Roundup of Events for March:

West Coast Captures The Dance Spotlight

FLORIDA'S WEST COAST is set to almost steal the show during March.

First among the big events is the square dance during the Pinellas County Fair at Largo featuring Les Gotcher of California and Florida's own Fred Christopher. Ed 'n' Kay Mack of Clearwater will handle the rounds.

Second is the West Coast Square and Round Dancers Association fifth Friday dance at the Lakeland Civic Center. Colin Walton of West Palm Beach will call.

The Ox Bow, St. Petersburg, will contribute to the excitement by billing Frannie Heintz March 9 and Max Forsyth March 19.

And all during the month, square dance leaders will be planning for the big Florida Pirates' Fiesta to be held at Curtis Hixon, Tampa, April 28 and 29. See the special section in the center of this issue.

Big news in March for Florida's round dance leaders is the Round Dance Council's spring meeting and workshop set for March 11 and 12 at Kissimmee. A complete program for this two-day event is printed on page 17.

Up in the Northeast section of Florida the Lake City Squares will sponsor Dave Taylor at the Lake City Armory March 23. In Jacksonville the Allemandarins and the Grand Slammers are getting together to sponsor Rod Blaylock March 31.

Also in the Northeast, the StarLite Shufflers are planning one of their Camp O'Leno weekends March 11 and 12.

The Swinging Squares of Gainesville will sponsor Bob Rust March 31.

In the Southeast a big event is Les Gotcher's Callers Clinic to be held at the Round-Up, Hollywood, March 9 and 10.

The Round-Up is also billing Frannie Heintz March 18 and Dave Taylor March 31.

Local clubs will be busy in March welcoming new graduates, getting new classes underway, and in many cases, starting intermediate level workshops.

Among clubs with special events planned for March are the Sandspurs of Auburndale, who will celebrate a tenth anniversary March 10.

**Florida
Plans for
The National**

*A report from National
Chairman Harry Moore of Miami*

THE BELLEVUE Stratford Hotel has been chosen Florida headquarters for the 16th National Square Dance Convention at Philadelphia June 29, 30 and July 1. One complete floor of the hotel has already been confirmed, with another 40 rooms to be assigned to early registrants. There will be free bus service every 15 minutes to the Civic Center where the dancing will be held.

Florida will host an "after party dance" at the Bellevue Stratford Hotel Friday night June 30. FCA President Mel Clark named Ted Barton of Miami to take charge of the dance and represent the Florida callers. FFSO President Walter Stoltz asked John Sullivan to represent the dancers and lend any aid the callers might need to host the dance. Any caller planning to attend the 16th National Square Dance Convention is asked to get in touch with Ted.

With over a thousand dancers wanting to get into the hall and dance, the space will not be adequate, but Barton's solution may be continuous dancing. When a square gets tired and leaves the floor, another is ready to take their place. With three hours of dancing, everyone should be ready for a late snack and some sleep before a repeat on Saturday.

The six committee chairmen who are responsible for programming the overall square and round dancing, are already busy with their master charts and assignment lists for eight halls that will be used at the 16th National Square Dance Convention. Five square dance halls, two round dance halls and one contra dance facility. With hundreds of assignments to be filled by callers attending the convention, they ask the Florida callers who plan to attend to please register now.

One square dance hall will be assigned to workshops and challenge dancing. Many of the country's top club and traveling callers will be programmed for this room. With five halls for square dancing, enough variety can be programmed to offer something for everyone, be you a first timer or an old timer. It will give you an opportunity to dance to the best callers of today as well as those who will be the stars of next year and the years after.

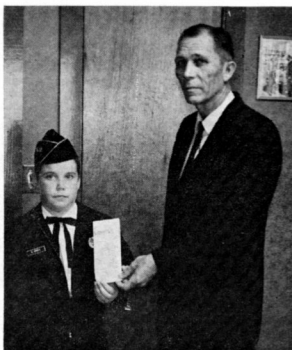

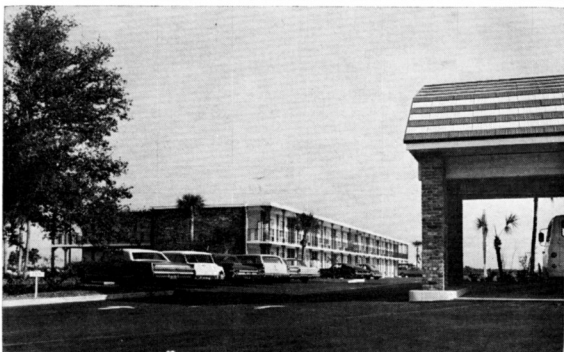

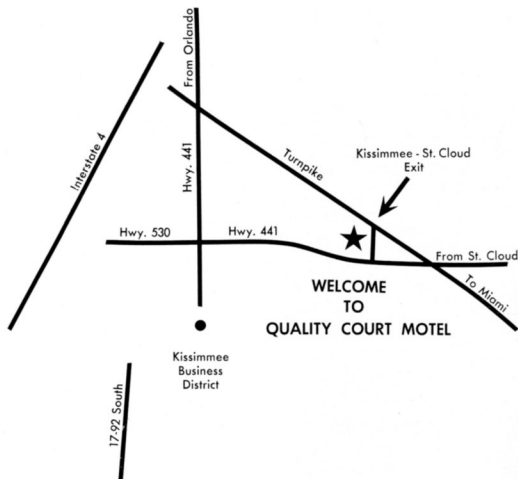

Bow & Swing's Square of the Month for March:

Texarkana Baby

Bow & Swing's Square of the Month for March is Texarkana Baby, by Marshall Flippo on Blue Star label 1973. Coordinator John Saunders of Daytona Beach calls this one "a real floor charger."

OPENER, BREAK, CLOSER:

Left Allemande the corner, Do-Si-Do your way; Men star left and turn it; Get Back home and D-si-do, Promenade; Take her home and swing her; She's my Texarkana Baby.

FIGURE:

Four ladies chain on over, turn by the left you all; One and three—Promenade half way round the hall; lead to the right and circle, you make a line; Forward eight and come on back, then box the gnat; Back out and circle with that lady; Left allemande new corner, Do-si-do your way; Step right up and Promenade go walking round the hall; Her daddy came from Texas, her Maw from Arkansas; She's my Texarkana Baby.

□ Florida caller material this month comes from Bob Arnold of Tampa and from Fred Christopher of St. Petersburg. . . following are two figures by Arnold. . .

ARKIE FIGURE

Two and four pass thru, separate around one to a line; Pass thru, wheel and deal. Double pass thru, Girl Calif. twist; Men duck under and Calif. twist behind the girls; Double pass thru, Girls separate and come back to the Center then Girls Star thru, Men go right, Pass thru thru, Girls go left, Men go right, Pass thru, Wheel and deal, Girls U-turn back, Do-si-do, To an Ocean Wave Double swing thru, Double Spin the Top, Right and left thru, (Girl turn girl, boy turn boy). Dive thru, Girls square thru 3/4 round, Allemande.

ARKIE QUICKIE

One and three pass thru, Separate go around 1 and make a line, Pass thru, Wheel and deal, Girls to 1/2 Sashay, Girls square thru 3/4 round, Allemande. . .

□ From Christopher comes these examples of Spin Turn Thru, a spin the top followed by a turn thru. . .

EXAMPLE 1

Heads SPIN TURN THRU in the middle you do; Circle up four with the outside two, make the line; Right and left thru across, don't just stand; Crosstrail thru, left allemande, etc. . .

EXAMPLE 2

Head two couples go right and left thru; Same ladies chain across from you; Turn that girl, do a SPIN TURN THRU in the middle of the deal; Corners all, left allemande, etc. . .

EXAMPLE 3

Side two couples go right and left thru; All four ladies chain across from you; Heads pass thru, turn back, star thru; Right and left thru the outside two; Dive thru, SPIN TURN THRU, let's see you smile; When you're thru, both turn right

single file; Girl around two, man around one, line up four; Go forward eight, back once more; Pass thru, Round Off, girls turn thru, left allemande, etc. . .

EXAMPLE 4

Heads SPIN TURN THRU like you did before; Split the sides and line up four; SPIN TURN THRU across the land, here's what you do; Centers pass thru, centers in, cast off 3/4's, line up you do; Go up to the middle and back with you; Pass thru, Round Off, centers square thru 3/4's, you've got it made; Turn partners by the left, roll promenade, etc. . .

□ Florida's Bob Rust will be at the mike in Brunswick, Georgia, March 3 for the Golden Isles Swingers. . . the dance will be held at the Holiday Inn Number 2.

□ Coordinator Saunders reports some new releases callers should watch . . . they include Winchester Cathedral, El Paso, Shoe Goes on the Other Foot, Even Tho', Walking on New Grass, and I Hear Little Rock Calling.

□ Caller Ed Gilmore, Yucaipa, California, has announced plans to tour the Southeast and Florida next December.

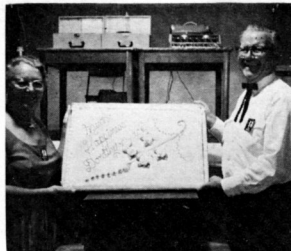
