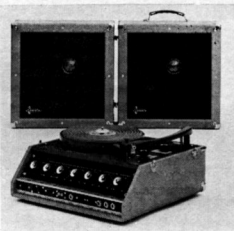

Position—CP, M's bk to COH
Footwork—Opposite throughout, directions for M (W does counterpart)

INTRODUCTION

Meas.

1-4 **Wait; Wait; Side, Close; Side, Draw; In CP**
M facing wall, step swd R, in RLOD, close L, to R; step side R, draw L, to R; end SCP, both facing LOD.

PART A

1-4 **Walk Two; Turn Two; Walk Two; Pivot Two;** Walk fwd LOD L, R; turning RF (W LF swing back hands down) and thru (M's L-W's R) to make one complete turn L, R; ending facing LOD in SCP; walk fwd LOD L, R; then do full couple pivot (CW) L, R; ending CP, M facing LOD.

5-8 **Fwd, Point; Back, Point; Two-Step; Two-Step;** M steps fwd L, point R toe fwd; step back R, point L toe back; start on second two-steps LOD; end both facing LOD in SCP.

9-16 **Repeat Action of Meas 1-8 ending CP, M facing wall;**

PART B

17-20 **Back Away Two-Step; Away Two-Step;** Roll, 2, 3, 4: M backs away twd COH in 2 two-steps (W twd wall); roll LF twd ptr L, R, L, R (W RF); to assume CP, M facing COH.

21-24 **Box Two-Step; Box Two-Step; Cross Two-Step; Face LOD Two-Step;** M steps swd L, close R to L, step fwd L; step swd R, close L to R, step back R, change sides, W crossing twd COH under M's L & W's R hands in one two-step; on second two-step ptrs turn to face joining both hands momentarily.

25-28 **Back Away Two-Step; Away Two-Step;** Roll, 2, 3, 4: M backs twd wall 2 two-steps (W twd COH); roll LF twd ptr L, R, L, R (W RF); to assume CP, M facing COH.

29-32 **Box Two-Step; Box Two-Step; Cross Two-Step; Face LOD Two-Step;** M steps swd L, close R to L, step fwd L, step swd R, close L to R, step back R, change sides, W crossing twd wall under M's L & W's R hands; on second two-Step ptrs turn to face LOD in SCP.

Dance goes thru two times then Ending; Sequence—A—B—A—B—Ending.

Ending: **Walk Two; Turn Two; Walk Two; Pivot Two;** Same as measures 1-4, ending in SCP, facing LOD.

Walk Two; Turn Two; Walk Two; Pivot Two; **Twirl; Acknowledge;** Same as Measures 1-4, twirl, 2, 3, face; Acknowledge; W does RF twd R, L, R, under joined hands (M's L & W's R) as M walks L, R, L in LOD, on ct 4 ptrs face, change hands and acknowledge.
