

Editor, Bow & Swing:


I recently made a trip to Daytona Beach where my car broke down, incurring a \$225 bill for repairs.

Programming is Under Way for Dancing Treats at Florida Square and Round Dance Convention in Tampa

Programming for the 12th Annual Florida Square and Round Dance Convention to be held in Tampa, June 17-19, is being done by members of Florida Callers Association, Ed Newton, Joe Johnson, Mel Clark, Colin Walton and Sam Prescott.

The Curtis Hixon Hall will be resounding to the calls of many top callers and stomps of happy square dancers as all types of square dancing, rounds and workshops will be featured from morn 'til night during the convention.

There are plans for the program to include one tip followed by a round, a patter call and a singing call, then one round again. These will be broken down by fun level, intermediate and those preferring a real challenge may find it in the hot hash sessions featured by many of Florida's many top callers.

There are to be special areas set aside for each type dancing with more than one type going on at the same time in order to have no one left out.

Until programming is entirely complete it is not possible to tell exactly how many dance areas there will be, but the main hall at Curtis Hixon can be divided into two, three or four halls. The Gasparilla and Ybor Rooms are available, also, giving plenty of dancing space and seating capacity for spectators. The total floor area of the main hall is 61,250 square feet, plus 7,500 square feet in the Gasparilla Room, seating 1,045. The Ybor Room has 2,850 square feet with a seating capacity of 405.

This gives a total of 71,600 square feet of dancing room with seating space for 1.450 viewers.

"Registrations and reservations are

being received daily," says Matt Bryan, convention chairman. "The trend is we will have an excellent crowd attending the convention. Let me urge all dancers to register early and make hotel reservations now in order to be assured of getting the reservation of their choice. All callers and Round Dance Council members are requested to send applications for hotel reservations right away."

Posters with easels on the back are being furnished all clubs, callers and teachers. They are asked to display the posters at all dances between now and June to keep the date ever present before the dancers to remind them of the treat in store for them in Tampa.

With the help of all clubs and their members, the goal of "25 in '65 –2500 that is" can be accomplished.

Special Convention Invitation Extended

I WOULD LIKE to extend a special invitation to all square and round dancers to attend the 12th annual Florida Square Dance Convention at Tampa that opens with a Trails End dance Thursday, June 17, at 8:00 p.m. An extra special invitation to First-Timers be you dancer or caller. There will be lots of dancing for you and I don't mean that easy, kid stuff.

Matt Bryan, Florida Federation of Square Dancers; Ed Newton, Florida Callers Association; and Russ Round Dance Avrton, Florida Council, with their directors are busy putting the finishing touches on the programmed square and round dancing, workshops, clinics, after-parties and hosting. It is like working in a vacuum for these dancers and callers unless they hear from you. What they need is a word of encouragement and the best way to show it, is to send in your advance registrations.

Four air-conditioned halls with good acoustics for dancing to more than fifty of Florida's finest callers. The cream of the crop of round dance teachers are polishing up the routines they will teach. Square dance workshops will present what is new in experimental material and how to dance it from all four sides.
