

Beginner Classes Beckon Dancers To Fun, Fellowship

LITERALLY HUNDREDS of Floridians are being introduced to the fellowship, fun, and healthful exercise of square and round dancing this fall, and this issue of **BOW & SWING** will be distributed through dozens of caller-instructors to some 2400 beginning dancers.

Square dancing appeals to young and old, but perhaps the "18 to 30" group usually omitted in public recreation programs has responded best to the demonstration dances, promotional literature and other public relations efforts by organized dancers throughout the state. Usually the beginner expects to be able to dance at club level after twenty lessons, and in some cases new clubs will develop from among those enrolled in a class.

On the West Coast, the Tampa Recreation Dept. has more than 100 couples dancing at area recreation centers, including a golden age group where all beginners are over 65 years of age. The Circle Squares of Tampa, like many other clubs, started beginner classes in September which will progress to intermediate and refresher classes.

On the South Suncoast, Bob Dawson of Sarasota schedules classes on nearly every day of the week in Bradenton, Sarasota, Port Charlotte and Fort Myers. Naples City Recreation Dept. is due to begin a class under direction of Ray Castle starting Nov. 10.

Gold Coast area beginners have a wide selection of classes to attend. Callers which have started or plan to start classes include Ted Barton, Frank Bell, Bert Bennett, Gordon Blaum, George Campbell, Bob Cook, Jay Feni-

Howard Rohrbacher has 80 beginners in his Thursday night class at Ocala City Auditorium. Bart Bartley teaches in the Gainesville Area.

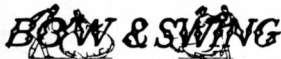

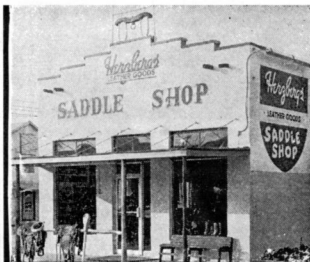

"I heard Les Linn do this one at a recent dance and found everyone to be impressed with the figure," reports Square Dance Coordinator Jay Fenimore of Hollywood. "The pattern calls for good timing in making it work smoothly. It's a number that all your dancers will enjoy."

Opener, Middle Break and Closer:
 Open your hands and circle left, the Curfew must not ring

Left hand round your corner girl, your partner right hand swing
 Your corner box the flea, four ladies chain across the dell

*Hang on the bell, Nellie, Do Sa Do your own Go back and swing the corner girl and promenade her home
