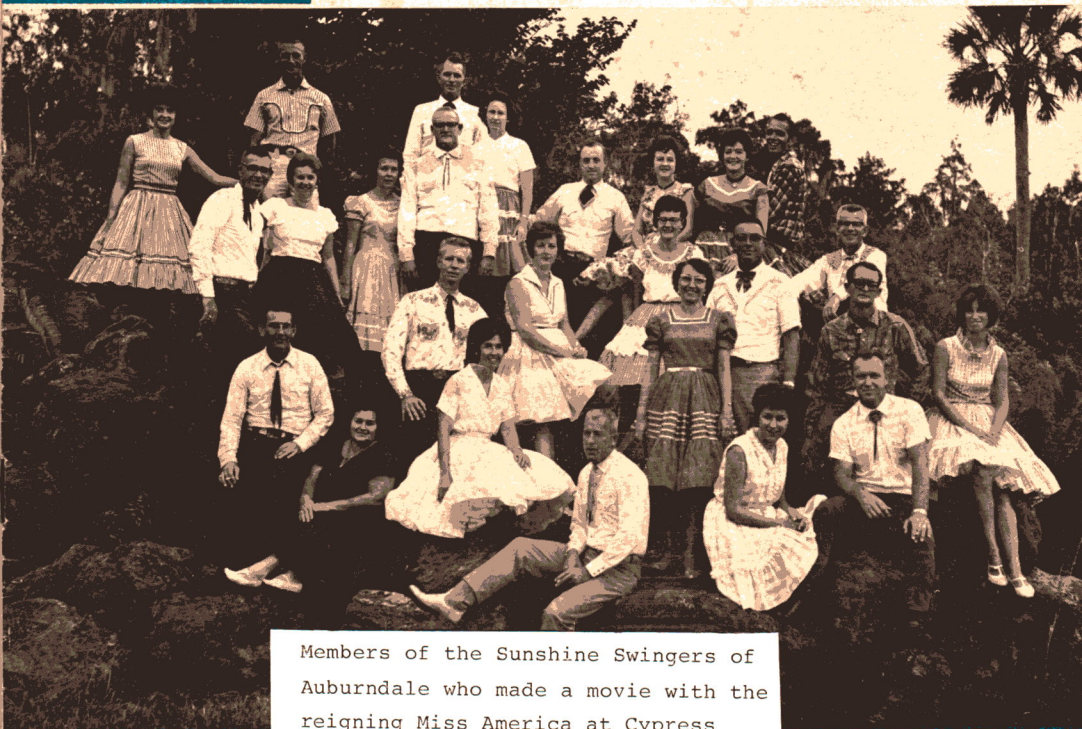

A Take-It-Easy Month

THE SQUARE DANCE calendar for May is a bit slower than the fast-paced April schedule. Perhaps Florida dancers will find a little extra time to pull the weeds out of those wonderful May flowers.

The most publicized event planned for the month will take place at Tallahassee. The fifth annual Cotillion May 13 will be sponsored by the Capital Squares and the Seminole Squares of FSU. The dance will be held at the Florida State University ballroom with John Saunders of Daytona Beach calling. Admission will be free.

Another publicized dance is the Lehigh Acres Weekend set for May 6 and 7. Joe Johnson and Colin Walton will team up for this two-day event at the Lehigh Acres Country Club.

In Titusville dance excitement will be centering on the Twirl-A-Ways Centennial, set for May 19. Dancers who wish will wear costumes popular 100 years ago. And many of the "paws" are growing beards!

At Daytona Beach the annual Swang and Sand Weekend has been set for the 20th and 21st. Danny Robinson calls this one at the Voyager Beach Motel.

Orlando dancers will be returning to the Barton Lake Farm Family Campground for a May 20 dance. Bill Shell will call.

Also at Orlando, the Whirl & Twirl will be sponsoring special dances. May 5 Bob Arnold will call, and May 27 Bob Rust will call. The May 27 dance is set for the Municipal Auditorium.

Rounds Plans Told

ROUNDS for the most avid Square dancers will be brought as close to them as possible. Rounds of the month for June and July will be taught both Friday and Saturday in the Conference Room of the Exhibition Hall. Rounds between square dance tips will all be Bow & SWING ROM's, or similar.

They will be taken from the following rounds: Oh Yeah, Velvet Glove, Hawaii Tattoo, Connecticut Waltz, Oh Boy, Mexicali Rose, Gay and Shiny, Can't Stop Lovin' You, Marie, Clarinet Capers, Suzette, Walkin' in the Rain.

San Juan, Desert Blues, Pearly Shells, I'm Gonna Build A Fence, Ginger, Champagne Time, Goldie's Waltz, Philadelphia Strut, Fraulein, Alabama Waltz, Jamaica Girl, Bye-Bye Blues.

Heartaches, Ballin' the Jack, Blue of the Night, ROM for June, Hot Lips, Oh You Kid, Java Glide, ROM for July, ROM for May.

Rounds in the Mayflower Hotel Ballroom will be of the intermediate type, and couples who have round danced a year or two should find something here for them. Members of round dance clubs should be able to keep up with even the most diffi-

cult rounds taught here. All dancers should note the scheduled "Die-Hard" rounds beginning at 11:00 p.m. If anyone present has the record, we shall play every requested round until every request has been satisfied.

"Early-bird" rounds in the Exhibition Hall will begin at 7:00 p.m. both Friday and Saturday nights. Half of the "early-bird" rounds will be programmed in order not to have slack time; the others may be requests. All programmed early-bird rounds will be ROM type or low intermediate.

A registration blank for the convention appeared in the April issue of Bow & SWING and will be repeated in coming issues.

Also featured in coming issues will be up-to-date reports on Convention planning and a complete Convention program when it is available.

Dancers planning to attend the Convention are reminded that a reduced fee of \$2.50 per person is available until June 1. After June 1 registrations will be \$3.00 per dancer.

A 'Good News' Letter

THIS IS A follow-up to the letter I wrote to you and which you published in August, in regard to those of us who cannot dance more than once or twice a month and have been away from square dancing for a few years. We were afraid to go back for fear we would know nothing and foul up every square we danced in.

Soon after this published letter, we received a notice from Mr. Rosenthal at Adelphi Hall announcing a square dance for "dropouts." Jay Fenimore called for this dance. We took a deep breath and gathered our nerves together and attended. Not too many people were there, but I think if more dropouts had attended, as we did, they would have been pleasantly surprised. Mr. Fenimore started out with easy to hear and fairly simple calls and we danced gaily all evening. By the time the dance ended we felt secure enough in what we remembered about square dancing to ask around about "easy" clubs where we could go to dance now that we had "come back."

We finally decided to see how we would do with the Smoothies club at the Ponderosa Hall in Miami.

I can't say enough good things about the "Smoothies." The dancers could tell we had just started dancing again after a few years away, and they were lovely to us. No matter what square we danced in, no one made us feel unwelcome. Some of the couples suggested that my husband and I split up and dance with other partners, and that worked out the best of all, for these experienced people could help us with figures we didn't know or didn't remember, or just plain pull us through.

We have danced with the Smoothies about four times now, and even though we can only attend a dance once or twice a month, we are not nervous at all with them because they are not critical of us.

Why, do you know, sometimes we can get through a whole set without breaking down? Quite a thrill for us who several months ago were afraid to come back to square dancing!

I hope there are more clubs like the Smoothies in Florida; and don't you think it would be a good idea to encourage people to write in and tell us all if their club is helpful to newcomers and dropouts.—MRS. BARBARA YACOS, Miami Shores.

Bow & Swing's Square of the Month for May:

A Double Feature

THAT'S RIGHT. This month's SQOM column is a "double feature." First is Coney Island Washboard Gal, recorded on the Grenn label by Earl Johnson. Here's the dance.

INTRO: BREAK: ENDING
All four ladies chain across the rings; you turn and chain them right back home again; walk all around the corner, see saw your own; Men star by the right and travel once around tonight; Turn your partner left and then your corner do-sa-do; You run home and swing and promenade; She washed a hole right through the knees of a brand new pair of BVD's My Coney Island Washboard Gal.

FIGURE
Heads right and left thru, sides do the same; The heads square thru 4 hands inside the ring; Get to the corner do sa do, all the way round you go; Make a wave and balance up and back, all eight circulate; Star thru, swing a little girl around and promenade; You promenade her high and wide, won't she make a lovely bride; That Coney Island Washboard Gal.

The second square was chosen by coordinator John Saunders' Outlaws workshop group in Daytona Beach which meets first Sundays. Wish You Were Here recorded on a Kalox label by Singin' Sam Mitchell was voted the favorite.

INTRO: BREAK: ENDING
Join your hands and circle to the left with all your might; Allemande the corner thru partner right; Men star left in middle go once around; Partner box the gnat and do a wrong way grand; Head on hand, meet your maid; swing and promenade; When you're dancing with those other guys I miss you so; Wish you were here, wish you were here.

FIGURE
Head (sides) 2 couples, promenade 1/2 round; sides (heads) star thru, pass thru, circle 4; Sides (heads) men break make a line, move up and back; Pass thru, wheel and lead substitute; Then square thru 1/2 to the corner lady swing; swing around and around and Promenade.

Position is open facing with man's back to the center of the hall for introduction, butterfly for dance. Footwork is opposite, and directions are for the man except as noted.

INTRO

Meas
1-4 Wait; Wait; Apart, -, Point, -; Together (to Bfly), -, Touch, -; In Open-Facing pos M's R & W's L hands joined, (M facing wall) do a standard 4 meas into as follows: Wait 2 meas; Step bwd twd COH on L (W bwd twd wall), hold 1 ct, point R twd partner, hold 1 ct; Step fwd on R twd partner assuming Butterfly pos (M's back to COH), hold 1 ct, touch L to R, hold 1 ct;

PART A

1-4 Side, -, Behind, -; Step, Close, Turn (back-to-back), -; Side, -, Behind, -; Step, Close, Turn (to SCP), -; Butterfly pos (M facing wall) step swd LOD on L (slow), -, cross R in back of L (W XIB) (slow), -; In two-step rhythm step swd LOD on R, close R to L, releasing lead hands and bringing M's R & W's L joined hands thru step L turning 1/2 L-face (W R fc) to a modified back-to-back pos, hold 1 ct; Step swd LOD on R (slow), -, cross L in back of R (W XIB) (slow), -; In two-step rhythm step swd LOD on R, close L to R, step R slightly fwd LOD and blend to Semi-Closed pos facing LOD, hold 1 ct;

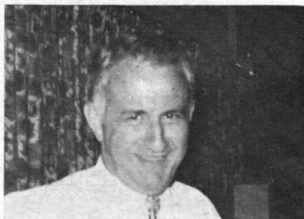
