Editor, Bow & SWING:

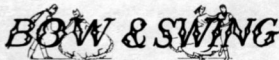
I recently made a trip to Daytona Beach where my car broke down, incurring a \$225 bill for repairs.

Programming is Under Way for Dancing Treats at Florida Square and Round Dance Convention in Tampa

PROGRAMMING FOR the 12th Annual Florida Square and Round Dance Convention to be held in Tampa, June 17-19, is being done by members of Florida Callers Association, Ed Newton, Joe Johnson, Mel Clark, Colin Walton and Sam Prescott.

The Curtis Hixon Hall will be resounding to the calls of many top callers and stomps of happy square dancers as all types of square dancing, rounds and workshops will be featured from morn 'til night during the convention.

There are plans for the program to include one tip followed by a round, a patter call and a singing call, then one round again. These will be broken down by fun level, intermediate and those preferring a real challenge may find it in the hot hash sessions featured by many of Florida's many top callers.

There are to be special areas set aside for each type dancing with more than one type going on at the same time in order to have no one left out.

Until programming is entirely complete it is not possible to tell exactly how many dance areas there will be, but the main hall at Curtis Hixon can be divided into two, three or four halls. The Gasparilla and Ybor Rooms are available, also, giving plenty of dancing space and seating capacity for spectators. The total floor area of the main hall is 61,250 square feet, plus 7,500 square feet in the Gasparilla Room, seating 1,045. The Ybor Room has 2,850 square feet with a seating capacity of 405.

This gives a total of 71,600 square feet of dancing room with seating space for 1,450 viewers.

"Registrations and reservations are

being received daily," says Matt Bryan, convention chairman. "The trend is we will have an excellent crowd attending the convention. Let me urge all dancers to register early and make hotel reservations now in order to be assured of getting the reservation of their choice. All callers and Round Dance Council members are requested to send applications for hotel reservations right away."

Posters with easels on the back are being furnished all clubs, callers and teachers. They are asked to display the posters at all dances between now and June to keep the date ever present before the dancers to remind them of the treat in store for them in Tampa.

With the help of all clubs and their members, the goal of "25 in '65 -2500 that is" can be accomplished.

Bow & SWING's Square of the Month for May is "Pass Me By," by Bob Van Antwerp, Long Beach California, and is recorded on MacGregor No. 1064A (with call) and MacGregor No. 1064-B (instrumental). It was chosen by Gordon Blaum, Miami, square dance coordinator.

Introduction: Middle Break: Closer: Join your hands and circle in a ring All the way around until your home again Allemande the corner girl, right hand around your own

Men star left, it's once around the ring you roam
Box the gnat, pull by, corner allemande
Come back one and Do-Sa-Do (promenade)
And tell the whole wide world, if you don't happen to like it
Deal me out but don't ever pass me by

Figure:
Four ladies chain across and couples one and three (two and four)
Square through go all the way, once around for me

Do-Sa-Do and rock it up and back
Just the men circulate, and once again you rock it Jack
Change hand, Allemande, grand ol' right and left

There's your Maid let's Prom-en-ade
And tell the whole wide world if you don't happen to like it
Deal me out but don't ever pass me by

SEQUENCE OF DANCE: Introduction: Figure twice for heads: Middle Break: Figure twice for sides: Closer:

CIRCULATE EXPLANATION: On command for men to circulate, they will walk forward one quarter around which will have them progressing to other end of line or stepping ahead to take the man's place on end of line just vacated by progressing man. Ladies remain in place.

SPINNING JENNY

Head ladies chain three quarters round
Side men turn them with an arm around
Forward six and back
Do-si-do go back to back
Make an ocean wave six in line
Spin the top your three in line

Rock forward and back, pass through
Wheel and deal, double pass through
First left, next right, cross trail

(Turn right hand half, those who can turn left three quarters ends promenade one quarter)
Your three in line, rock forward and back
Inside men you turn back, men dixie chain
First man go left, next right round one,
Spin four in line
Forward eight and back you sail
All four ladies cross trail, Left Allemande etc.

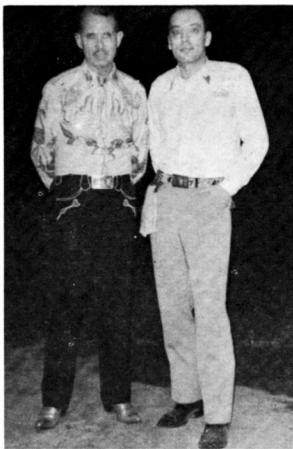

SUBSCRIPTION EDITORIAL

Have you been getting your copy of Bow & Swing regularly?

A change in procedure now means that you should get a written acknowledgement when you tell us about a change of address or send us a new or renewal subscription.

The acknowledgement will include a reproduction of your new address plate, and will travel as first class mail. If the address is not **completely correct, including ZIP number** you are asked to return the card with the proper information.

Because Bow & Swing's lists are maintained in numeric order (by ZIP code numbers) rather than the old geo-alpha system, it is not always easy to locate an old name. For this reason, it is possible that you will receive two copies, or that you will continue to receive invoices after you have renewed.

The cure for this is to send to Bow & Swing labels clipped from any recent issues you have received. These labels have the key information that will enable us to locate the address master, or the original journal entry.

And please include your old and new ZIP code numbers whenever you write Bow & Swing about your subscription!

POSITION: Open facing for Intro. Closed (M's Back to COH) for Dance.
FOOTWORK: Opposite. Directions for M except a snotted.

INTRODUCTION

Wait, Wait, Apart, —, Tch, —; Tog, —; (To CP) Tch, —; Wait 2 Meas then do standard 2 Meas Acknowledgment returning to closed pos. M's back to COH;

DANCE

Meas.

1-4 (Box) Side, Close, Fwd, —; Side Close, Back, —; Dip Back (COH), —; Recover, —; Side, Close, Cross Thru, —; In loose close, R, close L to R, fwd on R, hold 1 Ct; Dip (W fwd) twd COH on L, hold 1 ct., recover fwd on R, hold 1 ct.; Do a Side, close, Cross by stepping swd on L, close R to L, step thru on L (both XIF), hold 1 ct.
5-8 (Box) Side, Close, Fwd, —; Side, Close, Back, —; Dip Back, —; Recover, —; Side Close, Cross Thru, —; Starting on M's R and swd RLOD REPEAT the action of Meas 1

9-12 (Circle away) Two-Step; (Tog) Two-Step (to Butterfly); Vine Twirl, 2, 3, Tch; (Rev) Vine Twirl, 2, 3, Tch; turning LF and W RF move away from partner in small circle in 2 two-steps ending in momentary butterfly pos (both back COH); In loose close twd LOD W twirls RF under joined hands (lead) (R, L, R) as M grapevines twd LOD, Swd L, XIRB, Swd L, again take butterfly pos, and touch R. L, R, and adjust to CP while touching L. Do two RF turning Two-Steps twd LOD blending at last moment to Semi-closed Pos facing LOD;

13-16 Back Away, 2, 3, Points; (Snap Fingers) Tog, 2, 3, Tch (To CP); Turn Two-Step; Turn Two-Step; Back away from partner (M twd COH 3 steps L,R,L), Point R twd partner at the same time raising hands shoulder high and snap fingers; Move twd partner in 3 steps R,L,R, and adjust to CP while touching L. Do two RF turning Two-Steps twd LOD blending at last moment to Semi-closed Pos facing LOD;

17-20 Fwd, Close, Fwd Close; Walk, —, 2, —; Vine, 2, 3, 4; Walk, —, 2, —; (to CP) In semi-closed Pos, step twd LOD on L, Close R to L, again step fwd L, and again close R to L (a little body sway is fun here, if done in good taste); Walk fwd two slow steps blending to loose closed pos; Grapevine LOD in 4 steps (swd L, XIRB, swd L, XIRIF), blending to semi closed pos; Walk fwd 2 slow steps LOD blending at last moment to CP to repeat dance (M's back COH);

DANCE GOES THRU THREE TIMES

End-Complete the dance thru the third time (including the last 2 walking steps) then face partner and Step Swd LOD on L, Draw R Swd to L and Close; Step Apart on L and Act as Music Ends.

NOTE: After learning the dance you will enjoy it better by slightly increasing the speed of the record.
