

How Can You Get New Members for Your Club?

Before we syncronize our watches and start the final count down for fall beginners classes let's be sure our plans are what they should be. They are not complete unless every caller, dancer, square dance store and publication knows where and when the classes are available. Let these people know that they are a part of the Promotion Committee, to fill these halls and classes.

Be enthusiastic-it's fun, it's good for the health, it's reasonable recreation. But also play it smart and remember we lose many prospective square dancers by telling them how many times a week we dance. Many who would like to take classes have difficulty in finding one night a week to do so. Wait until they become hooked, then suggest an extra night or two of dancing. Cross your fingers and tell them anyone can learn to dance by taking the series of lessons given by the local callers. Brush over lightly all the complicated, brain numbing, frustrating experimental material that some gabby square dancer may have told them about. Also the exhibition stuff seen on TV is not the run of the mill dancing we try to do. Mention that the basics will always see them thru.

Everyone wants to learn square dancing for fun, not to take on a lot of new problems. It's reasonable to this extent-all the girls need is a pair of low heel shoes and a full skirt, and the man a long sleeve shirt. Later they will notice all the finery the girls wear, and the western gear that the men wear. Most people are happy to take part, and deck themselves the same as the rest of the dancers. To you who think this is a sneaky way to attract new blood into the square dance movement, stop and think of your friends who are trying to marry off a daughter or son! This isn't so bad after all, is it?

By now most of you are slightly indignant and saying to yourself, I have better ideas than that to promote classes as well as square dancing. Well, OK, Buster, why are you keeping it a secret? Get your ideas out in the open so we can all get the benefit of them.

Many of the callers and dancers are extending them-
