Most publicized is the annual Florida Pirates' Fiesta set for Tampa's Curtis Hixon Center April 28 and 29. Callers John Saunders, Allen Tipton and round dance leaders Ed 'n' Kay Mack are featured. A second Pirates' event will be the dance at Orlando's Municipal Auditorium April 22, sponsored by the Orlando Recreation Department and area clubs.

I RECALL my instructor saying, in effect, "a good square dancer flows from one movement into the next," and someone added "gracefully." This came to mind recently while sitting one out. The scene was a veritable mass of gyrating humanity, which could hardly be described as flowing or graceful.

There appears to be a tendency toward faster and faster tempo, and though I am willing to concede to a probable slowing down process on my part due to advancing years, it was quite evident that even the "youngsters" were somewhat hard-pressed in keeping up. Granted that square dancing is excellent physical exercise. I prefer my "workouts" in more suitable surroundings and dress. It might be said, however, that is contradicted by the fact that teenagers, of the past several classes, no longer are in regular attendance. - JOHN SCHOEN, Avon Park.

I saw in Bow & Swing's "Where to Dance" that only one club invited "singles" to dance. That was in Miami.

As I am alone and love to square dance, I would like to know of any other clubs who invite singles. If not, why? There are so very many of us alone and we like to square dance, too!—RUTH WOOLEY, Lakeland.

I RECEIVED the February issue of Bow & Swing and note a couple of

errors which, I am sure, you would want to correct. First, in the Round Dance Council advertisement you have my P. O. Box incorrect . . . the correct number is P. O. Box 1015.

Second, on page 13, second paragraph, it is stated that Suzette was chosen by the Third Sunday Rounds. The ROM is picked by a panel of six couples "not at any particular place or time, but time and place mutually agreeable to the panel members."

Members of the panel consist of four couples representing the Round Dance Council and two couples, the men of which are callers and mem-

bers of the FCA.

There is no connection with the picking of the ROM and the Third Sunday Round Dance. Of the six couples on the panel choosing the ROM, only one couple lives in Sarasota. . .

I am mentioning this rather strongly as I feel that it is possibly bad public relations to give the impression that one single dance in a single area is responsible and are choosing the ROM. The ROM is chosen separately and distinctly separate from any programmed dance. I am sure that you want the facts correctly stated.—Byron M. Markle, Round Dance Coordinator, chairman.

(We apologize to Mr. Markle and the fine ROM selection committee. We know better; guess we were writin' when we should have been thinkin'.)

Southeast Florida News:

April 16 Dance Will Benefit Miami Children's Hospital

A BENEFIT DANCE for the Variety Children's Hospital in Miami is on tap for Sunday afternoon, April 16. The dance, co-sponsored by the Southeast Square and Round Dance Association and the Southeast Callers Association, will be held at Miami's Mahi Shrine Temple, 1500 Northeast North River Drive from 2:00 to 5:00 p.m.

Local callers are handling the program, which they hope will attract a capacity crowd of 150 squares to the new hall. Admission is \$1.00 per person with the entire proceeds going to the hospital. Association President Jim Kier urges all area dancers to attend, reporting that the Children's Hospital is in "bad need of funds."

RDC Drafts New Policies

New constitutional amendments providing for an associate membership and an evaluation procedure before full membership is attained, were adopted by members of the Round Dance Council of Florida at their spring meeting in Kissimmee's Recreation Center March 11 and 12.

The proposed constitutional changes were presented by Kay Mack of Clearwater, discussed in detail, and approved by the membership. Applicants for full membership must show proficiency in teaching and cueing round dances.

Bill Fleshman of Jacksonville outlined plans for rounds at the mid-June Florida Square Dance Convention, stating that he planned to use the Mayflower ballroom as well as a conference room in the Civic Auditorium for the convenience of dancers. He said the ballroom would be programmed from 10 to 12 in the morning and from 2 to 5 in the afternoon both days, with square dance rounds in the conference room from 10 until 11:30 and from 2 until 3:30.

"It will require fourteen couples each day to keep the round dance program moving during the convention," Fleshman said, in requesting volunteers.

Dorothea Brammeier, president of council, named By and Lu Markle to represent the council at the national square dance convention and stated they would teach the Florida Round of the Month.
