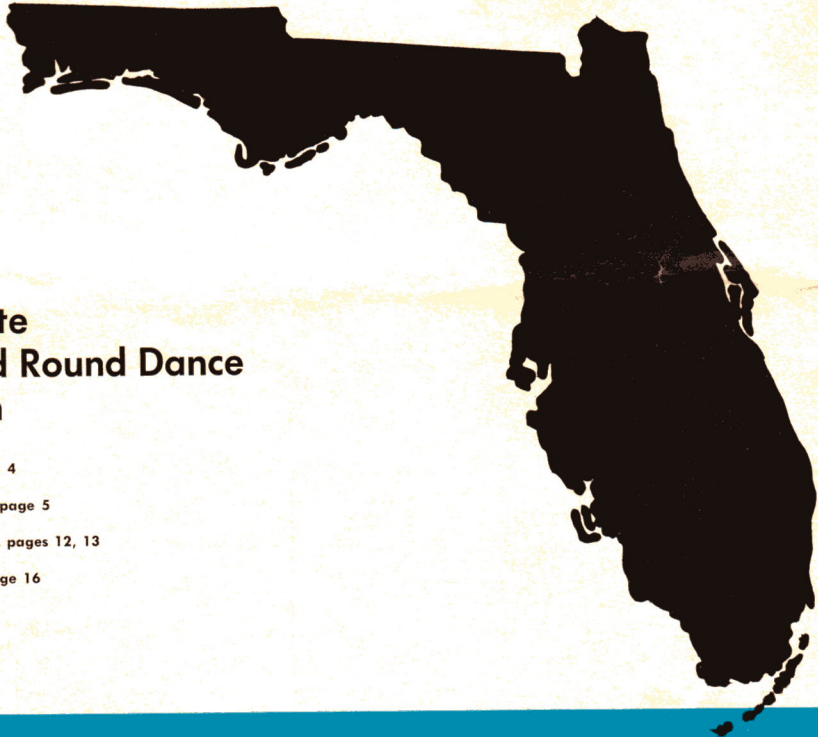

Convention Is Big News For the Month of June

NATURALLY Florida's 14th annual Square and Round Dance Convention set for Jacksonville June 15, 16 and 17 eclipses all other June events.

Beginning with the Trail's End Dance Thursday night, June 15 and ending with the after parties in the wee hours of Sunday morning, the weekend will be the biggest in Florida's square dancing year.

Florida's top callers and round dance leaders will be on hand to provide a program of dancing geared to suit nearly every taste and every ability. For details of this program see the preview story on page 4, and convention programs on pages 12, 13 and 16. A handy reservation and registration blank appears on page 5.

June will also see important dance business conducted. Following the Convention, officers and delegates to the Florida Federation of Square Dancers, the Florida Callers Association, and the Round Dance Council of Florida will meet Sunday morning.

A second big event of interest to many Florida square dancers is the National Convention at Philadelphia, June 29 through July 1. A preview of the National and a roundup of Florida's plans to participate will appear in the next issue of BOW AND SWING.

Other big events of the month include the 8th annual Billy Bowlegs dance at Fort Walton Beach June 3. This event, featuring caller Rod Blaylock, will begin with workshops in the morning, continue through an event dance and after parties.

The last of June will bring two anticipated events. The West Coast Association will carry its fifth Friday dance program to Lakeland June 30. Bob Rust will call for this one at the Lakeland Civic Center.

Also beginning June 30 is the three-day Shin-Dig at Miami's Everglades Hotel. Callers billed for the event are Chuck Raley, Beryl Main, Les Linn, Colin Walton. Rounds will be handled by local round dance leaders Harry Howe and Lee Rimes.

At the local level, many clubs will be beginning a "new year" with new slates of officers.

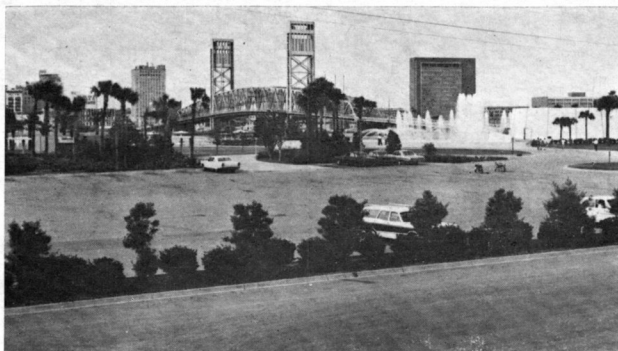

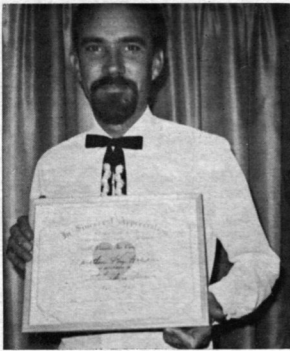
