

## 'Early Birds' are Signing Up for State Convention

MORE THAN 80 square dancers have signed up as "Early Bird" registrants for the 11th annual State Square Dance Convention June 19-20 at Miami Beach.

Committee chairmen for the convention, meeting March 3 at West Hollywood also totaled approximately 150 room reservations at the DiLido Hotel. The DiLido will be convention headquarters and will share the dancing program with the 17th Street Auditorium.

Early hotel reservations are urged by the committee chairmen to assure choice facilities. "Early Birds" will have a Trail's End pool-side party and weiner roast on Thursday, June 18, at the DiLido.

Details on first aid stations at the DiLido and 17th Street Auditorium are being firmed. Mike Ford has contacted the department head of the local American Red Cross chapter. Mrs. Louis Zaul advised Ford that application for first aid stations and attendants has been approved and that the Red Cross will supply complete first aid equipment with the exception of oxygen.

The first aid stations will be manned by nurses' aids, with the possibility that a registered nurse will also be on hand. Mrs. Zaul said that the auditorium has a complete first aid room. Minor problems such as attending physician, stand-by ambulance service, an oxygen unit at the DiLido are to be solved in the coming weeks.

Bill Whittle stated that he will handle all contacts for booth rentals at the 17th Street Auditorium. All clubs should plan

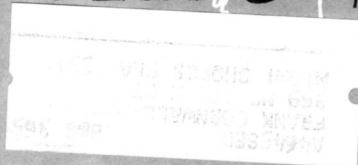

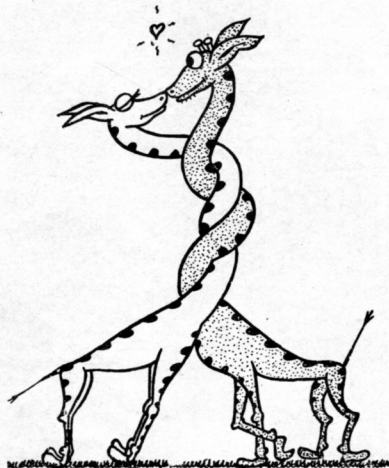

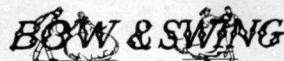

# Caller Exchange Among SE Clubs Adds Variety to Programmed Dances

A SYSTEM to exchange club callers is the latest gimmick being tried by square dance clubs in Southeast Florida. The idea is to stir increased interest in club dances by programming new callers. An added benefit is that dancers will be able to work with a new caller without leaving their regular dance hall.

The first such exchange found Jay Fenimore calling for the Ocean Waves at Miami Beach and Les Linn calling for the Hollywood Beachcombers. Both clubs hold dances on Monday nights, so it was just a matter of Linn traveling to Hollywood and Fenimore going down to Miami Beach. Both clubs thus introduced variety to regular club dances.

It is anticipated that a rotating system will be developed to program more local callers in guest spots among area clubs.

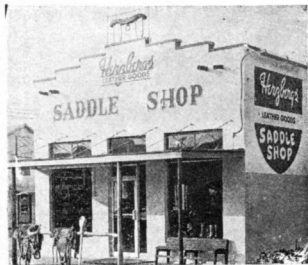

"This is a fast moving, but easy and smooth flowing dance written by Ralph and Jeanette Kinnane of Birmingham, Ala.," reports Howe. The dance starts in open position for introduction, and semi-closed position for start of dance. Kentucky Home is recorded on Grenn label #14059.

Wait; Wait; Bal Apt. —, Teh, —; Step Tog, —, Teh (To SC Pos), —;

1-4 Fwd Two-Step; Fwd Two-Step (To Face); Side, —, Close, —; Side, Step, Step, —; In semi-closed Pos do two Fwd two-steps to end in CP M's Bk to COH; Step to side in LOD on L, hold 1 Ct, Close R to L, hold 1 Ct; Step to side on L, in place on R, then in place on L, hold 1 Ct;

## Banner Stealing Rules Needed to Assure Harmony Among Dancers

BANNER STEALING among Florida's square dance clubs has become a flourishing source of amusement. Lest merriment of the occasion get out of hand, a few sound rules of the game may be in order.

The following Banner Stealing Rules are reprinted from the Denver Area Square Dancers bulletin, and were sent to Bow & Swing by Mrs. Charles Kuhn of the Canaveral Squares, Cocoa.

- 1) Banners are not to be reserved for any visiting club.
- 2) Banners to be taken by the visiting club with first full square attending or representing their club in cases where two or more clubs come to steal your banner. Make your presence known immediately. Sign in.
- 3) In order to steal a banner, one or more squares shall attend your club dance for the evening.
- 4) A couple who belongs to two or more clubs cannot represent one club and steal from another club to which they belong.

- 5) Clubs may not call ahead to find out if banner is available. And no reserving.
- 6) All clubs should have but one banner to be stolen.

7) In cases where a club travels a distance of 30 miles or more one way to steal a banner and the banner is stolen by a local club, the traveling club should be given an I.O.U. or a secondary banner. Only in this case should a club have more than one banner out.

8) A secondary banner would be considered a traveling banner which could be taken only by a traveling club referred to in paragraph 7. In other words, a club can have one banner for the local clubs to steal and one banner for the traveling clubs to steal, but no more than one for each case.

9) A club can steal a banner or retrieve a banner on a visit to a club, but not both at the same time, it takes a visit to steal and a visit to retrieve.

10) If you are going to be a thief, be a good one and abide by the rules. What is fair for one club should be fair for all clubs participating in the art of being a good thief or banner stealer.

# Money, Marbles and Chalk

JAY FENIMORE's selection for BOW & SWING's Square of the Month for April is Money, Marbles & Chalk. The dance is written and called by Johnny Schultz of Phoenix, Arizona, and recorded on Old Timey #8194.

Four ladies chain across the way  
Turn that gal and half sashay  
Join hands circle left around the ring  
Roll your one more time  
Circle left you're doing line  
Allemande left, then you weave around

I've got money, marbles and chalk sweetheart  
So Do Sa Do and you promenade with me  
I've got money to burn and marbles to roll  
And enough chalk for you and for me.

Head ladies chain across the way  
Turn that girl and half sashay  
Now star by the left three quarters around  
you know

Right and left thru the outside two  
Turn that girl dive on two  
Now square thru three hands around you go  
Allemande left your corner and you pass  
on by your own

Swing the ring hand girl and promenade  
the floor.

"I'm spendin' my dough just to make my  
marbles roll  
And make chalk marks all over the door."  
Ending Lines  
My money won't spend and my marbles won't roll  
And my chalk it won't write any more.

In Jay Fenimore's workshop material for March BOW & SWING, a line of type was omitted from Square Thru 5-4-3-2-1. The number is reprinted below in corrected form.

## SQUARE THRU 5-4-3-2-1 by Jay Fenimore

Heads to the middle and back with you  
Forward again, LEFT square thru  
FIVE hands around—Sides divide  
Star thru—right and left thru  
Turn 'em around, dive thru, square thru  
FOUR hands—New heads divide  
Star thru—right and left thru  
Turn 'em around, dive thru, square thru  
THREE hands—Sides stand out  
Split those two, come into the middle  
"Half square thru—right and left thru  
Turn 'em around, dive thru, square thru  
Just ONE hand, allemande left . . .  
"(This line was omitted in March issue.)

Here are some Equivalents for the call:  
Cross Trail, Left Allemande, from lines of four, facing, partner on right in 1-4-3-2 sequence.

"Star thru, pass thru, left allemande . . ."  
"Square thru 3/4—bend the line  
Right and left thru—left allemande"  
"Pass thru—bend the line  
Left square thru—count four hands  
There's corner—left allemande"  
"Pass thru—bend the line  
Star thru—square thru—square thru  
3/4—start lookin' man  
There's corner, left allemande"

Here are a few calls using the new basic Curl the Line.

(Heads) star thru—pass thru  
Do Sa Do with two hands outside two  
Make an Ocean Wave—balance  
Curl the Line—star thru  
Square thru—go four hands  
"U" turn around—Do Sa Do  
All the way around, make an Ocean Wave—balance  
Curl the Line—star thru  
Bend the line—star thru  
Do Sa Do  
Make an ocean wave—balance  
CURL THE LINE—Square thru  
Just three hands, left allemande.

No. 1 & No. 2 gent face your corner  
Bow the gal—square your sets just like that  
Head (new No. 1 & 3) forward and back  
Do Sa Do on the inside track  
All the way, make an Ocean Wave & balance  
Curl the Line—Square thru—4 hands are  
Do Sa Do the outside two  
Make an Ocean Wave and balance  
Curl the Line—half square thru  
Bend the line—go forward and back  
Pass thru, arch in the middle, Ends duck thru"

## Square thru, go five hands to corner

Left allemande.  
Following Ends duck thru, centers of line will  
California twirl, arky style . . .

Head ladies chain  
Four two couples do a right & left thru  
Same two, do sa do, make an Ocean Wave &

Center two, square thru, 3/4, around the land
