Bow & Swing Advisory Group Named by FFSD

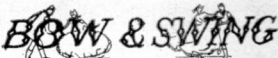

Convention Fun at Miami Starts June 18

Florida's annual extravaganza for square and round dancers takes place June 18-20 at Miami Beach with the 11th edition of the state square dance convention.

Promising something for everyone, the convention will test the talent and tax the endurance of both callers and dancers. More than 30 Florida callers will be on hand to direct the programmed dances and supervise the many after parties and skits for which the convention is noted.

The convention, hosted by the Southeast Florida Square & Round Dancers Association, with George & Martha Watters as chairman, is under auspices of the Florida Federation of Square Dancers.

The DiLido Hotel will serve as convention headquarters, with both the DiLido ballroom and the nearby 17th St. Auditorium booked for dancing programs. The stage at the 17th St. Auditorium—nearly 5500 sq. ft. of hardwood floor—is reserved for hot hash.

Early bird registrants for the convention can pick up their pre-registration badges at the DiLido Hotel on Thursday, June 18, or at the 17th St. Auditorium on Friday and Saturday, June 19-20. By early May, some 450 dancers had signed up for the convention.

The trail's end dance Thursday evening, June 18, will serve as a pre-convention warm-up event. This will be held in the DiLido Hotel ballroom with Les Linn and Lou Green in charge. Assignment MCs are Bill Palmatier and Jim Crowell. A buffet supper for Early-Bird registrants is programmed for 11 p.m. at the DiLido.

The convention officially gets underway at 9:00 a.m. Friday, June 19, with square dancing at 17th St. Auditorium. The Friday afternoon slate will see teenage square dancing at the DiLido, square dancing and new material workshop at 17th St. Auditorium, and a hot hash session on the 17th St. stage. Round dancing is programmed for the DiLido ballroom.

The Friday evening dance at 17th St. Auditorium begins with a grand march at 8 p.m., and will be capped by an after party at the DiLido Hotel.

On Saturday morning, June 20, teenage dancing resumes at the DiLido under direction of the Roundtree family. Square dancing and new material workshop is set for 17th St. Auditorium, with another hot hash session on the 17th St. stage. Round dancing is programmed at the DiLido ballroom. The Saturday afternoon program is basically identical to the morning program.

The big Saturday evening dance at 17th St. Auditorium will begin at 8 p.m. and continue to after 11 p.m. Skits and

an after party at DiLido Hotel ballroom are programmed for a 12:30 start.

Sunday morning is reserved for official meetings of the Florida Federation of Square Dancers, Florida Callers Association, and Round Dance Council of Florida.

Roundup of Events for June:

Jim Brower to Call Two Dances

The State Convention at Miami Beach June 18-20 is the main center of interest for Florida square dancers during June. Most area clubs and associations have cancelled their dances during the third week in June to allow travel to Miami Beach and attendance at the 11th state conclave.

But a number of area dances are slated during the first and last weeks of the month to stimulate dancing on the local front.

Florida's Panhandle rings with activity on June's first weekend. On Friday, June 5, the Capital Squares of Tallahassee plan their annual cotillion at Jefferson Street Center. Ray Castle of North Fort Myers is the programmed caller.

Fort Walton Beach dancers will sponsor the fifth annual Billy Bowlegs Square Dance Festival on Saturday, June 5, at the Community Center. Jim Brower from Texas will conduct a special workshop session in the afternoon and also call the big evening dance. Dancers will have the chance to earn their Miracle Stripper Badge and their Florida Fish-head Badge at the festival dance. Jimmy Campbell will m.c. the program.

On Sunday, June 7, Jim Brower is booked at North Miami Armory. The dance is scheduled from 2 to 5 p.m.

Traveling caller Harry Lackey is slated to call in Tampa on Friday, June 26, under auspices of the Tampa Dancers Association. On the same day at Wildwood, Bob Rust is programmed by the Happy Hoedowners.

Rounding out the month is the Fifth Tuesday dance, June 30, at North Blvd. Recreation Center, Tampa. Scheduled callers are Eric Sohn of Winter Haven and J. P. Jett of Tampa. The dance will be sponsored by the Toppers and the Merry Mixers.

The state convention at Miami Beach is the big news for June. But dancers are also looking toward July for other special events on the Gold Coast.

In conjunction with the City of Miami Beach, a 4th of July program and "adult square dance festival" will be held July 3 from 8 to 11 p.m. in the Miami Beach Municipal Auditorium, 1700 Washington Ave. This is the event that drew 3400 dancers a year ago.

The dance is under sponsorship of Miami Beach Federal Savings & Loan Association, with the Miami Beach Sundancers and the Ocean Waves as co-hosts. Seven well-known callers will participate, including Frank Bedell, Lester Linn, Gene Baylis, Vern Johnson, Jack Lasry, Ted Barton, and Sam Prescott.

There will be ample space for the dancers and several hundred seats for spectators. There will be no charge for admission.

The festival dance is being scheduled under the guidance of Jack Woody, superintendent of recreation for the City of Miami Beach. Bill Glick, special events director of the city, and Margaret Datch, public relations director of Miami Beach Federal Savings & Loan.

Open dances and training classes in Marathon sponsored by dancers from Big Pine Key has led to the formation of the **Marathon Squares**. . . The Marathoners recently received a visit from a group of Islamorada dancers and their trailrite caller, Bob Page, before his departure north. . . dances are held at

7:30 every Thursday evening at the Chamber of Commerce recreation building and patio with B. O. Lowery calling.

□ The **Nautical Wheelers** of Key West anticipate a state convention which will spur their continued training efforts to build state square dance activity.

□ **Lake Worth's Promenaders** held a beatnik ball May 14 with prizes awarded for the best costumes. . . caller-instructor Ernie Bass presented diplomas to 14 couples. . . more than 75 dancers attended the gala ball.

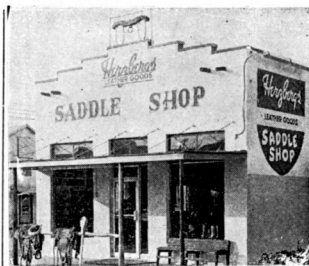

Floridians to Attend 13th National Dance

FLORIDA INTEREST in the 13th National Square Dance Convention will come to a peak during June as area dancers make final plans to caravan to Long Beach.

It is reported that a Miami group will travel to the convention by car or bus. Several Florida callers may also make the trip for the July 23-25 convention.

Trail dances to the National will be programmed in many states along the route to California. One trail dance reported to Bow & Swing is at Bakersfield, Calif., on July 21 under auspices of the United Square Dancers Association. Site is the Kerr County Fairgrounds, Building 4, and callers will be Rex Olds and Harris Stockard.

Bakersfield is located in Central California and is a three hour drive over the freeway to Long Beach. Motels are nearby with trailer and camper space located on the fairgrounds.

Other events are scheduled to follow the convention, and are offered as "icing" to the fun-packed National. Dancers may earn their Highwire Badge by dancing at the mountain station of the Palm Springs Aerial Tramway. The tramway climbs Mt. San Jacinto to a height of over eight thousand feet. It is billed as the world's largest and longest continuous tram. The free dance on the mountain top is slated for July 26, 3 to 5 p.m.

After parties planned during the convention are scheduled for fun and entertainment. Disneyland will hold a special after party on July 25. From 1:30 to 6:30 a.m., the huge playground of fantasy will be exclusively reserved for square dancers.

A National Parade of States is programmed, with nearly every state being represented by a float, a marching band, or a celebrity. Clubs in California are being invited to "adopt" other states and build floats in the state's honor.

Panels, parades, fashion shows and many more events await Florida square dancers at the 13th National. Reckoning Floridians with a "dance on our shore in '64" slogan, the National may well be the biggest and best in the dance series.
