John Ward of Alton, Kansas, has sent in material for publication in Bow & SWING this month, using a new basic Centers Run (also Ends, Boys or Girls Run) by Vern Smith of Dearborn, Michigan. To execute the figure, the designated person walks half way around the person next to him in his half of the line, thereby changing sides and direction. The inactives don't turn but step sideways (left or right) to assist the actives in forming the line. This new basic gets dancers into or out of an Ocean Wave or an Allemande thar position.
