190 Registered at '67 **Holiday for Rounds**

ROUND DANCING in Florida proved it has reached maturity as registration of 190 dancers was announced for the 1967 Holiday for Rounds. "This is by far the largest ever," said retiring President Dorothea Brammeier, explaining that the figure included 62 members of the Round Dance Council of Florida plus 128 dancers

The program, she said, was "outstanding," and thanked Bill Leonard, Bill Bliss and Chuck Heiss for "a big job

well done."

Members agreed that the Lehigh Acres hall, the floor. and the Trans-a-mike helped set a new high for the festival and agreed to purchase the Trans-a-mike with profits from the two-day event.

By Markle stepped up from vice president to president, Bill Bliss of Fort Lauderdale became vice president, Helen Danklefs was elected secretary, and Lora Bookmiller of Orlando became treasurer.

Responding to a recommendation from the retiring president, Markle named Dorothea Brammeier and Kay Mack to serve as historians, urged souvenir program featuring the organization's first decade of existence be published

in connection with the 1970 convention.

Markle commended Bill Leonard on his programming for the 1967 Holiday and named Bill Bliss chairman for next year. Bliss is to coordinate round of the month selections and nominations should be sent from all parts of the state to him. Ted and Lois Mack were asked to make round dancer round-of-the month selections each month.

It was agreed that the Spring meeting would feature workshops on Basic Steps, Terminology, Cuing and Styling, and be oriented toward the round dance instructor with a view toward standardization of techniques, including the instruction of Latin rhythms.

The spring festival will be held in Lakeland March 16-

A treasurer's report indicated an audited balance of \$1085.91 on hand. A special application for lapsed members which would not require new sponsors was approved.

Colin Walton Succeeds Mel Clark As President of FCA for 1967-68

COLIN WALTON of Palm Beach Gardens stepped up to the presidency of the Florida Callers Association, succeeding Melville Clark of Lakeland, at the annual meeting of the body held in conjunction with the 1967 Florida Callers Clinic at Lehigh Acres, October 20 and 21.

Vern Johnson of Fort Lauderdale stepped up to vice president, Sam Allison of Venice became secretary. and Neal Blanchard of Fort Lauderdale succeeded himself as treasurer.

Directors of the association include Kent Bartlett of Panama City, Chuck Durant of Ormond Beach, Walt Knight of Jacksonville, Walt Wentworth of St. Petersburg, and Ed Clark of Miami. The retiring president serves ex officio on the new board.

As he handed the gavel over to his successor, Clark expressed his appreciation to the members for helping to continue the association's forward motion during the past year. "I hope that Bow & Swing will be able to carry on, and I am aware that our communications need to be better," he said.

Walton, who as vice president headed the association's education during the past year, said Bob Van Antwerp of Los Angeles was a "lucky choice" as mentor for the 1967 clinic overall success of which compensated for some rough spots in the committee's work for the year. He noted that Jerry Helt is slated for next year's clinic and later discussion indicated that Willard Orlich might be available for a spring clinic under area auspices.

The treasurer's report showed disbursements of \$612.04, an ending balance of \$1919.40, and a total of 174 paid members, 2 life members, 2 honorary members, and one subscriber (out of state) member.

A resolution presented by Dr. Al Hixon of Daytona Beach urging organized dancers at club and area association level cooperate in supporting the callers' clinics as a professional improvement tool of value to dancers as well as callers, was passed, and Hixon, as dancer liaison, was asked to present the idea to delegates of the Florida Federation of Square Dancers, meeting in an adjacent building.

He returned from the dancers' meeting stating that "I was not booed," and there were no objections made to the proposal.

Walton named L. H. Wiese of Orlando to succeed himself as association librarian, named Jack Lasry of Miami as square of the month coordinator, suggested that this monthly feature in Bow & SWING in the future might be something more than a reprint of a current singing call. "We hope that Jack will be able to enlist your cooperation in submitting your own current material for publication in Bow & SWING, and that an evaluation of current singing calls from the standpoint of dancer reaction may be included.'

FCA to Wage War on Two Fronts

Public relations and communications needs of the square dancing fraternity occupied the major part of the Florida Callers Association business meeting at Lehigh Acres and resulted in double-barreled action to wage the war on two fronts.

First of all, the membership approved a committee recommendation that an inexpensive directory in leaflet form be made available for distribution to out of state visitors through Florida's Welcome Stations throughout the state.

Jack Lasry of Miami told the members that if he did the layout ready for camera a Miami printer could produce 20,000 leaflets in black ink on white paper for \$150. Callers would volunteer to fold the leaflets and distribute them. He minimized critics' earlier charges that directories given to the state welcome stations were scooped up by children, and it was pointed out that in fact the leaflets are kept under the table and given out only upon request.

And secondly, the organization voted to endorse a program by which callers would provide free talent if dancer groups would provide free halls so that Bow & SWING subscription dances could be held annually throughout the state.

In a program developed after months of committee study, Bow & Swing agreed to provide promotional aids in a state-wide drive to push the publication's monthly circulation up to the 5000-mark.

"If we can deliver the market," Publisher Al Cody told the callers, "we will have a better chance to find the advertising support necessary to produce the kind of publication we all want.

"And your own advertising and publicity will be more effective if we can give Bow & Swing the circulation base it should have."

Cody said his business was no longer "publishing" or "printing." "I am in the business of communication, and this is a problem that concerns your organization as well as the dancers." He reviewed the history of Bow & Swing and pointed out that the original circulation base—that of association memberships throughout the state—has been lost. "Only the Central Florida Association includes Bow & Swing as a service to members in its dues structure." he said.

In answer to a question from the floor he said there was no objection to promoting Bow & Swing circulation in Southern Georgia and estimated that about 300 copies go each month to readers outside the state.

But first of all, Bow & Swing desires to fulfill the needs of its Florida readers

Clubs interested in holding a Bow & Swing subscription dance are invited to write to Bow & Swing, Kissimmee, Florida for sample contract form. "The original recommendation calls for the subscription dances to be concentrated during the month of February, so that a maximum number of out of state dancers may be exposed to it," Cody said, but agreed that these dances could be held at any time which suits the needs of local participants.

SEFSRDA Introduced Styling At Association Meeting in Oct.

SOUTHEAST FLORIDA Square and Round Dancers Association intro-duced "styling" to officers of local clubs at their October meeting at the Roundup in Hollywood.

Styling is smoothing out the rough edges of the dance by having the entire square doing the same thing. There is a lot of "skirt work" for the ladies. While styling is not too effective for your patter or hash tips. it can be a beautiful thing and can be carried out smoothly in singing calls.

Jay Fenimore and Gene Bayliss will take turns instructing future meetings. All local callers and square dancers were invited to the November Open House meeting, where styling was again met with much enthusiasm. At future monthly meetings these classes will be free to members of SEFSRDA, with a small fee for non-members.

Turn Out the Lights

JOHN SAUNDERS, square dance coordinator, has two reports to issue this month. First, the singing call for December is "Turn Out the Lights" on Longhorn by Red Warrick.

BREAK Left allemande, swing your own, promenade. (s::ics) Head wheel around-right and left thru, cross trail, allemande, weave the ring-do-si-do and promenade.

FIGURE
One and three (2 & 4) square thru, do-si-do, swing thru, men trade, star twirl, square thru %4, swing corner, left allemande, promenade.

Report number two from Saunders is that he and wife, Linda, would like all their square dancing friends to know they have a new little square dancer. Weighing in at 7 lb. 9 oz., Jeremy Shawn arrived October 30.

Saunders sends some material he wrote for a "Run Chain Thru". From an Ocean Wave or two-faced line, the designated person runs and new centers wing three quarters to form a wave in the middle, then centers of wave swing half, then swing on ends three quarters.

From two parallel ocean waves, a Run Chain Thru ends with two parllel two-faced lines. From two parallel two-faced lines, a Run Chain Thru puts you in two parallel ocean waves.

EXAMPLE 1
Four ladies chain, heads square thru four hands, do-si-do to an Ocean Wave, ends Run Chain Thru, bend the line, slide thru, square thru ¾, allemande.

EXAMPLE 2

Sides square thru four hands, do-si-do to an Ocean Wave, men Run Chain Thru, girls Run Chain Thru, all eight circulate, left allemande.
