Message from the President:

## Cooperation is Key to Association Success

I HAVE BEEN asked by dancers and callers for more information pertaining to a federation of clubs. It makes me very happy to see that both dancers and callers feel the need for a wide awake organization. All I can tell them is that there is no simple or pat answer. It would take time and patience to work out the details, the needs and requirements of every area. You must first find dedicated dancers to act as leaders to spearhead the organization. You must then meet with the local callers associations to work out details that will be suitable for the area.

Be prepared to present the scope of your activities projects such as square dance publicity for area-wide dancers, promotion of classes, public relations among clubs, and other matters.

In other words, set up a code of ethics. Planning a subscription dance for Bow & Swing is a good way to start and make contacts. For an example of co-operation in some areas, set aside the 5th Saturday for Association or Federation sponsored events. This seems to work out well. The dancers and callers that keep busy with their own classes, clubs, and workshops are happy to look forward to these events, to socialize with friends and dancers that they only see at this type of dance. By using this formula the organization would not interfere with any club.

The federation of clubs officers would be elected from delegates sent by the clubs to represent them, not by members at large. The fantastic growth of square dancing in the State of Florida the past few years is a testimonial to organized square dancing. Anyone with a common interest knows the advantages of group participation. Be you a bird watcher, dog fancier, business professional man or a square dancer, if square dancing is your hobby don't hesitate to give a little of yourself to compensate for the hours of pleasure square dancing has given to you.

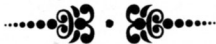

## Round of the Month:

# Kokonuts

AUGUST'S Round of the Month was presented once before and voted down. Presented the second time on request, it was selected. Frank Junkins tells Bow & Swing that Kokonuts is especially popular, with both round dance clubs and square dance round dancers. Written by June Berlin of Northridge, California, it's a Sets in Order Record 3150. The introduction starts in open facing position, dance starts in semi-closed position facing line of dance. Footwork is opposite and directions are for the man.

### INTRODUCTION

**Meas.**  
1-3 Waltz Apart, —, Point, —; Tog (to Semi), —, Tch. —; In Open-facing pos with M's back to COH and M's R and W's L hands joined wait one meas; Step apart M's L, hold 1 Ct, point R, twd partner; hold 1 ct, start together into closed pos on R ft, hold 1 ct, tch L ft to R, hold 1 ct, end facing LOD

### DANCE

**1-4 Step/Close, Step/Close, Step/Close, Step/Close, Cut, Back, Cut, Back; Step/Close, Step/Close, Cut, Back, Cut, Back.** In Semi closed Pos do two quick forward two steps in LOD stepping L, R,L and R,L,R; Cross L over R in cut step, step back on R; Repeat action of meas 1 and 2.

**5-8 (circle) Away, 2, 3, Brush; Tog, 2, 3, Tch; (to Butterfly) Side/Step, Step/—/Side/Step, Step, —; (Both) Roll 2, 3, 4 (to Half Open);** Releasing Semi-closed pos circle away (M L F, W R F) L, R, L, Brush R; together R, L, R, TOUCH L to butterfly pos, M's back COH; Quick two-step to side in LOD, L, R, L, Two-Step to side in RLOD on R, L, R, R; Both roll down LOD (M L F, W R F) in 4 steps L, R, L, R; to half open pos both facing LOD with W's L hand on M's R shoulder.

**9-12 Fwd, 2, 3, Brush; Fwd (Lady roll across) 2, 3, Tch; Fwd (Lady roll back) 2, 3, Tch; Fwd 2, 3, Tch (to butterfly);** Travel fwd in LOD R, L, R, L, Brush; M moves fwd in LOD R, L, R, tch, at same time leading W into a LF roll across LOD, crossing in front of M to left half open pos, stepping L, R, L, Tch; (W's hand should be on M's L shoulder, NOT around his waist) end both facing LOD, with man on outside of circle; As M steps fwd, L, R, L, Tch, W rolls back across LOD RP stepping R, L, R, to half open pos; Both move fwd in LOD R, L, R, tch, W L, R, L, J turning to face partner and wall in BUTTERFLY POS.

**13-16 Side, Behind, Side, —; Behind, Side, Front (Thru to Semi) —; (Fwd) Step/Close, Step/—/Step/Close, Step/—; Twist 2 (to SEMI) Walk, 2; In Butterfly pos step side L, XRB, Side, L, hold 1 Ct; XRB, side L, XRF, stepping thru to Semi-closed pos facing LOD, hold 1 ct; Do two quick two steps in LOD, L, R, L, R, L, R M walks fwd in LOD 4 steps L, R, L, R as W does 1 RF twirl in 2 Cts R, L to semi-closed Pos and walks fwd 2 steps R, L.**

### DANCE THRU THREE TIMES

**ENDING:—/Step/Close, Step/—/Step/Close, Step/—; Twist 2, 3, Acknowledge.**  
In Semi-closed pos repeat the quick fwd two steps of meas 1; M moves fwd, L, R, L to face partner and wall as W does 1 RF twirl R, L, R and acknowledge.

# Knotheads to Head for Clearwater And the Ninth Annual Konvention

**KNOTHEADS! KNOTHEADS! EVERYWHERE!** That's what people will see in Clearwater during Labor Day weekend, when the Ninth Annual Knothead Konvention swings into action.

How did this lively group of over 10,000 dancers come to be? In February, 1956, Bill and Ruthe Muench, Jim and Helen Galloway, with Ed and Kay Mack and Pat and "Mac" McClumphia made the one hundred-mile qualifying trip to Fort Myers and became the Charter Square and governing body of Florida Knotheads, Incorporated. Bill Muench became chairman, Helen Galloway was drafted as secretary, and Kay Mack's services as secretary were needed.

At the end of the first year there were 361 Florida Knotheads. Now, not quite ten years later, there are over 10,000!

Familiar to all Florida dancers, the Florida Knothead badge features two black plastic rectangles with stick-figure dancers. The badge is registered, and is exclusive with Florida Knotheads, Incorporated.

Our first newspaper, appropriately named *Knothead News*, made its debut in time for the first knothead konvention, which was set up for Labor Day weekend in Clearwater. The newspaper was discontinued one year later when *Bow & Swing* became our official voice. To this day, a six months subscription to *Bow & Swing* is issued to all new Florida Knotheads.

Clearwater has continued to be the site of the annual Florida Knothead Konvention. This year we will have double the dancing area of previous years, with the addition of the new wood-floor Jack Tar Ballroom. Our advertisement in the June *Bow & Swing* states that this new facility has room for seventy-five additional squares.

Harper Smith will be the featured caller for the konvention evening dances and afternoon workshop. Knothead caller members will donate their talents at the later afternoon workshop and after dance parties. The round dance workshops will feature the talents of Florida Knothead members of the Round Dance Council of Florida.

For the past four years a free Trail

Dance for Florida Knotheads has been a highlight of Florida Knothead activity. This dance is held on the eve of each annual konvention, but the actual Konvention activities begin with the Welcome First Call for Squares on Saturday with the featured caller. *Dancers who would like to be Florida Knotheads and who have the qualifying one hundred miles may become members at the Trail Dance only.* Applications for membership may be obtained from your local caller or by writing to James Galloway, Chairman, Box 711, Route 1, Lutz, Florida 33549.

During konventions, dancers who attend five successive konventions receive a bar showing five stick figures, compliments of Florida Knotheads. For the sixth consecutive year a number bar is issued which can be exchanged for the next consecutive number when the dancer qualifies.

Throughout the history of Florida Knotheads, members reaching pre-designated numbers have been honored at the annual Konvention. In past years Johnnie Owen of Winter Haven, number 2500, has been honored as Queen, and Ernest Spencer of Alachua, number 5,000, has been feted as King. During the upcoming Konvention, a member will reach the lucky number of 10,000 and will be the honored guest.

Florida Knotheads are even planning the Tenth Annual Konvention for 1966! Chairman Jim Galloway promises a gala affair, featuring two nationally known callers who will share the Konvention program. Watch for this announcement and more Florida Knothead news in future issues of *Bow & Swing*.
