

'The dance is Triple AAA in every respect," adds Fenimore. It is recorded on the Kalox label (#K-1033) with music by the Rhythm Outlaws.

Opener, Break and Ending: You walk around your corner See Saw round

Even Down & SWING'S workshop material

For Bow & SWING'S workshop material for July, here are a few breaks using one of the standard basics of yesteryear-Shuffle the Deck. The dancers should find these interesting, and to say the least, different. Be careful, though, as callers might get run out of town!
