Square Dancing is Relaxing

New Chairman Elected by FFSD

FRANK CORNWALL of Miami was elected chairman of the Florida Federation of Square Dancers, succeeding Harold Jenkins of DeBary.

Virgil Green of Jacksonville was named vice chairman, Robert Brown of Orlando secretary, and Walter Stoltz of Bartow was moved from secretary to treasurer.

Election of Cornwall and Green to offices in the federation came about after passage of a by-law change permitting a fourth delegate from each affiliated local association to be appointed by the chairman.

Cornwall, retiring vice chairman, was not included in the slate of delegates submitted by the Southeast Florida Square and Round Dancers Association.

Richard Rae, president of the Southeast group, objected to the by-law change, as did Lou Olsen of Jacksonville, retiring president of the Northeast Florida group.

The proposed by-law change came out of a committee headed by John Sullivan of Daytona Beach. Purpose was frankly stated by President Jenkins: "we need a weapon to protect those who have given of their time in the service of square dancing, who for one reason or another are not included among the delegation sent to us by the local association."

Cornwall's record of service in square dancing included chairman-

ship of an important committee for the Miami National convention.

As soon as the vote was taken Rae and other delegates from the Southeast association and Olsen from the Northeast group left the meeting.

The federation treasurer's report indicated a balance at the beginning of the fiscal year of \$1842.44, income of \$1319.51 and expenditures of \$1064.72, and a balance on Oct. 31, 1964 of \$2097.23. In addition the organization has a credit of \$138.00 on an advertising account at Fontana Village, N. C.

A detailed statement of income and expenditures on Bow & SWING was requested and retiring Treasurer Hink Smith promised to prepare it and send it to all members of the board.

A committee will be named to investigate any possible obligation to the Internal Revenue Service on the part of the federation.

Matt Bryan, retiring president of the West Coast Square and Round Dancers Association, reported that plans for the 1965 convention are progressing satisfactorily. "Everything possible has been done up to this point," he said. "The Floridan will be headquarters, and the Sheraton and Tampa Terrace will each set aside upwards of 400 rooms. Rates from \$9.00 double have been assured by the committee. A rental of \$100 per day for the convention hall "plus incidentals" includes one large and three small halls.

Bryan invited all to attend the Suncoast Squar-a-rama, a dry run set for Feb. 12 and 13 with West Coast and Suncoast Callers providing the talent. It is expected that any problems with relation to acoustics can be ironed out at this time.

In reporting for the magazine committee Hink Smith said progress was still being made in bringing the Bow & SWING operation into the black. Correspondents are needed, he said, and "just one more page of advertising."

He asked the board to clarify the policy on publication of detailed program material in the magazine and the board expressed itself in favor of providing free program copies and free program space in the magazine for any square dance event not operated for personal profit. The status of Knotheads was brought up and Smith said investigation of the Knothead organization was underway.

We Need to Reduce Dropouts From New Dancer Classes

THE FAST GROWTH of square dancing in the state of Florida, like in any other activity, creates a challenge. This challenge must be solved to assure continued growth. This is not the responsibility of the Federation alone, but also of the Florida Callers Association and the Round Dance Council. This challenge must be met with intelligent planning.

Not only must we bring more dancers into square dancing, but we must reduce the high rate of dropouts. Once a dancer starts a class, he should be encouraged to continue until he can dance with any group. Once-a-week dancers should have a place where they can feel comfortable and receive but not be overwhelmed by workshop material. We

need dances where the non-dancer can be exposed to square dancing and be channeled into classes.

Each new administration finds many problems, both old and new, that need its attention. We therefore solicit the continued help of our past officers to work with us on projects already underway.

Bow & SWING looks better each month, but still needs more advertising to make it self-sufficient.

Guide lines are being set up to make the Florida State Square Dance Convention more orderly.

The public image of square dancing is that it is fun. Let's keep it that way.

Tex Brownlee is slated to call three dances during December's second week. He is booked on Saturday, Dec. 5, at Eau Gallie Civic Center under auspices of the East Coast Dancers. On Monday, Dec. 7, Brownlee will call at Leesburg Community Center sponsored by the Happy Hoedowners. Brownlee will call at Sarasota on Wednesday, Dec. 9, for the Freelancers club.

A Holiday Hoedown with Harry Lackey calling is set for Sunday, Dec. 20, at the Daytona Beach Recreation Hall on City Island. The workshop

begins at 2 p. m. and the evening dance at 6 p. m. Sponsors are the Round Dance Club of Daytona.

Dub Perry has his Florida booking at Sarasota on Wednesday, Dec. 23, sponsored by the Freelancers.

Several benefit dances are slated during the month. One is scheduled for Friday, Dec. 4, at Robert E. Lee Cafeteria, Orlando, by the Whirl & Twirl club. Another is planned for Saturday, Dec. 12, at Lakeland's New Florida Hotel. The Red Hot Trotters will sponsor the Lakeland dance.

North Florida dancers will be interested in the Marshall Flippo dance at Waycross, Ga., on Friday, Dec. 4. This will be held at the local City Auditorium and sponsored by the Waycross Swampstompers.

Elaborate Plans Readied for 14th National at Dallas

THE INITIAL "patter and hash" of the committees charged with shaping the 14th National Square Dance Convention at Dallas in June into the all-time "grandest of squares" is changing to less talk and more action.

Hoping the enthusiasm will be contagious, 14th National committeemen will spread the word about the convention as rapidly as modern communications will allow. As a starter, committeemen have received pre-registrations from two full squares from Saudi Arabia. This representation will shatter the "most-est from the farthest" convention record.

George & Mary McNett, respondents from the group in Saudi Arabia, have advised General Chairman Roy Long that all of them are employees of the American Arabian Oil Company, and have scheduled their stateside visit to coincide with the national convention in Dallas. Committeemen believe that the 14th National may begin the trend to the "international" of national square dance conventions.

It is not too late to write a letter to Postmaster General John Gronouski requesting a special stamp commemorating American Square Dancing. Dallas Postmaster W. B. Hudson will have postal facilities set up at the auditorium during the national convention offering stamps, envelopes and mailing provisions for

the convenience of dancers.

Lakewood, California, caller Chuck Raley did a fine job at the first 14th National Convention Preview Dance recently. More than 300 committeemen and visiting dancers had a real ball with Chuck and John & Wanda Winter (of Route 66 fame) on the rounds. National Committeeman for five Southeastern states is Harry Moore, 9233 Abbott Ave., Miami Beach 54, Florida.

Dancers attending the 14th National should prepare to be pampered. For example: Harper Smith and Red Warrick are co-directors of square dance programming. Billy Lewis is director of contra and folk dancing while C. O. Guest is director of square dance workshops. Jay Griffin directs the grand marches.

All are Texas home folks, each a recording star and top notch caller. Directors of this professional caliber are able to attract top featured callers from everywhere. Make sure your favorite caller gets registered now.

Coordination of dancing time and space between squares and rounds at the 14th is the happy fate of Bill & Margaret Campbell.

After party registrations are rolling in fast for the Texas Barbecue and Championship Rodeo. Al and Blossom Selmier, (General Chairman, 15th National in Indianapolis 1966) were the first out of state dancers to sign up for this extravaganza.

Up and Down

UP AND DOWN recorded by Bob Van Antwerp of Long Beach, Calif., is Bow & SWING's Square of the Month for December.

"Try this one for a peppy singing call, with a relatively simple figure and alternate figure for variety," suggests Square Dance Coordinator Jay Fenimore of Hollywood.

"Up and Down, a MacGregor (1044) recording, is an excellent instrumental with a key change on the fourth chorus which makes this one of the most interesting singing calls we have seen for some time. Needless to say, the called rendition on the flip side is superb—Bob Van Antwerp is always great," says Fenimore.

Introduction—Break—Closer:

Four ladies chain across and I'll tell you why
You chain 'em back to the same ol' guy
Come back and circle to the left awhile
Reverse back the other way and walk it single
file

Girls step out and back-track your partner
box the gnat
Pull by your corner allemande . . .
Come back and promenade rund with a
calico gown
An then you swing her up and down . . .

Figure:

Head (Side) two go forward up come back a
half sashay
Pass thru separate, round just one I say
Box the gnat in the middle square thru three
quarters too

Swing with the corner girl, she's looking for
you to

Allemande the corner maid a grand ol' right
and left

Keep in time and promenade the set
*You've just found a lady who will follow
you around

So now you swing her up and down

Sequence of Dance:
Introduction: Twice for Heads; Break; Twice
for Sides; Closer.

Alternate Figure:
Head two go forward up, come back a half
sashay

Pass thru, both turn right, behind these two
you stay

Center two a right and left thru, and don't
be blue

Pass thru and swing a girl a facing you
Just the men star by the left around then
do-sa-do

All the way around and promenade . . .
*She's a gal you'll love ya just for pound for
pound

So swing her now just up and down

Additional Pattern:
*You promenade home with the gal that
you found

So then you'll swing her up and down
*You have found a lady, better keep her around
So swing her now just up and down

*She's the hottest number that you have found
So swing her now just up and down

reports Jay Fenimore, and the
dancers enjoy doing it.

Position:

Two couples in line, facing opposite directions.

Action:

Girls swing by the right one half, then the
two couples wheel and deal (to face each
other)

Equivalent:

Complete figure (two couples facing) "right &
left thru and a quarter more, slip 'N' wheel
is the equivalent of: "Star thru, right & left
thru"

EXAMPLES:

Heads right & left & a quarter more slip 'N'
wheel in the middle of the floor pass thru. Left

INTRODUCTION

Meas. 1-4 Wait; Wait; Apart, Point, -; Together, (together) -; to Butterfly; -; 2 meas in Open-Facing pos, M's back to COH, M's R and W's L hands joined; step back on L fwd COH, point R two paces -; step fwd R, -; touch L by R and take Butterfly pos, -

DANCE

1-4 Face to Face; Back to Back (Change Hands); Circle, -; 2, -; 3, -; 4, (to Semi-Closed); In Butterfly prog LOD do a face-to-face two-step starting swd L, close R to L, step swd L, -; continuing along LOD pivot on L ft and swinging trailing hands thru (M's R and W's L) do a back-to-back two-step starting side twd LOD on R, close L to R, side on R, -; releasing M's R and W's L hands join M's L and W's R and both walk around in a circle (M LF, W RF) with 4 slow strutting steps to end in SEMI-CLOSED pos both facing LOD (L, -; R, -; L, -; R, -).

17-20 Face to Face; Dip Fwd, -; Recover, -; Face to Face; Dip, Recover, (Face) -; In Butterfly pos do a face-to-face two-step stepping swd L twd LOD, close R to L, step swd L turning 1/4 L to Open pos facing LOD, hold 1 ct; dip fwd on R swinging trailing hands thru (M's R, W's L), hold 1 ct, recover back on L turning 1/4 R to face partner in momentary Butterfly pos, hold 1 ct; moving twd LOD do a face-to-face two-step stepping swd R, close L to R, swd R turning 1/4 to face RLOD in LEFT OPEN pos (M's L and W's R hands joined), hold 1 ct; dip fwd L swinging joined hands thru, hold 1 ct, recover back on R turning 1/4 L to face partner in momentary Butterfly pos and slightly to L side of partner, hold 1 ct.

21-24 W Twirl (RF) Across, 2, 3, Hop/Swing; W Twirl (LF) Back, 2, 3, Touch; (Slo) Roll, -; 2, -; 3, -; 4, -; (to Open); (Retain M's L and W's R hands only) M steps across LOD passing L, shoulders and moving twd wall and turning 1/2 LF to face COH and partner with a quick L,R,L, hop/L swing R (basic schottische step) as W twirls R across LOD making a 1/2 RF turn to face wall and partner with

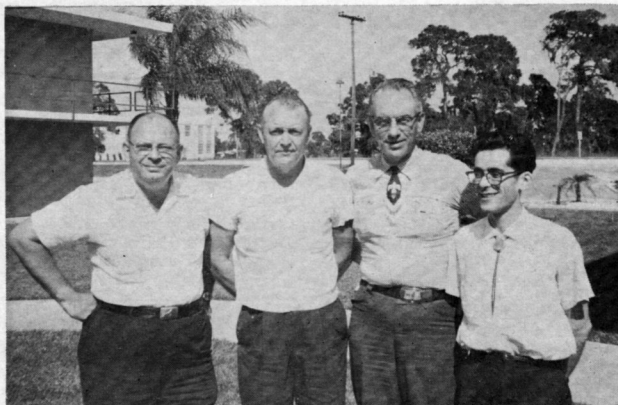

FCA Elects New Officers, Sets Requirements for Junior Members

NEW OFFICERS of the Florida Callers Association were elected by unanimous ballot at the November meeting. The new president is Ed Newton. Vice-president is Joe Johnson. Secretary is Mel Clark and treasurer is Colin Walton.

Directors include Al Hixon, Central; Cliff Reazak, West Coast; George Hoyt, Northeast; Neil Blanchard, Southeast; Kent Bartlett, Northwest; and Sam Prescott, at large. Prescott was also appointed to the post of permanent librarian.

A set of requirements for Junior members were adopted by FCA, upon recommendation of the Education committee. Junior members may not vote, hold office, or serve on committees, but otherwise receive all membership benefits. A prospective junior member must be recommended by three active member callers, and have a minimum of one year of dancing experience. Character references are required, and a prospective junior member must be interviewed by a director.

The junior member prospect must have a partner to attend FCA sessions. Strict adherence to the FCA Code of Ethics is required. A junior member must attend at least six lessons of a new dancer class before advancing to other membership. After satisfactorily completing one year of

Junior membership, a member 21 years old will be eligible for Associate or Active membership.

The state convention produced a net income of \$2,537.20, reported outgoing treasurer Joe Johnson. Of this amount, \$1,276.60 went to FCA with 30 percent earmarked for the Round Dance Council. Florida Federation of Square Dancers got \$761.16, and the South East Florida Square and Round Dance Association received \$507.44.

The education committee recommended that the association's June meeting be held between 3 and 6 p. m. Saturday, followed by a Dutch-treat dinner. This recommendation was adopted.

Acting upon the motion of Art Hixon, FCA set the third week of October for the October meeting and clinic. Also in regard to the fall clinic, the executive board was authorized to select the national caller for the event more than a year in advance.

There was a discussion regarding the color of tag badges of associate members. It was decided to leave them white.

The education committee was asked to work through Dr. Ernest Bartly to try to get the use of public schools for square dancing events.

Much has been said about harmony. I feel there are two musts for harmony: 1) You must have a responsible leader and caller who knows how to get along with people, has a good character, nice personality, patience and knowledge of square dancing.

2) You must have a majority of club members whose first thoughts are: "what is best for the club and square dancing"; who are friendly, understanding, and willing to serve when asked instead of criticizing and refusing to serve.

You will notice that I did not mention dancing ability or calling ability.

I feel that this is not half as important as the personality and character of dancers and callers.
