HAVE YOU NOTICED one of the newer badges being worn around South Florida? It is a handsomely designed white on red, with a dancing couple in gold.

No city is their home, no hall is their own. A caller?—they have! His name?—he has many! One of the most common is, 'Hi Mitch.' In reality it is Ed Clark of Miami.

The Florida Nomads were the dream-child of 'Mr. Nomad,' Jim Kier of Hollywood. They came into being with a charter group from the Hollywood-Miami area. Since its inception, the membership has grown to other parts of the state.

The basic idea of the group is to travel as groups to different club dances. In order to be eligible to become a Nomad, a booklet of ten forms must first be secured from Jim Kier. These forms are then taken with you when you visit other clubs. The club caller or club president will sign one. The Florida Round Dance Spectacular on January 17 will be held in Sarasota's Municipal Auditorium

from 2 to 8:30 p.m.

Harold and Myrtle Eicher, John and Betty Gammer. Byron and Louella Markle, and William and Bertha Leonard will be M.C.'s for the Spectacular, which is designed to promote round dancing throughout the state, "This big event will help to make Florida unsurpassed in the round dancing field," Mr. Eicher told Bow & Swing. Square dance callers and their wives are ex-officio Spectacular members . . . specially invited guests . . . identify yourself at the door and "you're in."

This is expected to be the largest "exclusively round dance" event ever held east of the Mississippi, he said, adding that last January almost 200 attended. There is also available a balcony seating 350 at no charge: friends, relatives and kids are invited to come along.
