

# July 4 Holiday Keynotes Active Dance Slate

Andy Andrus, Singin' Sam Mitchell and Jack Jackson are among the out-of-state callers headlined at Florida square dances during July. Paced by an active 4th of July holiday, the dancing calendar includes over a half dozen major events of interest to all square and round dancers.

Opening the 4th of July weekend is a trail's end dance to the Citrus-Land Square-Up. The dance is set for Thursday, July 2, and will precede the Square-Up that is billed for July 3 and 4 at Lakeland's Civic Center. The Square-Up programs four sessions per day, with calls handled by Roger Chapman of Winter Haven, Ruy Camp of East Point, Ga., and Harry Lackey of Greensboro, N. C. Rounds are under direction of Ed & Kay Mack of Clearwater and John & Betty Jones of Melbourne.

St. Petersburg's Ox Bow Hall has its first annual Bang-Up on tap for July 3 and 4. The program includes three big dance sessions with Colin Walton, Ed Newton and Jim Pearson. A limit of 18 squares is placed on this event to assure comfortable dancing for participants.

An Adult Square Dance Festival is in the works for July 3 at Miami Beach Municipal Auditorium. Local callers on hand for the dance will be Ted Barton, Frank Bedell, Les Linn, Gene Baylis, Vern Johnson, Jack Lasry and Sam Prescott.

## California's 'Lucky 13th' National Beckons Florida Square Dancers

All of California is waiting for the arrival of thousands of square dancers coming for the "Lucky 13th" National Square Dance Convention.

Scheduled for July 23-25 at Long Beach, the convention will offer the best in round and square dancing, workshops,

panels and clinics.

Pre-convention activity begins on Wednesday evening, July 22, with a Grand National Parade of States on Long Beach streets. Various trail's end dances are programmed throughout the area.

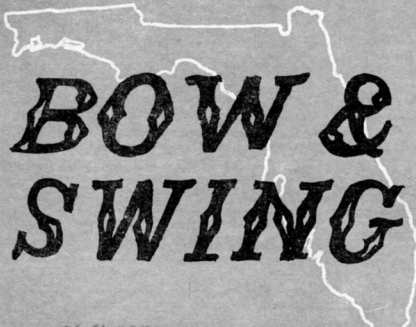
Formal convention agenda begins on Thursday, July 23. Registration begins in the morning and a keynote address is slated by an outstanding leader from outside of square dancing. Clinics, workshops, panels, and programmed squares and rounds are slated throughout the day. A gala evening dance will cap the Thursday program.

The schedule for Friday, July 24, is basically a repeat of the preceding day. An addition is a teen age after party planned for evening hours.

The dancing, panels, demonstrations continue on Saturday, July 25, with special attention focused on a pre-teen dance in the afternoon. A grand march and evening dance will formally conclude the convention.

For the die-hards, an after party is planned for Disneyland from 1 to 6 a.m. on Sunday. The entire playground will be turned over to the exclusive use and enjoyment of square dancers.

A number of Florida dancers have indicated plans to attend the California convention. For the September issue of BOW & SWING, closing date August 10, the editors will welcome on-the-scene reports from those dancers attending the convention.

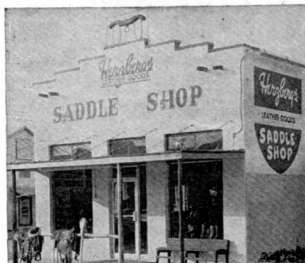

## Square of the Month for July:

# Rainbow Round My Shoulder

"Sam Mitchell once again comes up with a masterpiece in both the pattern of the dance and an excellent rendition on the called side of this record—Rainbow Round My Shoulder," comments Jay Fenimore of Hollywood.

In honor of Sam Mitchell's tour of Florida in July, Fenimore selected Rainbow Round My Shoulder as BOW & SWING's Square of the Month for July.

"The dance is Triple AAA in every respect," adds Fenimore. It is recorded on the Kalox label (#K-1033) with music by the Rhythm Outlaws.

Opener, Break and Ending:  
You walk around your corner See Saw round your own  
Join hands circle left around the ring you roam Allemande left your corner lady then weave around the ring  
In and out around you and meet her once again Do-Sa-Do and the gents Star left around  
Come on back and promenade go walking round the town  
Got a rainbow round my shoulder and a blue sky up above  
Swing and whirl that pretty little girl and tell her of your love

Heads (sides) go in and back do a right and left thru you know  
Turn on around two ladies chain straight across you go  
Let the side (head) two promenade three quarters round the square  
Head (side) two couples square thru three quarters round from there  
Allemande left the corner girl and walk on by your own  
Swing and whirl the right hand girl and promenade her home  
Got a rainbow round my shoulder and a blue sky up above  
Swing and whirl that pretty little girl and tell her of your love  
Sequence: Opener, Fig. Two for Heads, Break, Fig. Twice Sides, Ending.  
TAG: Bow to the partner corners all yes siree that's it that's it!

For BOW & SWING's workshop material for July, here are a few breaks using one of the standard basics of yesteryear—Shuffle the Deck. The dancers should find these interesting, and to say the least, different. Be careful, though, as callers might get run out of town!

Head ladies chain to the right  
New side ladies chain across  
Heads to the right—circle to a line  
Pass thru—Shuffle The Deck  
Centers In—Shuffle The Deck  
Centers In—Cast off 3/4  
Pass thru—Shuffle The Deck  
Centers In—Shuffle The Deck  
First couple left, next go right  
Star thru—allemande . . .

Sides right and left thru  
Side ladies chain to the right  
Heads pass thru—both turn right  
Lady around two, gent around one  
Make that line, go forward and back  
Pass thru—Shuffle The Deck  
Centers In—Wheel and deal  
Double pass thru  
Centers In—Shuffle The Deck  
First couple left—next go right  
Star thru—center two, square thru  
3/4 man—corners all, left allemande . . .

Heads star thru—pass thru  
Split the Sides—around one to a line  
Pass thru—Shuffle The Deck  
Centers In—ALL "U" turn back  
Shuffle The Deck  
Girls square thru—count 5 hands  
Corners all—left allemande . . .

Head ladies chain to the right  
Heads star thru—pass thru  
Split the Sides—around one to a line  
Pass thru—Shuffle The Deck  
Centers In—Shuffle The Deck  
Gents go left—ladies go right  
Star thru—Gents In  
Shuffle The Deck  
Ladies go left—gents go right

Star thru—center two—square thru  
3/4 man—threes corner, left allemande . . .

Here are a few more breaks using Spread the Wheel or Wheel and Spread, one in the same.

Head ladies chain  
Heads to the right, circle to a line  
Pass thru—Spread The Wheel  
Star thru—go Dixie Grand  
Rt, Lt, Rt, Left allemande . . .

or, variation of above

Head ladies chain  
Sides lead to the right, circle to a line  
Pass thru—Spread The Wheel  
Star thru—Double pass thru  
Cloverleaf—down the middle with a Dixie grand Rt, Lt, Rt, Left allemande . . .

Heads star thru—pass thru  
Split the Sides—around one to a line  
Pass thru—Spread The Wheel  
Star thru—Centers In—Cast off 3/4  
Pass thru—Spread The Wheel  
Bend the line  
Pass thru—Spread The Wheel  
Allemande left . . .

Head ladies chain 3/4 around  
Side gents turn 'em with an arm around  
Finish it off with a half sashay  
Forward six and back that way  
Pass thru—Spread The Wheel  
Forward and back  
Pass thru—Spread The Wheel  
Head gents star right  
All the way around  
Corners all, left allemande . . .
