# **Traveling Callers in January** Provide Full Dancing Calendar

WITH A full kettle of square dance activity planned for January, Florida dancers have, hopefully, stirred up more potential state-wide warmth than have chamber of commerce weather publicists.

Hot hash, new calls and lively rhythm are anticipated from an influx of traveling callers. Headlined throughout the state are Harry Lackey of Greensboro, North Carolina, and Texans Jim Brower of Texarkana, Tex Brownlee of Odessa and Harper Smith of Celina.





A HARPER SMITH dance at the Ocala civic auditorium on January 12 was formally approved by directors of the Central Florida Square Dancers Association at a regular meeting held in Orlando December 16.

Association dances are open to members or by reciprocity to members of other associations affiliated with the state federation, and any additional fee for a given dance will be charged to all who attend, except new members who pay their initial membership fee at the dance, the directors agreed. "This resolution means that we accord to new members the same courtesy extended universally by dance clubs that dancers are our guests for their first dance," explained President Kellogg.

## Western Square Dance Council Plans Plaza Demonstrations

MEMBERS OF the Orlando Western Square Dance Council received a green light for a series of demonstrations at the Colonial Plaza lot near Jordan Marsh in Orlando, to be held on January 3, 4 and 5, President Al Martin has announced.

Members of affiliated clubs will provide the demonstration teams and local callers will officiate. Public interest in square dancing which may be generated by the demonstrations will be channeled into a new series of classes to be held in the Audubon Park school cafetorium, according to plans presented by Ray Massey of the City Recreation Department.

A class of more than eight squares under the direction of Joe Curtis has just concluded its beginner series of lessons, the council was told at is December meeting. Plans are in the making for further demonstrations on the west side of the city.

The council discussed an apparent conflict between its scheduled dance of April 27 and the Seminole County Bi-Centennial and although arrangements might have been made to change plans for the Orlando auditorium dance, this was not done because dates for the Sanford event were acted on prematurely.

"Our dates have been a matter of record since October," Massey told the council. "The Orlando auditorium is in great demand and we cannot turn down the use of this facility which is offered to us four times a year."
