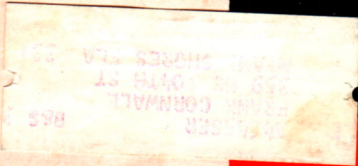

It's good to see the huge increase in younger dancers at these events.



## Great Dance Schedule Ready For November

POSSIBLY THE most active square dance month in Florida's history is in the offing for November as an outstanding series of dances, with a fine selection of traveling callers, is planned in all corners of the state.

Appropriately, the Florida Federation of Square Dancers and the Florida Callers Association will pace the month with their annual meeting. The Federation will meet at 10 a. m., Nov. 1 at the Holiday Inn, Sarasota. The FCA has its Fall Clinic and meeting set for Oct. 30-Nov. 1, also at Sarasota's Holiday Inn. Lee Helsel of Sacramento will call an open dance at the Sarasota Municipal Auditorium on Saturday evening, Oct. 31, under auspices of the FCA.

Taking a chronological look at the square dance calendar, here's what November has in store for you.

Lee Helsel is booked at Fort Lauderdale for an afternoon dance on Sunday, Nov. 1, sponsored by the Rhythm Squares and the Fort Lauderdale Recreation Department. Site is the Governor's Club Hotel.

November's first weekend is packed with activity. On Friday, Nov. 6, Vaughn Parrish of Colorado is programmed by the East Coast Dancers for the Cocoa Armory. Parrish will call the following day, Nov. 7, at Wildwood. This event will officially open Frontier Farms as Florida's square dance vacation spot.

Also in Central Florida on Nov. 7, Caller Jay Orr of Fontana Village Resort is slated at Ocala Municipal Auditorium by the Ocala Square Dance Club.

Northeast Florida dancers have reason for merriment on Nov. 7. The annual Northeast Association's Fall Roundup is set for an all day session at Jacksonville's City Exhibition Hall. Area callers will handle workshops in morning and afternoon, and

The first of three square dance weekends during November at Frontier Farms, Wildwood, is slated for Nov. 13-15. Dusty Randall of Texas and the Armstrongs of Port Richey will conduct the program. Successive weekends Nov. 20-22 and Nov. 25-29 are booked at the Wildwood resort with Ted Brownlee of Texas and Bob Rust of Daytona Beach at both weekends.

Jack Johnson of Columbus, Ohio, will call at Boone High School Gym on Saturday, Nov. 14. Sponsors for the evening dance are the Suzy Qs of Winter Haven and the Whirl & Twirl of Orlando.

Ed Merrick continues his Florida bookings with a Saturday, Nov. 21, dance at Eustis Armory. This is an open event sponsored by the Tri Squares.

Also on Nov. 21, the Orlando Western Square Dance Council will have its Fall Festival dance at Orlando City Auditorium with Frank Bedell calling.

The first annual Fall Festival at Miami Beach will be popular with Southeast Fla. dancers. This event is set for Nov. 20-22, with the Fontainebleau Hotel as headquarters. A complete program of workshops, parties, hot hash and gala dances is in the offing. Callers signed up for this dance by the sponsoring Southeast Association are Vern Smith of Detroit and Ruy Camp of Atlanta.

Ringling down the curtain for November is the Holiday for Rounds Saturday, Nov. 28, at Lakeland Civic Center. Florida Round Dance Council

members will conduct workshop sessions morning and afternoon. Joe Johnson will call at the evening dance.

## Frontier Farms Opens at Wildwood

FLORIDA'S FIRST permanent square dance camp located at Wildwood may soon rival the many North Carolina resorts that cater to the square dance crowd.

Known as Frontier Farms, the camp is operated by square dancers Helen & Jim Teagle and will be open from September through May.

The atmosphere is rustic at Frontier Farms. No plush glitter—just plenty of square dancing and outdoor sports. Accommodations are in concrete block duplex cottages with two couples sharing a bath.

33 couples can be housed at the resort, with a nearby motel handling an overflow crowd. The dance hall can dance 25 squares.

Square dance weekends—and possibly a week-long institute — are being programmed for the upcoming season. On tap for November are three weekend plans, including an extended Thanksgiving weekend. The first is set for Nov. 13-15 with Dusty Randall of Amarillo, Texas, and Don & Marie Armstrong of Port Richey in charge of squares and rounds. The Nov. 20-22 weekend and the long Nov. 25-29 Thanksgiving weekend will see Tex Brownlee of Odessa, Texas, and Bob Rust of Daytona Beach directing the dances.

# R/D Council Marks Fifth Year in '64

SINCE so many of our newer square dancers of the state have not been introduced to Round Dance activities, it is appropriate to explain the aims and purposes of the Round Dance Council and why it was formed.

In 1959, at a meeting of the board of directors of the Florida Knotheads, the idea of the round dance teachers and leaders forming their own organization was presented for discussion. Kay Mack, a member of the board, was asked to contact the various individuals interested in round dancing to attend a meeting with the Knothead Board of Directors at the third annual Florida Knothead Convention in the fall of 1959.

A letter was sent to the leaders in the state and was also printed in the September, 1959, issue of Bow & Swing inviting all those interested in rounds to attend the meeting.

The board of directors of the Florida Knotheads proposed to this group that a Round Dance Festival be held and the board would underwrite any deficit. A committee was formed to organize this festival with Jim Pearson, chairman; Kay Mack, co-chairman; Bob Waites, Gene Baylis, Earl Heindricks, Ruth Bartley, and Helen Galloway (treasurer of the Florida Knotheads).

The first Holiday for Rounds was held December 11-12, 1959, in Clearwater with 97 in attendance. The deficit of \$78.44 was paid by the Knotheads.

During this weekend, on December 13, 1959, the Round Dance Council was organized with Gene Baylis, president; Ed Mack, vice president; Jo Keller, secretary; and Helen Galloway, treasurer. A constitution, written by Gene Baylis, was accepted as presented by the 39 charter members of the Council.

The aims and purposes of this Council are:

1) To promote and correlate American Round Dance activities in association with, as well as in addition to, square dance activities in the state of Florida.

2) To act as a clearing-center for

the receipt and dissemination of current Round-Dance news, information, or any items of interest to Round Dance teachers and leaders.

3) To foster and promulgate a spirit of friendliness, co-operation and non-competitiveness among leaders and participants in Round Dance activities.

4) To encourage and provide motivation and sponsorship for both area and state-wide participation in Round-ups, Festivals and/or Conventions, both in connection with, and in addition to, other events of interest to dancers.

5) To publicize in every way possible, the above aims and purposes.

Later Holidays for Rounds were held in Lakeland, Sanford, Clearwater and Miami.

Except for the second one, these festivals have been self-supporting and have encouraged the growth of round dancing in the areas where they have been held.

During the five years it has been formed, the Round Dance Council members have been most active in their assistance to programs for state and area square dance conventions and festivals. Like the members of the Caller's Association, the Round Dance Council members have given of their time and talents to provide workshops and programs for the enjoyment of the dancers. The Council is asked to supply a round dance program chairman who in turn works with the chairman of the many state and area conventions and festivals

to correlate the dance program.

They have served with very little remuneration, either individually, or in sharing the profits of the conventions. Starting with the 1964 State Convention, the Caller's Association has offered to give the Round Dance Council a share of their one-half portion of the profits.

The Council has also tried to coordinate the Round Dancing of the whole state by selecting a Round of the Month. A coordinator is appointed by the president to serve in this capacity for one year. The separate members are asked to assist the coordinator in his selections by sending in suggestions and give their views of the several current dances. They are also then expected to teach the Round of the Month at the dances in their area and to promote them at festivals and conventions.

One of the future aims of the Council is to work more closely with the Caller's Association by providing teaching workshops whereby the callers may learn teaching technique for the more simple mixers and rounds to be used in their classes. The Council plans to sponsor a nationally-known round dance couple who would provide a weekend of teaching and learning workshops for the promotion of round dancing in the state.

A FUN DANCE that is well liked by square dancers around the country is Hooten-Too, Bow & SWING'S Round of the Month for November.

According to Round Dance Coordinator Harry Howe of Miami Beach, Hooten-Too is a dance that "gives dancers a chance to let themselves go." The dance is recorded on the Grenn label (No. 14063) by Hal & Dot Chambers of San Diego.

25-28 Back, Close, Cross, —; Cross, —; Cross (to LCP), —; Repeat action of Meas 17-20; 29-32 Side, Close, Side, Tch; Side, Close, Cross, —; Turn Two-Step; Turn Two-Step (O.P.); Repeat Meas 21-24, on Meas 32 end in "Open Pos" facing LOD inside hands joined ready to repeat the dance;

Do Entire Dance Three Times; On Meas 32 last Acknowledge on the Last Ct. of the Meas. M steps back twd COH and bows as W does "Modern" curtsy.

Round Dancer Magazine lists the top 10 rounds as follows: Green Door, High Life, Danke Shoen, Hooten Too, Cape Cod Waltz, Teasin Melody, Tango Adios, Lonesome Twostep, Dancing Shadows, Dancing on a Moonbeam.
