Lane Heads Federation; Miami's Convention Plans are Reviewed

Paul Lane of Jacksonville became chairman of Florida Federation of Square Dancers, succeeding Walter Stoltz of Bartow, at the annual meeting of the organization at Lehigh Acres, on October 22.

Other officers elected include Al Martin of Orlando, vice president, Mori Sogolow of Tampa, secretary, and George Oglesby of Miami,

treasurer

A new slate of delegates from affiliated area organizations comprised the governing body of the federation for the association year ending next October.

Three delegates are nominated by each affiliated association, and one delegate from that area is named by the federation. Other delegates seated, by associations, include the following:

West Coast-Warren Hyland, St. Petersburg, Chuck Johnson, Bartow, Matt Bryan, Tampa, Sogolow and

Southeast Florida-Jack Lascola. Norman Barron, Dick Baker, and Oglesby.

Northeast Florida — Bob Ross, Chet Vetter, Ken Seefried, and Lane.

Central Florida-Wayne Wallace, Daytona Beach, John Donelly, Palm Bay, and Martin.

Also serving on the board of delegates are the following past chairman who were formally seated: Virgil Green of Jacksonville, Harry Moore of Miami Beach, Carl Heath of Winter Haven, Frank Cornwall of Miami, Harold Jenkins of DeBary, Hink Smith of St. Petersburg and Al Cody of Kissimmee.

Jim Kier of Miami reported progress on plans for the 1968 convention in Miami Beach, showed bumper strips and leaflets, and asked for co-chairmen in each area who would handle distribution of the advertising and receive advance registrations.

The federation agreed to make available \$300 for advance expenses for the convention.

Bryan reported on a bid from St. Petersburg for the 1969 convention; it was not accepted, he said, since plans for a Tampa site had already been confirmed.

Termination of the federation's contract for Bow & Swing was reported by Secretary Paul Lane.

Dr. Al Hixon of Daytona Beach, serving as liaison from the Florida Callers' Association, urged the federation to consider supporting the Florida Callers' Clinic as a means of providing professional improvement for callers throughout the state.

"Most people accept the professional clinic as a necessary device to maintain a high level of proficiency," Hixon said. "And I think most dancers will want their callers to take advantage of the excellent instruction that can be obtained at these callers' clinics."

Dancers could help in two ways:

1. They could give up their weekly dance if necessary so that their caller could attend (and possibly allow his regular fee toward expenses), and

2. Area dances with out of state callers could be planned to coincide with the third weekend in October each year, annual dates of the clinic.

Green presented the report for the nominating committee, which included Cody and Cornwall, and Warren Hyland moved its acceptance and unanimous approval.

The report of Treasurer Al Martin showed an October 16 balance of \$588.26, total expenditures for the year of \$2863.92, including \$1590.68 for supporting Bow & Swing for the first half of 1967.
