

In an effort to maintain the high quality standards which have been set for Bow & Swing the federation's advisory committee has agreed that subscription rates will be increased to \$3.00 per year, effective with orders postmarked after December 31, 1966.

This will necessarily affect the wholesale subscription rates granted to affiliated associations.

In making the change the committee pointed out that advertising rates have twice been raised during the history of the publication and that advertisers are bearing their full burden in maintaining the magazine.

Bow & Swing

We just encountered the most super de luxe brand of rudeness in our two years of square dancing. We're just fresh down from the north and wanted to attend a good intermediate workshop. We had been invited to attend one last year, but after two sessions decided we weren't up to it with only a year's experience, even though we average two to three dances a week. This year we went again to the same group. It isn't listed in Bow & Swing, but they took our \$2 without question. As far as we know, it is not a "closed club."

We noticed that whatever square we joined always had to wave arms to fill up, unless we went to one composed of northern visitors or elderly couples. However, we were having such a good time learning "load the boat," "trail off," "pair, peel and bend," and "swing circulate" that we were prepared to make that weekly workshop a steady date until we went to join a square, beckoned in by one nice couple. After we were there, another woman came to our position and stood there, staring at us, until in embarrassment we left the square. Then her partner joined her and took our positions. If they'd even said, "Sorry, but we four couples like to dance together, would you mind leaving?" we wouldn't have felt so badly. We joined an elderly couple we'd been with before, but no one joined us. The caller noted single couples were needed in several squares, but when we or the other couple stepped their way, couples from the sidelines jumped in and filled the groups before we could get there. I know you'll think, seeing it was our first visit to the group this year . . . that we were so bad we were out of our element. Really this wasn't so. We even helped pull through some of the slower outsiders on several of the new calls.

At the end of the call, we left the hall. Needless to say, we shan't return. If we had enough nerve and forced ourselves on them for a couple of weeks till we were more familiar with the new calls, I think we could prove ourselves acceptable dancers, but who has the stamina to do that in an activity that is supposed to be for fun? A couple more unpleasant episodes

like that one and we'd be off square dancing, our favorite recreation, for life!

Please sign me "sadder but wiser" as I don't want to be identified by name or town. The caller was excellent and his wife pleasant when she helped fill out one square with us. We hope to enjoy them when he guest calls at our club, but that won't take the place of learning at his unfriendly workshop!

I don't think there's anything you can do about this. At least it gets it off my chest.—Sadder but Wiser.

I would like to thank you for your fine magazine and the assitance it has been to me while forming a square dance program at McCoy AFB (Orlando). I'm on temporary duty at Kadena Air Force Base, Okinawa . . . calling for the Oki-Docers of Naha, a real good group of dancers.

I brought sample copies of Bow & Swing with me and passed them out the other night. Everyone was impressed with them. Keep up the good work, will be back around the 1st of April '67.—Berlon Graham.





All NEFSDA officers were on hand to hear the report from chairman Bob Ross on final plans for the Fall Round-Up, held November 11 and 12 in Jacksonville.

State Convention Chairman Carl Law reported that arrangements for the 1967 State Convention were nearing completion. News from the West Coast:

Bryan Gives Seven Point Program

A SEVEN POINT program for the West Coast Square and Round Dancers' Association was outlined by WCSRDA President Matt Bryan at an October 30 meeting. The seven major objectives of the association, given by Bryan, are;

(1) Sponsoring beginner classes; assisting the clubs in forming new classes; assisting the clubs in getting drop-outs back into dancing.

(2) Fostering a spirit of goodwill and cooperation among the clubs, dancers, and callers.

(3) Making the WCSRDA the clearing house for all clubs, dancers, and callers, for the collection and dissemination of information and the settling of complaints.

(4) Securing the names of the clubs affiliated with the WCSRDA, names of officers, callers, dates and places they dance; maintaining this data in a current status to preclude conflict with club dates when scheduling WCSRDA functions.

(5) Getting new people interested in working in the WCSRDA and the state federation.

(6) Urging all dancers and clubs to take a more active interest in Bow & Swing, with the WCSRDA the focal point for all complaints, suggestions for improvement, etc., relative to the magazine.

(7) Encouraging dancers to par-


