March Calendar Roars With Activity for Square Dancers

MARCH COMES in with a roar of square dance events that increase in tempo as the month turns toward April. Always bright with traveling callers and special festivals, the Florida dance calendar offers enough variety to satisfy everyone.

At Melbourne on Saturday, March 2, Ray McVay of Danville, Indiana, is programmed at the Trailer Haven by the six club Brevard Dancers group—Allemanders, Canaveral Squares, Harbor City Squares, Missile Twisters, Satellites, and Who Goofed Squares.

In Miami on the same evening, Jack Lasry is set to warm the Trails End Square Dance Center with an "All Nighter." Dancing begins at 9 p.m. and continues until only two squares are left. Goofy badges, refreshments and door prizes are in the offing, and club callers are invited to participate.

The Starlight Promenaders of Sanford expect a 10 square Knothead delegation from Jacksonville at their St. Patrick's Day dance on Saturday, March 16. And since the Promenaders have extended a statewide invitation for Knotheads-to-be, the Sanford Civic Center may reach its capacity of 50 squares, Chuck Durant has been selected to call.

A mid-week date - Thursday, March 21-finds the Briny Breezes of Delray Beach headlining Decko Deck at the Trailer Haven north of Delray on highway A1A.

Max Forsyth, well known caller from Indianapolis, Indiana, is featured at the Ox-Bow's annual "Sunday Shop" in St. Petersburg on March 17, and at a Lake City dance March 21 under auspices of the Tri-City dancers.

The West Coast Association slates its regular Fifth Friday dance for March 29 at the Lakeland Civic Center. Ed Newton and Fred Christopher are programmed for the squares, Fran and Clare Malhot for the rounds.



DANCING IN three halls, workshops, hot hash, and a family room are all on the tentative program aligned for the 1963 10th annual Florida Square Dance Convention June 13, 14, 15 in Jacksonville.

Harry Edwards of Gainesville has accepted the general chairman's berth for the big conclave. Tapped as committeemen were Al Hixon of Daytona Beach, square dance program; Bob Waites, Gainesville, round dance program; Floyd Hazen, Jacksonville, sound arrangements in halls; and Virgil Green, Jacksonville, physical facilities,

"We are emphasizing this as a state convention rather than a Northeast area convention," states Edwards, "and committee heads have been urged to avail themselves of the help and assistance of any and all dancers and callers in Florida

Headquarters for the three-day session is the George Washington Hotel. Dancing will be held there as well as at the Mayflower Hotel and the new Jacksonville Municipal Auditorium. The latter facility can dance 150 squares, and will be remembered as site for the Northeast Ass'n Fall Round-up last November.

"We are going to try something different this year by having a room available at any hour (except when this same room is being used for hot hash sessions) for any square that can get a caller to call for them," reports Al Hixon, president of the Florida State Callers' Association. "This covers a lot of territory, but it was felt it might give the dancers something they've been looking for at conventions.

The tentative program (see box) catalogs rooms or halls to hold both square and round dance workshops, the hours for each, plus a room for hot hash for Friday afternoon and Saturday morning and evening.

Arrangements also have been made

to have a TV room in the large convention hall for children and a teenage or family dance set patterned after the successful one promoted by the Roundtrees at the 11th National.

A trail dance is programmed for the George Washington Hotel on June 13 with Jacksonville area callers in charge. An after dance is booked for both Friday and Saturday night, plus an after party Saturday night.

Registration forms for the 10th annual state convention are included in this issue of Bow & SWING (see page 2). Upto-minute details will be published in succeeding issues.

Federation to Study **Bow & Swing Finances**

ALTHOUGH no suggested course of action has come out of a special federation committee on Bow & SWING'S financial problems, Chairman J. Warriner "Hink" Smith of St. Petersburg, plans a conference in Kissimmee within a few weeks to deal with the matter.

Also involved in the conversations will be a special committee of the Florida Callers Association including Phil White of Lynn Haven, Roger Chapman of Winter Haven, and Ed Mack of Clear-

Smith suggests that Bow & SWING become a "bible" of square dancing in Florida through inclusion of a complete caller directory, a complete directory of Callers Association members, and a complete directory of dance and caller organizations and their officers, in each issue. These would be revenue functions of the publication. "If this were done, one would have in any one issue a complete rundown on who's who and where in Florida."

Organizations which should be included in the directory include the state federation, the West Coast, Central Florida, Northeast Florida Southeast Florida associations, the Pensacola Area Council, and the Florida Knotheads, along with Florida Callers Association, Florida Callers Clinic, Suncoast Callers Association, and Southeast and Northeast Florida associations. Smith said.

In the meantime, Bow & Swing has planned a special April issue with extra copies going throughout the Eastern Seaboard, featuring summer square dance institutes, camps, and conventions. "This is an experiment," explains Publisher Al Cody, "and it may lead to development of Bow & Swing as a national news-magazine of square dancing.

"This should not interfere in any way with the future of Bow & SWING as a strong state publication through the technique of local and national editions, with which we experimented on a smaller

scale last year."

For the callers' workshop material for March, Lester Linn submits a novel variation on the right and left thru which he has been using with much success at his recent dances.

The pattern is called "roll thru" and accomplishes the same end result as right and left thru. For example, take "head couples roll thru": Head couples move to center of the square, taking a right forearm hold with opposite, make a full turn (as in a wheel chain), and then continue on to opposite positions, turning partner with the usual courtesy turn (as in right and left thru).

Another illustration is "all four couples roll thru": (as in all four couples right and left thru) pass corner, right shoulders, turn opposite with right forearm hold, full turn, continuing on to opposite position, pass original right hand lady left shoulders, turn partner with usual courtesy turn. All four couples are now in opposite positions.

Use this figure in place of right and left thru whenever desired, allowing, of course, extra time for the added turn in the center. Examples follow:

Heads to the middle and back with you Forward again-ROLL THRU . . . Sides to the middle and back with you Forward again-ROLL THRU Eight to the center and back with you All four couples-ROLL THRU . . .

Promenade, don't slow down . . . (1 & 3) wheel around ROLL THRU-turn your Sue Face those two, pass thru, bend the line ROLL THRU-Turn your Sue Face those two, cross trail thru To the corper, left Allemande . . .
