Early - Bird Reservations Urged for June Convention at Miami Beach

RESERVATIONS for the 11th annual State Square Dance Convention are arriving at a rapid rate, according to a report from convention headquarters received by BOW & SWING just before press time. All dancers are urged to make early reservations to assure accommodations of their choice.

The annual conclave of Florida square and round dancers is planned for June 19-20 at DiLido Hotel, Miami Beach.

The convention committee, meeting at Chairman George Watters' home on Feb. 14, voted a change in the Friday, June 19, programming by eliminating dancing at 10th Street Auditorium.

The Friday schedule then reads: 10 a.m.-12 noon, square and rounds at DiLido Hotel Ballroom; 2-4 p.m., teenage dance at Room C, DiLido; 2-5 p.m., round dance and workshop at DiLido ballroom, and square dance, workshop and hot hash at 17th Street Auditorium; 8-11 p.m., general square dancing at 17th Street Auditorium. The dance at 17th Street Auditorium will be the only programmed dance on Friday evening.

A weiner roast and song-fest is slated for 11:15 p.m. on Thursday evening immediately after the Trail's End Dance. It will be held at pool side of the DiLido and will be for early bird registrants only.

Housing committeeman Sophie Gaby reported that she is waiting confirmation of accommodations at the Sagamore and National hotels. Chairman Watters requested that the housing committee obtain data on the price of a hotel suite plus 15 rooms adjoining the suite at the DiLido for the Dixie Twirlers Square Dance

Club of Miami.

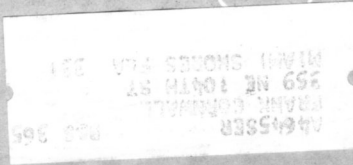
The appointment of Mike & Jane Ford to the First Aid Committee completes the assignment of all committee posts for the convention.

13th National Offers Something For All Dancers

THE "LUCKY 13TH" National Square Dance Convention beckons Florida dancers with the promise of something for everyone.

The convention, upcoming for July 23-25 at Long Beach, California, offers squares and rounds at all levels, a youth program, and tours of the many area attractions.

The spacious Long Beach Municipal Auditorium—150,000 sq. ft. of wood dance floor—will be the site for most convention activities. It is located within sound of the Pacific surf and will be cooled by ocean breezes. Professionally engineered sound systems in the hall are said to virtually bring the caller into each individual square. Ample parking will be provided near the auditorium. Shuttle buses will be scheduled to major housing areas.

The Long Beach Convention Bureau is cooperating with the 13th national committee to provide good hotel and motel rooms at regular summer rates. The new 600 room dormitory at Long Beach State College has been made available and will be used for housing teenage groups. Some hotels and motels are booked solid, and the housing committee urges early registration.

The round dance program will be a convention highlight. Particular emphasis is being placed on clinics and panels. Directors Eddie Palmquist and Charlie Tennent are contacting many of the most prominent leaders in the round dance field to participate. Early registrants include Nita & Manning Smith, nationally known round dance leaders.

Panel subjects on rounds will be of an educational, rather than controversial, nature, designed to stimulate the interest of both leaders and dancers. Workshops will be held in two halls simultaneously. Previews of each day's workshop material will be a special convention feature.

A tentative children's program for the convention includes day-long tours to Disneyland, Knotts Berry Farm and Ghost Town, Movieland Wax Museum, and Marineland and harbor cruise. Only children (8-16 years old) registered for the convention will be accepted in this program.

Square dance institutes are slated to start immediately after the 13th National, and it is expected that post-convention tours will be popular with vacationing dancers. The Harvey Binders are reported to be taking a square dance group to Hawaii.

Computer Hash Dished By Astro-Joe Curtis

THE ORLO VISTA Firehouse Squares and caller Joe Curtis recently met the challenge of modern technological society (with its social security numbers, zip code numbers, dial-by-number) by dancing to numbers.

"Astro-Joe" Curtis, as he is now called, delivered computer-hash to the antenna-bearing, number-wearing squares. Visiting dancers from the Sea Shell club of St. Petersburg and caller Ray Kennedy also participated.

The computer calls are normally given to a style of auctioneer's chant, repeating the same number until the call is completed. The following calls have been converted to numbers:

1, 2, 3, 4 are reserved for the corresponding couples in the square; 5, circle left; 6 circle right; 7, allemande left; 8, R & L grand; 9, promenade; 10, swing; 11, R & L thru; 12, pass thru; 13, cross trail; 14, wheel around; 15, star thru; 16, pull by; 17, box the gnat; 18, box the flea; 19, allemande thar; 20, eight chain thru; 21, dive thru; 22, shoot the star; 23, do-si-do; 24, swing thru.

Callers can use either patten or singing calls and can add to the number of calls, if needed. Those dancers with a poor memory for numbers can tape a list of calls to their wrist. To get in practice for a computer tip, repeat the numbers to yourself corresponding to the calls during a regular dance.

Dancers visiting the Orlo Vista Firehouse for this "countdown" can add a red star to the computer badge or bar. The bar and badge both have a yellow face, green oscilloscope in center, black lettering, and an optional colored border. Badges may be ordered from Ed Sincic, 1514 Roger Babson Rd., Orlando, Fla.
