

A second Northeast event of interest is the Grand Slammers' Thanksgiving dinner and dance with John Saunders November 24. This affair will feature a menu of ham, chicken and beef in a dinner that begins at 6:30, to be followed by dancing at 8:00.

Central Florida will see the Round Dance Council hold their annual meeting at Kissimmee November 14, with Cliff and Lorraine Hendricks as chairmen. Round table discussions, a Latin American workshop, and an evening dance will be the order of the program. Popular round dance leaders from all over the state will attend, including Joe and Nancy Johnson, Jim and Noriene Pearson, Arthur and Dorothea Brammeier, Russ and Mabel Ayrton, John and Betty Jones, Ed and Kay Mack, Fran and Verne Junkin and many others.

Square Dance Week Activities Net Publicity All Over the State

FROM JACKSONVILLE to Miami, Florida Square dancers put on their dancing shoes to promote their favorite hobby during Square Dance Week.

As soon as Governor Burns signed the proclamation which made the first week of October official Florida Square Dance Week callers, club Presidents and Association officers put on their thinking caps to come up with ways to tell people about square dancing.

In Miami caller Colin Walton and National Association Executive Committee member Harry Moore were guests on WIOD's Larry King show. Larry King interviewed both Colin and Harry, asking them question after question about square dancing. Colin called "King of the Road" for the audience, and Harry talked for several minutes about square dancing in general.

Jay Fenimore gave square dancing in the Southeast area a big boost by calling for a crowd of over 1,000 people at the City Bandshell. Area dancers put on an exhibition which was received by the enthusiastic onlookers.

Newspapers in Fort Lauderdale and Hollywood carried publicity items about square dancing in Southeast Florida.

The NEFSDA kicked off Square Dance Week with a bang on Monday. October 4 when approximately 450 square dancers from the surrounding area qualified for their Flattop Badges by dancing on the carrier Shangri-La as guests of the Navy at Mayport. Dancers from as far away as Eustis and south Georgia participated in the gala party. Acting on a suggestion from Mary Keiffer, Association President Wally Lightfoot, assisted by retired Navy Commander Bill Fleshman, contacted Navy authorities several weeks before the event and obtained permission for the party from the officers of the Shangri-La.

Several skits were put on by various clubs under the direction of Mary Kieffer; some of the participants were crew members of the carrier. Dancing was on the hangar deck with calling handled by Herschell Lee, Floyd Hazen, Bill Camp and Bob Reynolds. The Navy served lunch to the participants. All of the dancers as well as the large number of crew members who watched the dancing agreed that it was a very

enjoyable evening.

On October 7 a square from Fun and Frolics appeared on the WFGA TV's "Today in Jacksonville" show, with Jack Griffiths doing the calling. Bill Fleshman was interviewed by Ed McCullough and Warren Hull.

Square dance clubs in Lakeland celebrated Square Dance Week with a joint exhibition dance at the Searstown Shopping Center. Mel Clark, Howard Parrish, Bill Williams, and Phil Reed called for the group. Lakeland's lovely mayor Lois Searl proclaimed Square Dance Week in Lakeland and was awarded a certificate as an honorary square dancer.

Clubs participating in the exhibition were Buttons and Bows, Pals and Gals, Red Hot Trotters and Moosehead Squares. Club presidents

Fall Roundup Plans At the Popular

THE SITE was the Pythian Center in Jacksonville, the caller was Bill Camp and the date was November 13, 1954 when one of the oldest square dance festivals in Florida came into being. On the program that memorable year were such numbers as "Take a Little Peek", "Birdy in a Cage", "Arkansas Traveler" and "Smoke on the Water". How many dancers of today could go through these? Round dances included Black Hawk Waltz and Jessie Polka. There were 153 dancers in attendance at this first Fall Round-up. In subsequent years this quickly grew to over 250 dancers from South Georgia and North Florida.

In 1955 and 1956, the second and third Roundups were held in the Jewish center and featured callers from a large surrounding area. Both of these dances were under the leadership of Bill Camp who along with his taw Nora have done much to promote square dancing in the Northeast area.

In 1957, Bill Camp turned the Roundup over to the Northeast Florida Square Dancer's Association, which had just come into existence. This dance also featured area and visiting callers as programmed by Bart Bartley and M.C.'s Al Hixon and George Hoyt. The Northeast Florida Square Dancer's Association of the groups organized the dance and arranged for county-wide newspaper and radio publicity. Twelve squares of dancers showed a trafficstopping crowd that square dancing

Up Tallahassee way a city-wide Square Dance Week was proclaimed by the mayor, and the Dixie Federation Fall Dance climaxed the week's Bill Wilson, who hails from Aiken South Carolina and who has won fame at Jekvll Island, called for the event. The dance was held in the Florida State University Ballroom

Plans are even in the making for next vear's Square Dance Week. At a recent meeting of the West Coast Association, Walt Stoltz, Matt Bryan and Chuck Johnson recommended to the group that a coordinated effort be made to hold area festivals next fall to publicize square dancing in every part of the state. Tentative date was set for September, 1966.

Prompt a Look **Event's History**

has either by itself or in co-sponsorship with the Northeast Florida Caller's Association had the responsibility for the Roundup ever since.

In 1958, a departure from the traditional dance with area callers came as Jim Pearson called the dance in the Garden Center. However the three Roundups in 1959-61 were again handled by area and visiting

In 1962, the Roundup was moved to its current site in the Exhibition Hall in the City Auditorium. This dance featured Jack Jackson and attracted 45 squares, the record attendance to date. In 1963 and 1964 the callers were Louis Calhoun and Ed Merrick respectively.

With the exception of a couple of years, most Roundups have been held on the weekend of the Georgia-Florida football game as a tie-in to give square dancing football fans a chance to get together for a big dance after the game. However, this year, which will mark an even dozen consecutive vears for this festival, it was felt another date would be more satisfactory to give the area more flexibility in obtaining callers, etc. Therefore the date this year will be November 19-20.

The N.E.F.S.D.A. Fall Roundup had a long and successful run and this year promises to be the best yet. Dance to

The officers of the Council include a President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer and Board of Directors, the latter consisting of the former officers and the immediate Past President of the Council. Officers are elected for one year and take office at the annual Fall meeting. Elections are handled by a majority vote of those present and voting, with no mail ballot allowed. All officers, with the exception of the President, may succeed themselves in office.

Membership is the Council is available on three levels: Active Membership (limited to persons currently engaged in the instruction and leadership of round dancing); Honorary Membership (awarded to persons the Council wishes to honor for their contributions to the growth of round dancing - such persons not necessarily to be a round dance teacher or leader): Associate Membership (extended to persons not actively engaged in the instruction and leadership of rounds but whose qualifications and/or interest would assist in achieving the purposes of the Council). Only Active Members are eligible to hold office and vote. In order to maintain this membership, persons must attend at least one of the 4 yearly meetings of the Council. Annual dues for Active and Associate Members are \$2.50; no dues are assessed to Honorary

Of particular interest in the paragraph of the Council's constitution entitled: Ethics. It reads, "Members of this Council bind themselves to maintain high moral standards and to act in accord with the highest ethical practices of professional persons.'
