
Miami Contracts Signed for '68 FFSD Convention

In making his report Jim Kier said six cooperating hotels in the Lincoln Road area will provide 750 rooms at \$8 and \$10; the Miami Beach auditorium will be used for the main sessions.



Report on State Convention Presented by Carl Law

FLORIDA'S 14th annual square dance convention netted \$1468.89, according to a financial report presented by Chairman Carl Law to the board of delegates of the Florida Federation of Square Dancers.

The federation immediately distributed the money between the Northeast Florida Square and Round Dancers Association, and the Florida Callers Association. Round Dance Council of Florida will also share in the proceeds of the mid-June event.

Registration fees provided the bulk of the income, \$2818.75 with booth rentals accounting for \$124.00. Total income of \$2942.75 was offset by expenditures of \$1473.86.
