Here's the Fun

I WILL answer "A Mediocre Dancer" who in your January issue asks, "Where's the fun?" and complains that the high level dancers in his club are rude and blames them for the club's failure to grow.

Unfortunately there are some high level dancers who are rude and they do spoil the fun for less competent dancers, do destroy the spirit of camaraderie that should exist within a club. On the other hand, most of the older, more sophisticated high level dancers are not guilty. They understand the problem and behave accordingly.

What is the proper behavior? It is to realize that what is "fun" for some is not fun for others. It is to be aware of the fact that square dancing at all levels can be fun, is fun if the dancer assumes the proper attitude.

Those dancers who are already high level and those with the ability and ambition to be high level must do their high level dancing in the company of their equals. They must organize their high level clubs and insist that only qualified dancers participate therein. This arrangement will give these very competent dancers the sort of satisfaction they desire.

This does not imply that high level dancers should confine themselves solely to the challenge level. Those who love to dance, the above-mentioned sophisticated ones, will continue to attend "fun level" and intermediate dances and, as I said above, having the proper attitude, they will enjoy themselves at these

lower levels while making themselves agreeable partners and helpful assistants to those dancers who aren't so good.

The shoe should fit on the other foot, too. Less competent dancers should stay with their own and not intrude upon the area where they cannot keep up and, therefore, spoil the fun. I have danced much in Florida area and I know (a glance at Bow & SWING tells you) that there are dances for all levels, plenty of them — LEONARD SOLOMON, Indianapolis, Indiana.

News from the Florida West Coast:

**Sunday Afternoon Dance and
 Supper Set for February 26**

FEBRUARY 26 has been set by the West Coast Square and Round Dance Association for a covered dish supper, dance and meeting at the North Boulevard Recreation Center in Tampa.

The Sunday afternoon dance and meeting will begin at 2:00 p.m., with the supper to follow at 5:00. Admission to the affair will be a covered dish. Callers Eric Sohn of Winter Haven and Bob Arnold of Tampa will share the mike.

WCSRDA President Matt Bryan urged all clubs in the association to have their representatives at the quarterly meeting: "We have many important items to discuss and we need the help of all interested dancers to make the year 1967 a most productive one."

Lakeland has been named as host city for the WCSRDA's next two fifth Friday dances. The March 31 dance will be called by Colin Walton of West Palm Beach. The June 30 dance will be called by Bob Rust. Both dances will be held at the Lakeland Civic Center.

□ Nationally famous Les Gotcher of LaPuente, California, will be the caller for the square dance sponsored by the Pinellas County Fair March 9 at the fairgrounds in Largo. . . Gotcher will

be assisted by Florida caller Fred Christopher of St. Petersburg. . . warm-up squares will begin at 7:00 p.m. with Christopher at the mike. . . at 7:30 p.m. round dance leaders Ed 'n Kay Mack of Clearwater will head up the early rounds. . . the evening dance featuring Gotcher and Christopher will begin at 9:00, with the farewell tip set for 11:00 . . . the hall at the fairgrounds is spacious, has wood floors and free parking space. . . dancers' entrance is gate 4, at the rear of the fairgrounds, opposite the parking lot. . . advance tickets are available from local callers.

□ Florida Pirates may make Tampa—widely known as the lair of famed Jose Gaspar—as their permanent headquarters if as present materialize. . . at least, the fifth annual Florida Pirates Ball will be held in Curtis Hixon auditorium on Friday and Saturday, April 28 and 29, and similar dates have been set aside by the Tampa Convention Bureau through 1970. . . Club History:

Silver Dollars Are Rich In Dance Fun

THE SILVER DOLLAR Club was begun April 29, 1965. A year later at the first anniversary celebration 117 members and friends were present.

The club's name comes from the popular song "Silver Dollar." Club caller Ed Clark has created square dance figures for the song, forming a basic but catchy theme for the club. The Silver Dollar tag is used by one club in California, but no other Florida club has the name, say club members.

The club's first badge was designed by Jim Kier of Hollywood, who now serves as president of the Southeast Association. The badge was rounded at the top, the size of a silver dollar, with a replica of the figure on a silver dollar engraved on it. Soon it was decided to use real silver dollars for the club badge. Club caller Ed Clark "just happened to have a huge collection," and 20 new badges were created. Later a guest at a club dance, Ollie Stone, donated a welcome roll of silver dollars.

An exciting step for any new club is designing a banner. The Silver Dollars' banner was designed by helpful Jim Kier, who is a commercial artist. The banner sports a deep blue background, a drawing of a silver dollar in the center, and the club's name written in silver. The banner was donated to the club by round dance leaders Bill and Betty Beattie.

A traveling banner was made by the dancers, who say they welcome "banner snatchers" any time.

Earl and Nora Coddington were the club's first presidents. Their job was difficult to fulfill—new club, new dancers, no precedents for guidelines. Following a shared idea of what a good club should be like, the presidents, other officers and members drew up a constitution. The constitution has been revised from time to time as the need warranted.

Bob and Bonnie DuBois, current club presidents, are among the 12 charter members now dancing with the 45-member club. The DuBois' are great advocates of visiting. Almost weekly Silver Dollars can be seen dancing with other groups. The girls wear blue skirts, white blouses,

Old Black Magic

Bow & SWING's Square of the Month for February is Old Black Magic. This standard favorite is called by Bill Peterson of Livonia, Michigan on Hi Hat label No. 339.

Square dance coordinator John Saunders of Daytona Beach explains why Old Black Magic was chosen: "This is an old favorite song of everyone, and the square dance will be a favorite of all the dancers. It moves well and will be easy for most callers. There are two key changes and this makes the dance more exciting."

OPENER: BREAK; CLOSER:

All Circle Left
Allemande Left Turn Partner by Right; Four Ladies Promenade; Box the Gnat-Right and Left Grand; Do-Sa-Do, Promenade;

FIGURE

(Twice Heads Active, Twice with Sides.) Heads (sides) Promenade half; Sides (heads) Star thru, Pass thru, Circle Four; Make a Line, Right and Left Thru, Pass Thru; Wheel and Deal, Centers Square thru three hands; Swing Corner, Left Allemande; Promenade; Help Me Sing This Song; That Old Black Magic Called Love.

□ Florida caller material this month comes from **Fred Christopher** of St. Petersburg . . . "Chris," a veteran caller, explains his Cross the Loop: "From lines of four, center couple forms an arch, the ends criss cross thru the arch and continue to complete making a figure eight to end up behind the arching couple, who in turn will execute a California Twirl to end facing opposite from starting position. All are in a Double Pass Thru set up upon completion." . . . examples of Chris' cross the loop follow:

EXAMPLE 1

Heads lead right, circle up four; Head men break, two lines of four; Go forward eight, back you scoot; Pass thru, 'U' turn back CROSS THE LOOP; Centers in, cast off 3/4's man; Corners all, left allemande, etc . . .

EXAMPLE 2

Heads crosstrail thru, separate, around 2; Hook on the ends, make lines you do; Forward eight, back you scoot; Pass thru, centers arch, CROSS THE LOOP; Centers pass thru, split two, line up 4; Dance up the middle, back once more; Pass thru, centers arch, CROSS THE LOOP; Double pass thru, don't just stand; Peel Off, left allemande, etc . . .

EXAMPLE 3

Heads square thru four hands you do; Then swing thru with the outside two; Girls run, cast back you scoot; Pass thru, centers arch, CROSS THE LOOP; Peel Off, up and back you scoot; Arch in the middle, CROSS THE LOOP; Centers out, bend the line, box the gnat; Square thru 3/4's back; Now wheel and deal, don't just stand; Substitute, centers trade, left allemande;

FFSD Meets

DELEGATES to the Florida Federation of Square Dancers discussed with officers of Florida Knotheads and representatives of the Florida Callers Association the financial problems of Bow & Swing and took additional steps to assure its continued publication.

Chairman Willie Stoltz heard from the federation treasurer that a transfer of funds from the federation's savings account would be necessary to cover losses incurred during 1966. Bow & Swing Committee Chairman Harold Jenkins reviewed steps which have been taken to bring the publication into a loss-free operation, and the Knothead delegation agreed to accept three-month subscriptions at .50 per couple.

Just how the Florida Callers' Association can assist in keeping Bow & Swing in operation will be the object of special committees.

Delegates were told that Jacksonville's Hotel Robert Meyer would probably be headquarters for the 1967 Florida Square Dance Convention, with the Mayflower Hotel Ballroom and the Jacksonville Civic Auditorium also being used.
