

Big Labor Day Dances Flavor Sept. Schedule

BIG LABOR DAY weekend dances coupled with out-of-state institutes makes September an active month for roving Florida square dancers.

Clearwater is the site for the three day Florida Knothead Konvention that begins August 31. Jack Jackson is the featured caller. The West Coast Ass'n will sponsor a free trail dance to the konvention on August 30 at Clearwater.

At St. Petersburg on August 31, Ox-Bow Hall will feature a "spectacular" with the Pearsons, the Malhiots, Ed Newton and Roger Chapman. On the same evening in Sanford, Bob Rust will call a Fifth Saturday dance at the Civic Center annex.

A meeting of the Round Dance Council of Florida is slated for Sunday morning, Sept. 1, at the Jack 'Tar Harrison Hotel in Clearwater.

Fontana Village Resort in North Carolina has two square dance programs on tap for September. The first, Fontana's Fun Fest, is set for Sept. 1-8. The second, the Swap Shop session, is booked for Sept. 28-Oct. 6. Staff and visiting callers will have charge of the program.

Jim Rice will call a dance at Kissimmee's Community Center on Sept. 8. Dance time is 2:30 p.m., and a pot luck supper will be included on the program. Prospects are that a dance at Kissimmee will become a regular monthly activity for central Florida dancers.

The Jekyll Holiday weekend at The Wanderer Resort, Jekyll Island, Georgia,

The Northeast Ass'n dance on Saturday, Sept. 21, will see Jim Pearson calling at the Pythian Center in Jacksonville.

The Daytona Beachcombers slate their dancing weekend for Sept. 27-28. Callers aligned for this event are Bob Rust and

Harry Lackey. Headquarters will be the Sanibel-Wavecrest motel, with dancing at IBEW Hall.

The Orlando Western Square Dance Council will perform a demonstration series on Sept. 28 at the Florida Family Campers Convention at Moss Park, Orlando.

Beginners' classes are back on the calendar, with most regional associations slating active programs for new dancers.

Sales Tax Levied On Square Dance Clubs

FLORIDA SQUARE dance clubs are required to register with the State Comptroller as collectors for the Sales and Use Tax division, and to make quarterly returns showing sales of tax and non-taxed merchandise and services.

Under the new sales tax law "the coverage of the Florida Sales, Use and Recreation Tax regulations have been expanded to cover membership in square dance clubs," according to a bulletin from headquarters of the West Coast Square and Round Dance Association.

The information has been passed along to headquarters of the Florida Federation of Square Dancers, BOW & SWING has been told.

"We are advised that effective July 1, 1963, it has become obligatory on the clubs to collect and refund to the proper state agency, a tax of 3% for all such membership. Along with the tax, it will also be necessary to collect and remit the 3% tax on all monies accepted as admis-

Southeast Callers, Clubs Slate Many Beginner Square Dance Classes

When the Mayor of Miami Beach extends the official welcome to dancers at the 11th Annual Florida Square Dance Convention next year, do not be surprised if he asks some square to save a place for him and his wife Janet to dance. During his campaign, Mel Richards was introduced to visitors at his club, the Ocean Waves, as the next Mayor of Miami Beach. To the delight of all square dancers in the area, the voters made it official.

The Southeast Florida Square & Round Dancers Ass'n, under the leadership of President George Watters, is preparing one of the most active years for square and round dancers in its history. Present plans call for eight dances with traveling callers. The callers will be carefully selected and scheduled on Sunday afternoon (when possible) to keep from interfering with club dances. The

callers will also be limited to the association dance while in the area to assure success of the dance.

Plans not yet complete call for square dance promotion directed toward interesting the general public in beginners' classes. This promotion may be a joint effort with the Southeast Callers Association to increase its coverage to the entire S.E. area.

The S. E. Dancers News & Views was made the official newsletter for the association at its July meeting. "News & Views" is a mimeograph bulletin similar to the "Grapevine" published by the Northeast Florida Square Dancers Ass'n by its able editors, Bill and Ruth Fleishman. The S.E. dancers feel they need the newsletter to carry all the notices of birthdays, anniversaries, parties, stories about members and dancers and other chit chat that makes volumes of copy that is too bulky, impractical and expensive to print in Bow & SWING. News & Views has the appeal of the small town weekly newspaper. You read about yourself, your friends and neighbors, what they are doing along with coming events.

The first issue of News & Views in July was so bulky that each club was limited to one column (1/2 page) for the August issue. The August issue turned out to be a slim 22 page issue. Although 500 copies were printed in August, the biggest complaints heard are from dancers who did not receive a copy. It would cost 10 cents to mail each copy, third class. Mail distribution is thus made financially impossible, with distribution being left to the club reporters and representatives to the association.

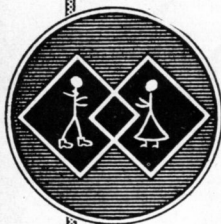

Jackson to Call Konvention Dances

FLORIDA KNOTHEADS will make a return pilgrimage to Clearwater for the 7th annual state Knothead Konvention that begins a three day run on August 31. Konvention headquarters will be located at

the Jack Tar Harrison Hotel.



JACKSON

Featured caller Jack Jackson of Columbus, Ohio, will be joined by the Knothead staff in a planned program of square and round dancing. Several new slants programmed into the konvention include special children's events and

dance routines using a Latin rhythm.

The program for non-dancers 6 to 14 years of age will be guided by approved recreation directors. The schedule begins at the hotel at 1:00 p.m. and concludes at 9:00 p.m. on both Saturday and Sunday. Saturday will see a tour of Busch Gardens in Tampa and a splash party at the hotel and on Sunday Sea-Orama movies will be shown at the hotel. Dancing teenagers have their own program on Saturday and Sunday afternoons. Bill & Louise Roundtree will be in charge, aided by Knothead callers.

Due to the introduction of Latin rhythms into many dance routines, a special workshop featuring basic steps of the rhumba, samba and bossa nova is planned for Saturday from 1-3 p.m. at Roebling Hall with Bill Cascio and Hazel Bennett in charge.

The konvention will utilize the city auditorium, Roebling Hall (one half block north of the hotel) and the 10th floor Jack Tar Harrison ballroom. All dance halls are air conditioned.

Square dancing with Jack Jackson at the mike is programmed for Saturday morning and evening, Sunday afternoon and evening, and Monday morning. Workshop sessions with Jackson are booked for Saturday and Sunday afternoons.

A continuous round dance workshop is slated for Saturday afternoon at Roebling Hall. The session will be paced with the Latin rhythm stylings, followed with rounds by Ruth Bartley, Bob Waites, and Dorothy and Art Brameier.

Hash, hot hash, and "red hot" hash is again a big feature of the konvention. Bill Muench is the ace "hash slinger", and will be assisted by other callers.

A fun feature will be the old fashioned night gown party after the Saturday night after parties, at which prizes will be awarded for the best, funniest, and best dressed square. The Idiot party will be directed by Chairman Jim Galloway. Other after parties will be handled by Lola Johnson and the Faircloths.

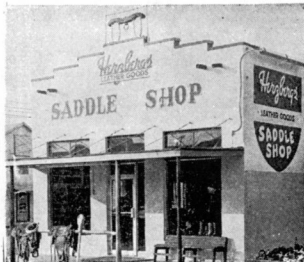

Orlando Council Sets Fall Classes

Lanning's Mixer

BOW & SWING's Round of the Month for September is Lanning's Mixer on Blue Star #1670 by Frank and Ruth Lanning of Topeka, Kansas.

With the fall season here and square dance classes beginning, this dance can be useful to introduce new dancers to mixers and round dancing, reports Round Dance Coordinator John Jones of Indianapolis. The dance uses square dance figures which the dancers will be familiar with after several short lessons of square dancing.

Meas,
1-4 Walk - 2; 3-, Face -; Balance Left 2, 3, -; Balance Right 2, 3, -; In open position inside hands joined facing LOD, starting M's L foot and W's R foot, walk 4 steps fwd facing partner on last step joining both hands do a quick step step in LOD then in RLOD to end in open pos.

5-8 Walk - 2; 3-, Face -; Balance Left 2, 3, -; Balance Right 2, 3, -; Repeat action of Meas 1-4 except end facing partner;

9-12 Star Thru - 2; 3-, Face -; Balance Left 2, 3, -; Balance Right 2, 3, -; Do a regular star thru in 4 steps end facing partner M on outside of circle facing partner and COH both hands joined. Balance RLOD and LOD;

13-16 Star Thru - 2; 3-, Face -; Balance Left 2, 3, -; Balance Right 2, 3, -; Repeat meas 9-12 except balance LOD then RLOD end with M on the inside of circle facing partner and the wall;

17-20 Star Right - 2; 3-, Join Hands -; Balance Left 2, 3, -; Balance Right 2, 3, -; Star right with partner 1/2 way around in 4 steps, join L hands with corner forming circle around hall M facing IN, W facing OUT (Alamo style) Balance RLOD then LOD.

21-24 Star Left Like-a-Left Allemande - 2, 3, -; 4 - 5 - 6 - 1 - 7 - 8 -; Release R hands with partner, star LEFT with your corner all the way around like a left allemande.

25-28 Right & Left Grand - 2, 3, -; 4 - 5 - 6 - 1 - 7 - 8 -; Go right and left grand starting with your partner (the 5th one you meet will be your new partner).

29-32 Swing - 2; 3-, 4 - 5 - 6 - 1 - 7 - 8 -; Swing new partner 2 times around, end in OPEN POS to repeat dance from the top.

Round Dancer magazine for July lists the top 10 rounds as follows: Dancing Shadows, Lucky, Happy Feeling, Under Her Spell, Love Makes the World Go Round, Take Me Dancing, Frauline, A

Kiss In The Dark, Golden Gate Waltz, St. Louis Blues.

The "five current best sellers" as per Sets In Order's mid July tabulation are: Frauline, Hi Lili Hi Lo, St. Louis Blues, Dancing Shadows, Linger Awhile.

Beginning August 18, Colin and Peggy Walton will conduct a round dance class the third Sunday of each month, 2-4:30 p.m., at the Recreation Hall, Riviera Beach. Besides the round of the month they will teach simple basics, some easy routines and also one or two of the more advanced sequences. This should offer something for every dancer, whatever level they require.

New rounds for the "Left-Footers" group of the Rhythm Squares are That Happy Feeling, Love Makes the World Go Round, The Bossanova. Dances for the Rhythm Squares are taught by Jay Fenimore of Hollywood.

sion fees to dances whether as guests to a club dance or for a regular open dance," the West Coast bulletin states.

"The tax is to be paid on a calendar quarterly basis, with the first remittance being due on or before October 20th to cover the quarter ending September 30th (July, August and September).

"The simple procedures are as follows:

1. Obtain registration form.
2. Send completed form along with payment of \$1.00 registration fee to the Comptroller's office, Sales and Use Tax Division, Tallahassee, Fla. Your registration number, to be used on all future filing of returns, will be forwarded to your club at the mailing address indicated on the form.

"3. File first return with remittance on or before October 20, 1963. (necessary forms will be sent to you directly from Tallahassee).

"We are advised that while penalties will not be imposed for late filing of the request for registration number, it should be done without delay."

Further information can be obtained from local offices of the Sales Tax Division. The application form is identified as "ST-1".
