

In making his report Jim Kier said six cooperating hotels in the Lincoln Road area will provide 750 rooms at \$8 and \$10; the Miami Beach auditorium will be used for the main sessions.

Dates for the Miami convention are June 14-16, Matt Bryan said the auditorium in Tampa has been reserved for the 1969 convention for June 13 and 14, and Bob Brown presented a bid for the 1970 convention in Orlando for June 11-13.

President Walter Stoltz said the federation had turned Bow & SWING over to Cody Publications and would have no further financial responsibility for it, although the publication would continue to serve as the official organ of square and round dance.

Registration fees provided the bulk of the income, \$2818.75 with booth rentals accounting for \$124.00. Total income of \$2942.75 was offset by expenditures of \$1473.86.

Biggest single expense item was for the Jacksonville auditorium, \$568.75; next came \$306.51 for printing and \$200.00 for sound service. Cost of advertising in Bow & Swing, \$21.80, was a part of a total of \$72.88 used for promotional costs, including postage and duplicating.

Total attendance for the convention was 1435, Law said.

## Cross the Brazos

THE SINGING CALL for this month is "Cross the Brazos," Kalox No. K-1071 and called by C. O. Guest, reports John Saunders, coordinator.

Other good singing calls out, he reports, are "On the Other Hand," (Windsor—Bill Ball); "Chocolate Coated Words" (Windsor—Chuck Raley); and "Robinson Crusoe" (Wagon Wheel—Beryl Main).

### FIGURE

Heads (sides) promenade half, right and left thru, square thru 4 hands. Star right with outside pair. Heads (sides) Star left in center same two right and left thru, swing thru, boy run, wheel and deal, dive thru, square thru three quarters, Allemande, Bocey partner, corner swing and promenade.

### MIDDLE BREAK

4 ladies chain, roll away, circle left; 4 ladies roll away, do-sa-do next one. Man star left one time around. Star promenade, 4 ladies backtrace twice, do-sa-do, bow and weave the ring, swing and promenade.

Florida caller material for October centers on "Tandem Chains" and comes from Bob Keefe of Jacksonville.

### TANDEM STYLE 1

The Tandem Chain may start with any ladies meeting with right hand; for simplicity of explanation, we will use the partner:

Meeting partner with right hand, go forward 3, by left to opposite man, turn half by right, men star left to opposite girl with right, full around, right, left, right, turn half by right, girls star forward two, left, right, when meeting with right, Tandem Chain is finished. The important styling point in this movement is that when you are turned and left standing, you must maintain turn ending position. Do not turn and face back into center.

### TANDEM STYLE 2

Left allemande, forward 3 in a Tandem Chain, go right left right, turn half, girls star left to opposite gent, turn half, men star left to opposite lady by right, full around forward two, left and right, box the gnat, pull by, don't just stand, left allemande, come right in a right and left grand.

### TANDEM STYLE 3

Left allemande, forward 3 in a Tandem Chain (appropriate fill in patten ending with forward 2) Go left and right, curlique to alamo style, swing thru, left allemande.

### TANDEM STYLE 4

Four ladies chain  $\frac{3}{4}$ , heads lead right circle up 4, heads break, line of 4 left allemande a Tandem Chain (fill in patten ending right hand), spin the top, same lady with right, spin the top, same lady box the gnat, change hands, left allemande.

### TANDEM STYLE 5

Left allemande, then a Tandem Chain (fill in patten ending on right) curlique to a alamo style, spin the top, walk straight ahead go right and left grand.

### TANDEM STYLE 6

Four ladies chain  $\frac{3}{4}$ , heads lead right circle up 4, heads break, line of 4 left allemande a Tandem chain (fill in patten ending right hand), spin the top, same lady with right, spin the top, same lady box the gnat, change hands, left allemande.

### TANDEM STYLE 7

Left allemande, then a Tandem Chain (fill in patten ending on right) curlique to a alamo style, spin the top, walk straight ahead go right and left grand.

1-4 **Waltz** Wait; **Apert, Point, -;** Together, **Touch, -** (to Open-facing);  
1-2 **Wait** 2 measures in open-facing pos M's R & W's L hands joined;  
3 **Step** apart on L, point R twd prt, hold 1 ct;  
4 **Step** diag twd prt & RLOD on R, tch L R, hold 1 ct ending in open-facing pos M's bk to COH;

### DANCE

- 1-4 **Waltz Away; Waltz Together** (to Bfly); **Waltz Bal (L); Waltz Bal (R)**;  
1 **Starting** M's L swing joined hands fwd & waltz down LOD turning slightly away from prt;  
2 **Swing** joined hands fwd waltz fwd turning twd prt to Bfly-Pos;

29-32 In Closed-Pos do 4 measures of ½ RF turning waltzes to end in Open-Facing-Pos M's bk to COH;  
**Dance Goes Thru Two Times**  
ENDING: End Measure 32 last time thru in CP M's bk to COH, twirl & Acknowledge.




