February 12 in Leesburg under auspices of the Happy Hoedowners. The dance is due to start at 8:00 p.m. at Leesburg armory.

Lane then heads south, first stopping in St. Petersburg Wednesday, February 13 to call for a dance at Ox-Bow Hall. A West Palm Beach appearance is slated for Friday, February 15 at the armory. On Saturday, February 16, the Southeast Association will sponsor Lane at North Miami armory.

Lane then swings north to call for Jacksonville's Western Cutters on Saturday,

February 23, at Wesconnett School.

Central Florida is the scene for three other headline events during the month. On Saturday, February 9 the Brevard Dancers—Allemanders, Satellites, Harbor City Squares, Who Goofed Squares, Missile Twisters—slate Louis Calhoun of Shelby, N.C., at the Trailer Haven.

Washington's Day is a big thing in Eustis and for February 22 there's a street dance beginning at 8 p.m. under sponsorship of the Tri Squares club. All

club dancers are invited to participate in this free event. Caller is Irv Elias.

A Florida Sheriff's Boys Ranch benefit dance is billed for Orlando's Tupperware Auditorium on Saturday, February 23 at 8 p.m., with Bob Rust the caller.

Among other dances planned for February, the Squares and Pairs of St. Petersburg have Eric Sohn booked for Friday, February 1, at the YWCA, with Fred Christopher to follow February 15.

Ralph Otis calls two dances for the Sunshine Squares of West Palm Beach, the first on Saturday, February 2, the second on February 16. Other callers programmed by the club are Bill Ford, February 9 and Pete Sansom, February 23.

The First Sunday Rounds, with the Malhiots, the Ayrtons, and the Pearsons, is set for February 3 at Ox-Bow Hall in St. Petersburg.

Ringin' the month to a close will be a week-long series of demonstration dances at the Central Florida Fair, Orlando. Featured dance groups include the Robert E. Lee class, Whirl and Twirl Club, Pioneers, and the Orlo Vista Fire House Squares.

## Mid-West Beckons 12th National

FLORIDA SQUARE dancers traveling to the 12th National at St. Paul, Minnesota, June 20-22, will find no palm trees or Lincoln Road.

But they will find a huge auditorium with six dancing halls, abundant nearby

accommodations, repeat of the 11th National specialties (teen-age room, panels, workshops and clinics) and hospitality that promises "the time of your square dancing life."

And if an added inducement is needed, look to the lakes and pines region for an ice show, fishing and golf tournaments, and tours of scenic and historical sites.

St. Paul Municipal Auditorium, convention site, is situated in the heart of the city near the main hotels. The convention bureau assures that 50 percent of the square dancers wishing hotel accommodations will be housed within easy walking distance. Shuttle buses will provide easy access to the hall for dancers housed beyond walking range. Dancers preferring motel accommodations will have choice rooms in the many new motels that have recently been completed in the Twin City area. Driving time to the auditorium will be from 10-25 minutes, and a free parking area at the auditorium will be provided for over 5000 cars.

Convention level, hot hash and comfortable fun-level dancing will be in the offing, along with an excellent round and contra selection.

The family and teen room, so popular at the 11th National, will be repeated.

Afterparties will include both dance parties and entertainment. Among the latter will be an outstanding ice show.

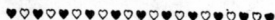
Happy Hoedowners will present Tex Brownlee at the Leesburg army January 26, with Frankie Lane to follow on February 12.

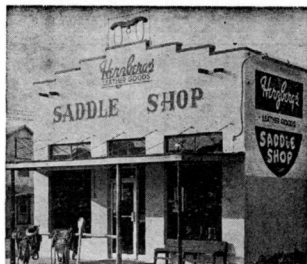

## Exhibition Dances Set for Central Florida Fair

CLUBS AFFILIATED with the Orlando Western Square Dance Council will present a nightly demonstration of square dancing as a public service feature of the Central Florida Fair, it is announced by Ray Massey of the Orlando Recreation Department.

Don Clausen will call for the Feb. 25 demonstration, which will be manned by council staff members. The following night members of the Robert E. Lee school class will be directed by Caller Joe Curtis, and on Wednesday evening the Whirl and Twirl Club under Caller Joe Johnson will appear. The Thursday night performance will feature Eric Sohn and the Pioneers club, and on Friday evening, March 1, the Orlo Vista Fire House Squares, with Joe Curtis is booked. The week-long fair closes on Saturday night, when Joe Johnson's Windermere Squares take the stage.

The Council agreed to sponsor Freddie Caswell of Cartersville, Ga., and Rod Blalock of Albany, Ga., as a calling team for the quarterly jamboree in the Orlando municipal auditorium on April 27.

A sliding scale of compensation for callers participating in the council's instructional program was presented by a special committee headed by Clint Debes who subsequently canvassed the callers. A joint meeting between the council and local callers was set for February 2.

As a result of the Jordan Marsh demonstration a class at Audubon Park was begun with Clausen as instructor. The Class at Lee school is in its second series, the council was told.

Final plans for the council's appearance at a Minute Maid party on January 18 were discussed by President Al Martin.

## Square of the Month for February:

### Fun and Fancy Free

SQUARE of the Month for February is a singing call by Tommy Farris with the pleasant title of Fun and Fancy Free. On a Square L label (No. 105), square dance coordinator Jay Fenimore says of this number: "Tommy does an excellent job on the called side and the instrumental side is full of bounce and just as good as they come. It is club level dancing and has been received very well to date wherever presented."

Four ladies chain across the ring  
Roll away and then you swing  
Circle to the left around you go

Allemande left and allemande thrar  
Right and left and form a star  
The gents back up and make a right hand star

Now slip the clutch left allemande  
You're gonna weave around the ring  
Weave in and out around you go  
Then meet with a right hand swing

Gents start left and don't be late  
Come on back and promenade  
Hurry home I know you're gonna see . . .  
That she's so full of fun and fancy free

FIGURE  
(Twice for heads—Twice for sides)  
Now one and three lead to the right  
Circle four and make a line  
Without a stop you do a right and left thru

Do a dixie chain across the ring  
Girls turn back and then swing  
Swing around and promenade that ring

Now the head two couples wheel around  
Square thru three-quarters round  
You're gonna bend that line go right and left thru  
Turn that gal around

ALTERNATE LINE  
(You're facing out so bend the line  
Go right and left thru on down)

Cross trail thru to the corner maid  
Box the flea and promenade  
Swing at home my friend and you will see . . .  
That she's so full of fun and fancy free

The Caller's Syllabus material for February includes a number of interesting breaks by Jay Fenimore. Try them on your dancers.

**Swinging Left and Right**  
(Note: End couples swing by the LEFT, center couple by the RIGHT)  
Head ladies chain across from you  
Head two couples do a right and left thru  
Go Dixie Style to an Ocean Wave—rock it

**Tennessee Two-Step**

Bow & SWING's Round of the Month for February is Tennessee Two-Step on Top #26001. It was written by Manning and Nita Smith of College Station, Texas and was quite popular several years ago on a Columbia label. Round Dance Coordinator John Jones of Melbourne reports that "since the re-issue on the Top label the dance is staging a comeback."

The dance starts in open position with opposite footwork, and there are three short sequences which are repeated and easily remembered. "Since all dances selected this year for ROM will be with the square dancer in mind, this dance should be easily learned and therefore enjoyed even though it is a little lively," according to Jones.

**Meas.**  
 1-2 Walk, 2, 3, 4; Turn Away, 2, 3, 4; In open pos walk forward four steps in LOD, M turn L face and W turn R face away from partner and walk around in a small circle and back to partner, join R hands;

3-4 Right Star (Two-Step), 2; 3, 4; With R hands joined star once and a hat around in four two-steps to end in OPEN, POS facing RLOD, inside hands joined;

5-8 Repeat All of Above in RLOD to End Facing LOD in Open Pos;

9-10 Walk, 2, Side, Behind; Roll, 2, 3, 4; In open pos walk forward in LOD with L, R, face partner and step to side in LOD on L, behind on R; ROLL LF twd LOD with L, R, L, R ending in CLOSED POSITION;

11-12 Two-Step Turn, Two-Step Turn; Two-Step Turn, Two-Step Turn; In closed pos do four turning two-steps;

13-16 Repeat All of Above in LOD Ending in Open Pos;

17-18 Walk, 2, 3, Step/Step; Back-Up, 2, 3, Step/Step; In open pos walk fwd L, R, L, R/L; Back up R, L, R, L/R; Face partner, join both hands;

19-20 Chasse, 2, 3, Step/Step; Back Up, 2, 3, Step/Step; Man "chases" lady toward wall with L, R, L; R/L; W then "Chases" M toward center, M walks backward L, R, L, Step/Step; on last step both turn to face RLOD;

21-24 Repeat Meas 17-20; Repeat Meas 17-20 starting in RLOD and ending with partners facing LOD in OPEN POSITION ready to start the dance from the beginning.

Sequence: ABC, ABC, AB, AB  
 Ending: On Meas 16 of Part B, man walks four steps fwd as lady twists and both bow.

The top 10 rounds listed in December Round Dancer magazine, as reported by Jones, are: Golden Gate Waltz, Wonderful World, Maple Leaf Rag, Peggy, Chella Lla, Remember Today, Dancing Shadows, Yogi, Lazy Quick Step, Lucky.
